FLOOD PREPAREDNESS PROGRAM TO ASSIST SASKATCHEWAN COMMUNITIES

On April 2, as Minister responsible for the Saskatchewan Water Security Agency (WSA) I was able to confirm that the Government of Saskatchewan will continue to assist residents faced with threats of flooding with the 2013 Emergency Flood Damage Reduction Program (EFDRP).

The program provides engineering and technical assistance to municipalities while sharing the cost of permanent and temporary flood prevention works.

“As Saskatchewan readies for a significant spring run-off, our government is committed to supporting its citizens and communities faced with potential flooding. Since 2011, the Government of Saskatchewan has provided \$25 million to assist in the construction of 580 permanent works across the province. Investing in community-driven mitigation efforts creates protection from flooding not only this spring but in years to come.”

PROVINCIAL GOVERNMENT PROCLAIMS THE SASKATCHEWAN ADVANTAGE GRANT FOR EDUCATION SAVINGS

The Saskatchewan Advantage Grant for Education Savings (SAGES) program received proclamation today by the Provincial Government.

"I am pleased that the SAGES program has been proclaimed," Advanced Education Minister Don Morgan said. "SAGES stems from a commitment our government made as part of our 2011 election platform and will provide an incentive for Saskatchewan families to save for their children's post-secondary education."

SAGES will enable the Government of Saskatchewan to provide a grant to a Registered Education Savings Plan (RESP) at a rate of 10 per cent of the subscriber's annual contributions up to a maximum provincial contribution of \$250 per year per beneficiary.

MARCH JOB NUMBERS HIT RECORD

There were 547,700 people working in Saskatchewan in March, an increase of 25,700 (4.9 per cent) over last March. That's the strongest rate of employment growth in Canada and the most people ever working in Saskatchewan in the month of March.

"March was cold this year in Saskatchewan but our job market was hot," Economy Minister Bill Boyd said. "Today's numbers show our Growth Plan is working and our government will keep making decisions that encourage job creation in Saskatchewan."

FOLLOW THE SIGNS IN HIGHWAY WORK ZONES - IT'S BLACK AND WHITE

Driving down the highway you see the familiar orange sign with a worker on it. Do you slow down immediately? Maintain your speed until you see workers? How fast should you be going and when can you speed back up again?

When construction season begins this spring, Saskatchewan motorists will see improved signage in highway work zones, ensuring that the speed limits are "black and white".

"We're making it 'black-and-white' for drivers," Highways and Infrastructure Minister Don McMorris said. "With the introduction of the new signage, all drivers need to do is follow the signs for the safety of our workers and for their own safety, so we can prevent future tragedies."

MR. HOCKEY - GORDIE HOWE HEADING HOME FOR THE 2013 MASTERCARD MEMORIAL CUP



On Wednesday, April 3 the 2013 MasterCard Memorial Cup Host Committee announced that Mr. Hockey - Gordie Howe will be the guest of honour for the May 21 game between the OHL and QMJHL champions in Saskatoon.

Born in Floral, SK and raised in Saskatoon, Mr. Hockey - Gordie Howe celebrated his 85th birthday on March 31. Between the NHL and WHA, he played in 2,186 regular-season games and won six Hart Trophies as the NHL's most valuable player. His name is engraved on the Stanley Cup four times as a member of the Detroit Red Wings.

"Having Gordie Howe participate in the 2013 MasterCard Memorial Cup is a natural," says Jack Brodsky, co-chair of the event. "His name is synonymous with hockey, and for people from these parts, it's also synonymous with Saskatoon, so we're extremely excited about the opportunity to honour him in his hometown."

RENTAL RIGHTS ENHANCED FOR SASKATCHEWAN SENIORS

The Government of Saskatchewan has introduced a change that will increase the rental rights of seniors in the province.

Effective April 1, residents living in retirement homes, seniors' retirement communities and independent living facilities that provide meals to residents over the age of 55 will be able to access the Office of Residential Tenancies to resolve disputes.

“Our government is pleased to provide residents living in these facilities with the same rights as other Saskatchewan tenants,” Justice Minister and Attorney General Gordon Wyant said. “This change will bring Saskatchewan in line with the rest of the country on this issue, and offer protection and security to our province's seniors.”
