


SASKATCHEWAN'S SURGICAL INVESTMENT DELIVERS MORE SURGERIES AND REDUCES WAIT TIMES



There were 100,406 surgeries and procedures performed between April 1, 2024, and March 31, 2025. The health system also exceeded its target of completing 90 per cent of surgeries within eight months, with nearly 92 per cent completed within that timeframe.



"Saskatchewan's health care system is delivering on the commitment to improve access to surgical care through investments and setting aggressive targets," Health Minister Jeremy Cockrill said. "Annual budget investments have helped to stabilize system capacity and lay the groundwork for even greater progress in the years ahead. The surgical program is now well-positioned to achieve a six-month wait time target for most surgeries set for 2025–26. We are thankful to our surgical teams for their hard work and dedication to benefit patients."

GOVERNMENT OF SASKATCHEWAN INCREASES FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FOR THOSE AFFECTED BY WILDFIRE STATE OF EMERGENCY



Due to the wildfires affecting communities across Saskatchewan, today, Minister Tim McLeod, in conjunction with the Saskatchewan Public Safety Agency (SPSA), has increased financial assistance for those registered with the SPSA, raising the amount provided to the head of household to \$40 per day, up from \$20, and the additional members of a household would increase to \$20 per day, up from \$10. Bringing the daily maximum of \$200 per day.

As of yesterday, there were 24 active wildfires in Saskatchewan and 33 communities have evacuated. To date this year, there have been 251 wildfires, well above the five-year average of 141.

"While we are hoping to soon have some individuals and families repatriated back to their communities, we know that some will have to continue to be evacuated as we deal with ensuring safe cleanup of these devasting wildfires," Saskatchewan Public Safety Minister Tim McLeod, K.C. said. "Frontline crews and multiple agencies are working as quickly as possible to do so."

# Funding announced for 40 mobile withdrawal management spaces in Saskatoon.


Mobile withdrawal services are designed to help individuals safely detox in the community.

### SASKATCHEWAN FIRE UPDATE



As of 11:00 hours on Thursday, June 12, there were 23 active wildfires in Saskatchewan. Of those active fires, three are categorized as contained, six are not contained, 12 are ongoing assessment and two are listed as protecting values.

This year, Saskatchewan has had 258 wildfires, which is well above the five-year average of 147 to date.

The Carter House is a family treatment centre in Saskatoon where parents and children participate in treatment activities together to address substance use and family stability together.



### **CROP REPORT FOR THE PERIOD JUNE 3 TO JUNE 9, 2025**



Almost all Saskatchewan producers have completed their seeding operations with 100 per cent of the 2025 crop seeded. Rain was welcome in many parts of the province this week. However, in areas that did not receive as much rain, topsoil moisture is continuing to decline.

Rain fell in many areas of the province over the last week with the southeast and east-central regions receiving the highest amounts. The Calder area reported the highest rainfall amount at 36 millimeters (mm) followed by the Stockholm area at 35 mm and the Rocanville area at 34 mm. Regions that did not receive significant amounts of precipitation have noted that rainfall is needed soon to avoid serious crop damage.


