Just Saskatchewan producers investing billions every spring to grow the food, fuel, and fertilizer the world relies on.



Strong economic performance and record investment are creating new opportunities for families and communities across the province.

Our competitive incentives and predictable regulatory framework continue to attract global investment. The Fraser Institute ranked Saskatchewan among the top three jurisdictions worldwide for mining investment attractiveness. Mineral sales reached \$12.8 billion in 2025, representing a 19 per cent increase over 2024 and reflecting continued confidence in Saskatchewan's resource sector.

This growth was driven by substantial gains in potash and uranium sales. Potash sales rose over 18 per cent to \$9.3 billion, while uranium sales increased 24 per cent to \$3.2 billion, setting a new

industry record. Uranium sales exceeded the Saskatchewan Growth Plan's 2030 target for the second straight year, surpassing it by more than 50 per cent. Potash remains a core pillar of our strong economy, and our world-class uranium industry continues to create opportunities across the province.

Alongside potash and uranium, projects in helium, lithium, gold, copper and zinc continue to advance. The diversity of our resource sector positions the province as a true critical minerals powerhouse and a reliable supplier of food and clean energy security to global partners. More than 20,000 people work in mining and contractor roles across Saskatchewan, and companies purchase over \$3 billion in goods and services from local suppliers each year.

Stable economic performance continues to support strong procurement outcomes for local suppliers. In 2025-26, 94 per cent of executive government procurements went to Saskatchewan companies, totaling \$698 million across 490 contracts. The Crown sector procured an additional \$1.5 billion in goods and services, including \$152 million awarded to Indigenous suppliers.

A secure business climate continues to attract major private investment. This is reflected in recent projects from Louis Dreyfus Company, Sandvik and BHP, whose Jansen project is the largest investment in provincial history. Saskatchewan's strong and diversified economy is also supporting significant growth in the tech sector. A new 300 MW data centre near Regina, announced with Bell Canada, is valued at up to \$12 billion and will create substantial economic activity.

This activity allows our government to make strategic investments that strengthen essential services and modernize key infrastructure across the province, ensuring families have access to the care and support they need.

One way we are ensuring families have access to the care and support they need is through continued investments in critical care services. Construction has begun on major ICU renovations at Royal University Hospital, supported by over \$17 million in capital funding for 2026-27. This project will expand ICU capacity from 19 to 26 beds and modernize the entire unit to support safer, more efficient care. Renovations will be completed in phases to maintain uninterrupted services for patients and care teams. These upgrades ensure Saskatchewan families continue receiving timely, life-saving care when they need it most.

By working with community partners, we are creating spaces that foster community, connection and a better quality of life for Saskatchewan residents. A new four-space group home has opened in Regina through a partnership with Chip and Dale Homes. The project includes \$1.5 million in capital funding and over \$500,000 in annual operations. The home provides 24-hour staffing, supervision and personal care in a safe, respectful environment that promotes dignity,

independence and community inclusion.

These improvements are part of broader efforts to support individuals and families across the province. Community supports rely on safe neighbourhoods and that's why we continue to advance public safety through targeted initiatives. A partnership with Paul Brandt's #NotInMyCity initiative is providing \$100,000 for specialized training for frontline law enforcement. Training will focus on investigative skills, victim-centred practices and improved coordination among police agencies.

At the same time, specialized policing teams are delivering strong results across Saskatchewan municipalities. These teams support local police services with major investigations, gang suppression, warrant enforcement and community safety operations. Their work has led to significant drug seizures, arrests and the removal of illegal firearms, helping keep communities safe.

Together, these efforts reflect a province moving forward with confidence. Saskatchewan continues to create jobs, support communities and deliver results that keep our province strong and competitive.

As the spring legislative session draws to a close, our government remains focused on doing the work that protects Saskatchewan today and strengthens our province for the future. This year's budget keeps life affordable, invests in communities, and protects the services families rely on. With the Patients First Health Care Plan, we are expanding access, supporting health-care workers, and building the modern system Saskatchewan people deserve. This session, we delivered meaningful results, and we're proud of the work accomplished for families across our province.

**CONSTRUCTION BEGINS AT ROYAL UNIVERSITY HOSPITAL
ICU BED EXPANSION**

Expanding Critical Care



**Renovations Begin at RUH
to Modernize the ICU
and Increase Capacity**

The Government of Saskatchewan is investing over \$17 million in capital funding for 2026-27 to expand adult Intensive Care Unit (ICU) capacity at Royal University Hospital (RUH) in Saskatoon.

This project will increase the number of ICU beds from 19 to 26, building on the province's ongoing commitment to strengthen critical care services.

“Expanding ICU capacity at Royal University Hospital means more access to support critically ill and surgical patients in Saskatoon and surrounding areas,” Health Minister Jeremy Cockrill said. “This project reflects our government’s commitment to putting patients first by strengthening our health system and delivering the right care in the right place at the right time.”

“The expansion project at the Royal University Hospital Intensive Care Unit highlights our commitment to delivering health infrastructure to protect Saskatchewan,” SaskBuilds and Procurement Minister Sean Wilson said. “Through careful planning and the two-phased construction approach to allow continuity of operations, this project will enhance critical care capacity while maintaining uninterrupted services, ensuring patients and care teams benefit from modern, purpose-built facilities.”

RECORD NUMBER OF SURGERIES PERFORMED IN SASKATCHEWAN 2025-26



More than 100,000 surgical procedures performed for the second consecutive year

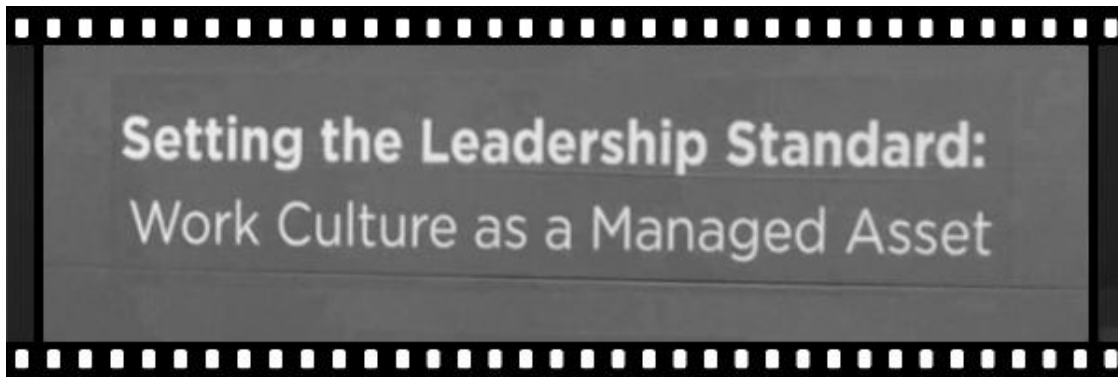
high-quality care, in the right place at the right time."

**94 PER CENT OF EXECUTIVE GOVERNMENT PROCUREMENTS
AWARDED TO SASKATCHEWAN COMPANIES**



On May 11, The Ministry of SaskBuilds and Procurement and Crown Investments Corporation hosted an event highlighting that 94% of 490 procurements in 2025–26 went to Saskatchewan companies.

The Government of Saskatchewan's commitment to procuring from Saskatchewan-based companies remains strong.

The Ministry of SaskBuilds and Procurement (SBP), in collaboration with the Crown Investments Corporation (CIC), announced the Government of Saskatchewan's (GOS) 2025-26 procurement results and work with businesses across the province.

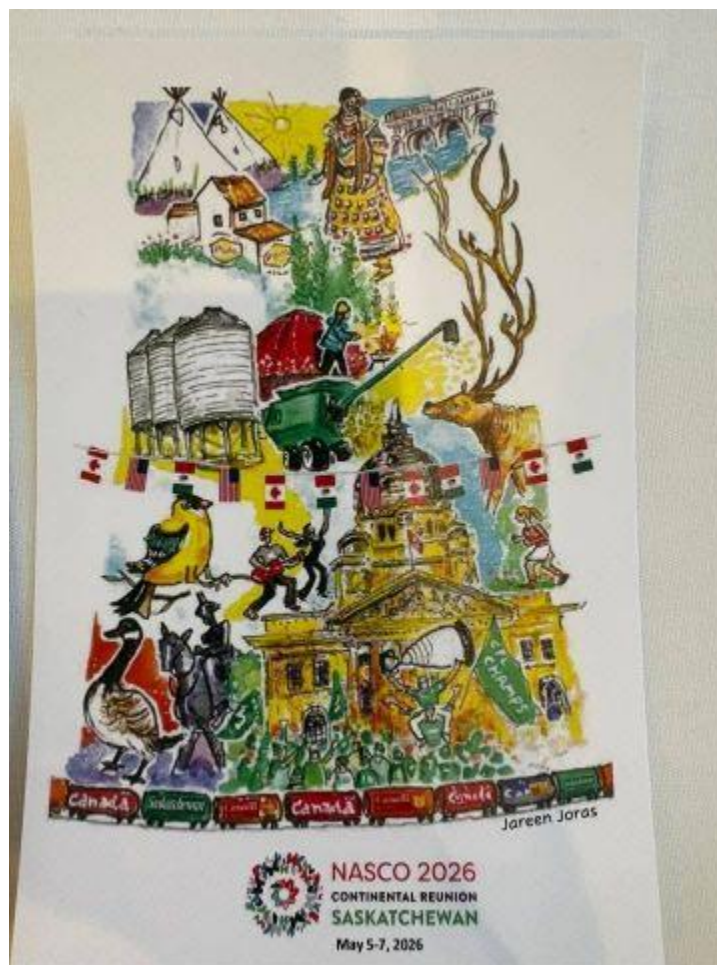
During the 2025-26 fiscal year, the provincial government awarded 490 procurements with a value of \$741 million. Over 94 per cent of procurements, valued at \$698 million, were awarded to Saskatchewan-based companies. These results demonstrate the scale of government purchasing and its positive impact on Saskatchewan jobs and communities.

“Our Saskatchewan companies and contractors are the best in the world.” SaskBuilds and Procurement Minister Sean Wilson said. “When local businesses understand how procurement works and where opportunities exist, it

leads to stronger local companies, good jobs for Saskatchewan people and value for taxpayers."

"It is an honour to represent Saskatchewan and host this year's reunion," Keisig said. "Our province is a long-time member of NASCO, and we are excited to host dynamic discussions and sessions that speak to our strengths in natural resources, critical minerals, energy, agriculture and beyond."

In 2025, the U.S. and Mexico had a combined export value of \$24.6 billion, which represents 56.6 per cent of Saskatchewan's total exports.

SPRING IS HERE, AND SO ARE THE BEARS!



Spring has sprung, and as the temperature rises across Saskatchewan, black bears are emerging from their dens near communities throughout the province. The Government of Saskatchewan is reminding residents and visitors to take simple precautions and remain "Bear Aware" to help prevent conflicts with wildlife.

Black bears are found widely across Saskatchewan. While commonly associated with northern forested areas, they are also found in central and southern regions; including the aspen parkland, Touchwood Hills, Qu'Appelle Valley and the South Saskatchewan River Valley.

During the spring, bears spend much of their time foraging to replenish body fat lost over the winter, making them more likely to seek out easy food sources near homes and campsites. Black bears are intelligent and ruled by their stomachs. Limiting attractants is the most effective way to reduce these interactions.

LEGISLATION PASSES FOR COMPASSIONATE INTERVENTION FOR ADDICTIONS TREATMENT



The Government of Saskatchewan has passed *The Compassionate Intervention Act*, which allows for involuntary addictions treatment.

The Act supports people with severe addictions who are not capable of seeking help despite serious health and safety risks.

"Not everyone has the capacity to make the decision to enter treatment on their own because of the extreme state of their addiction," Mental Health and Addictions Minister Lori Carr said. "Compassionate intervention promotes meaningful long-term outcomes to help stabilize those individuals and support them in recovery."

"The Compassionate Intervention Act provides a path to recovery for the most extreme cases of addiction," Justice Minister and Attorney General Tim McLeod, K.C. said. "We are proud to get this legislation across the finish line and provide

families with a new way to get help for their loved ones that are unable to make the decision to pursue recovery."

MINING SECTOR DRIVES ECONOMIC GROWTH

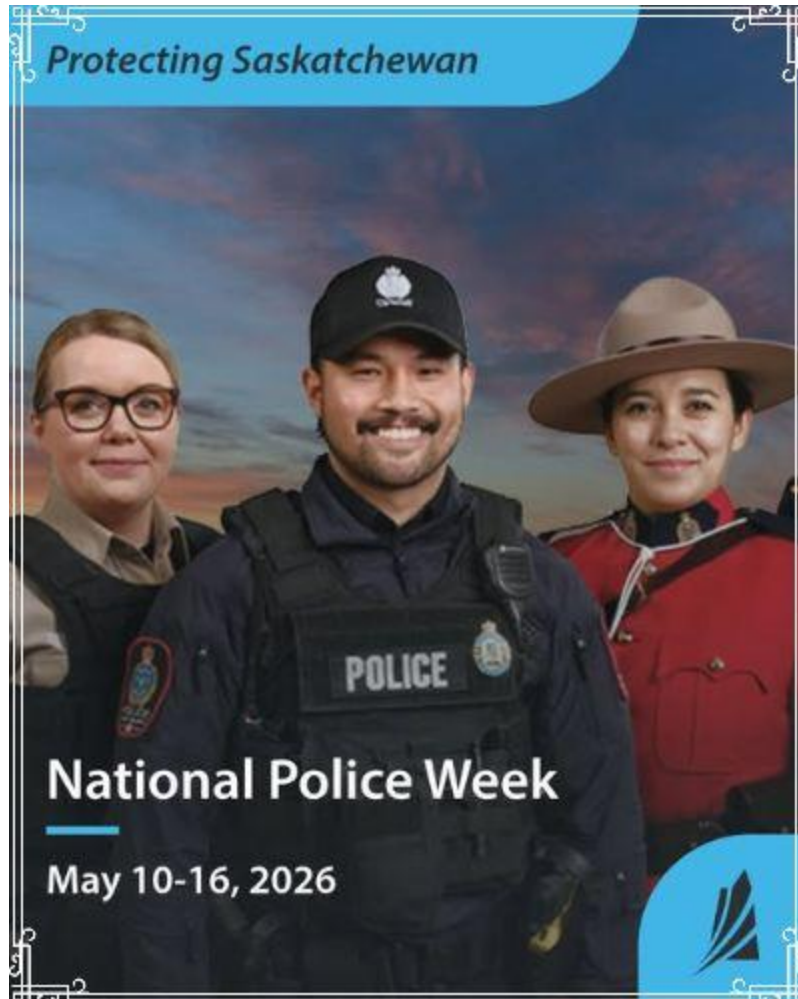
*In 2025, Saskatchewan's world class mining sector generated **over \$12.8 billion in sales**, a 19% increase over 2024.*

Saskatchewan's world class mining sector continues to drive economic growth, generating over \$12.8 billion in mineral sales in 2025, a 19 per cent increase compared to 2024.

This growth was primarily due to substantial gains in the value of potash and uranium sales. Potash sales rose by over 18 per cent to a total of \$9.3 billion, while uranium sales increased by 24 per cent to \$3.2 billion, setting a new industry record. Notably, 2025 marked the second consecutive year that uranium sales exceeded the Saskatchewan Growth Plan's 2030 target, surpassing it by more than 50 per cent.

"Potash continues to be a core pillar of our strong economy, while our world-class uranium industry continues to create opportunities for people in the north and all of Saskatchewan," Energy and Resources Minister Chris Beaudry said. "Along with the continued growth of potash and uranium, other Saskatchewan mineral projects are advancing including in helium, lithium, gold, copper and zinc. The diversity of our natural resources sector is our strength and one of the reasons Saskatchewan is a true critical minerals powerhouse."

The Government of Saskatchewan has proclaimed May 10 to 16, 2026, as National Police Week.

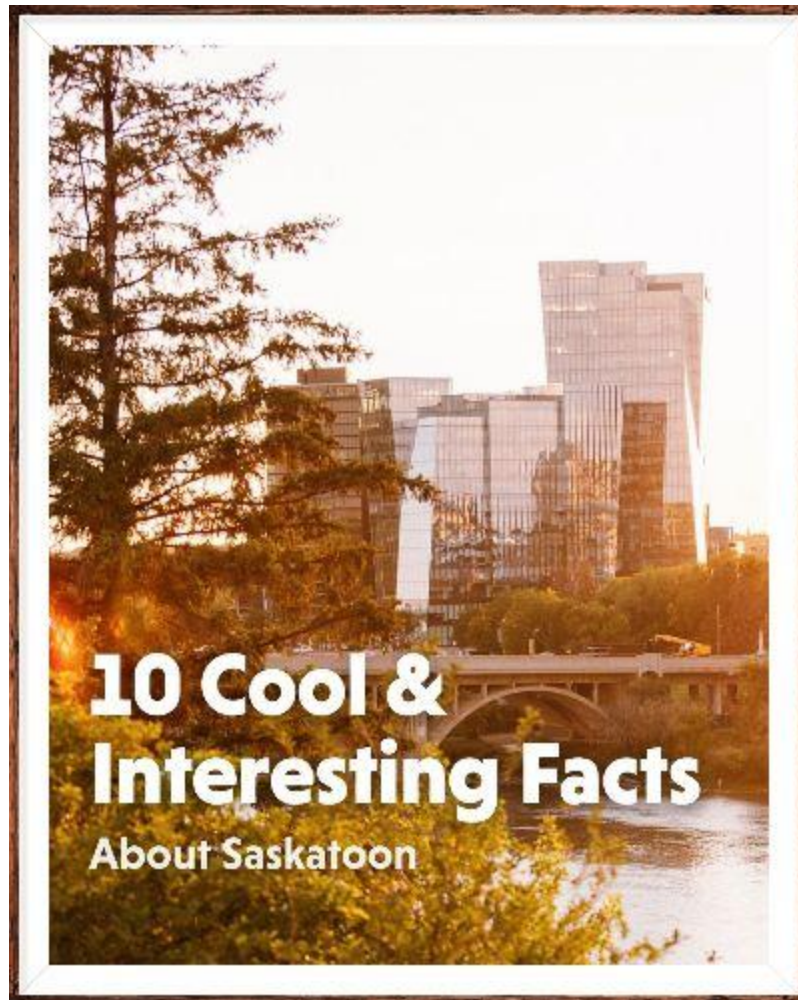

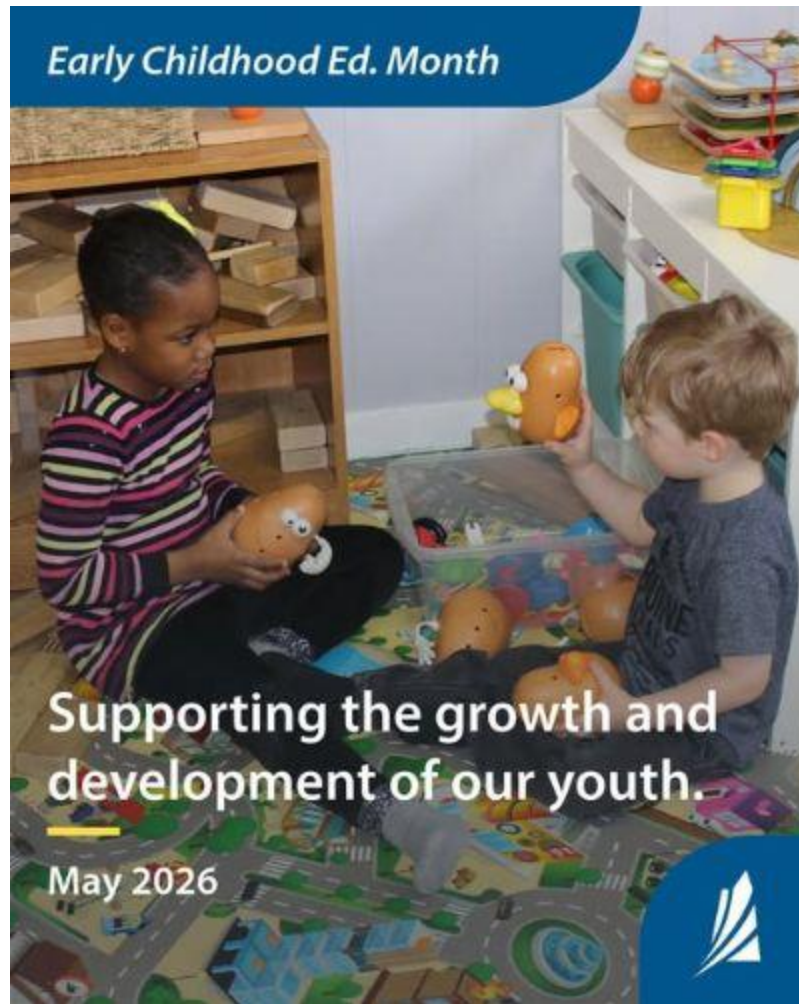
More Saskatchewan students can now train to become doctors!

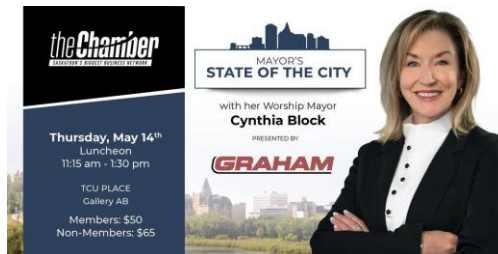

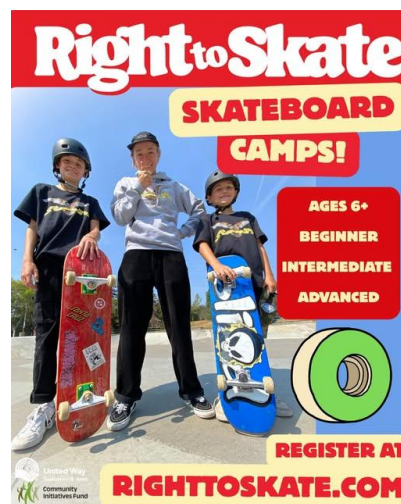

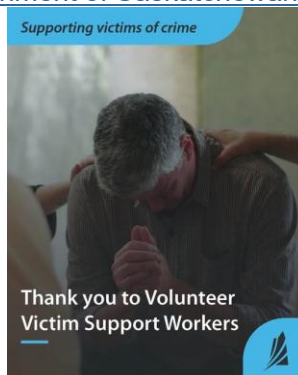
