

The University of Saskatchewan is creating space for the engineers our province needs. Today was a remarkable step towards supporting that goal.


Special thanks to Cenovus Energy for its generosity and support of post-secondary institutions and students in Saskatchewan.





The report, which outlines provincial trade highlights for 2024, reveals that it was the thirdhighest export year for Saskatchewan, with the total value of exports reaching \$45.4 billion.

"Our exporters, manufacturers, and producers remain suppliers of choice as we bring food and energy security to countries around the world. CONTRIBUTIONS OF PUBLIC WORKS PROFESSIONALS RECOGNIZED MAY 18-24, 2025





CROP REPORT FOR THE PERIOD MAY 13 TO MAY 19,2025

Weekly Crop Report

Seeding Progress 72% complete for the week of May 13 - 19



Seeding in Saskatchewan is nearly three-quarters complete with 72 per cent of crops now planted, which is an increase of 23 per cent from last week. This is a smaller increase than the week prior, which is largely due to rain delays in parts of the south and east regions of the province. Seeding progress remains notably higher than the five-year average of 60 per cent and 10-year average of 64 per cent.

Producers in the southwest are in the home stretch of seeding with 89 per cent of crops currently seeded in this region. Progress in the northwest and west-central follow closely with 81 per cent of crops now seeded in these regions. Producers in the northeast made good progress this week as seeding progress in this region sits at 74 per cent. Seeding progress in the southeast and east-central are below the provincial average. Seeding in the southeast is 63 per cent complete, while the east-central region has the smallest percentage of current seeded acres with progress currently sitting at 58 per cent.

OFFICIAL OPENING OF A GROUP HOME

Four individuals with intellectual disabilities now have a safe and supportive place to call home. On May 2, Social Services Minister Terry Jenson joined Elmwood Residences Inc. to celebrate the official opening of a group home for four former residents of Kinsmen Manor.

The Ministry of Social Services invested \$1.4 million in capital funding to support the development of the home and is providing \$608,000 in annual operating funding. This

investment supports greater independence and quality of life for persons with disabilities in our province.

SASKATCHEWAN PROVIDES NEARLY \$1 MILLION TO SUPPORT YOUNG ENTREPRENEURS



Minister of Trade and Export Development Warren Kaeding, along with Saskatchewan Chamber CEO Prabha Ramaswamy launched the new Young Entrepreneur Bursary that will support up to 57 local young entrepreneurs with bursaries of \$5,000 to foster business development.

The province will provide Saskatchewan Chamber of Commerce with \$285,000 per year, for three years, plus administration costs to support entrepreneurs between

the ages of 18 and 35 years of age who have been in operation for 10 years or less. <u>Applications open today</u> through to July 14, 2025 and will be awarded in the fall.

"The New Young Entrepreneur Bursary promotes business development and innovation, creating opportunities for small business owners and entrepreneurs across our Province," Kaeding said. "Collaboration between government and organizations like Saskatchewan Chamber of Commerce is an important component of Saskatchewan's Growth Plan and our commitment to ensure the province remains one of the best places in Canada to start and grow a business."
