



YOUR LEGISLATIVE REPORT

The Spring Sitting of the Second Session of the Thirtieth Legislature concluded on May 14, 2026. Our government advanced key priorities focused on protecting Saskatchewan through affordability, health care, community safety, education, and economic growth. Throughout this sitting, we remained focused on keeping life affordable for Saskatchewan families while supporting a strong and resilient provincial economy. This year's budget reflects this approach, with investments strengthening programs and services, supporting communities, and ensuring Saskatchewan remains well-positioned for the future. The 2026-27 provincial budget is available online at www.budget.saskatchewan.ca.

We also saw the passage of several important pieces of legislation introduced in the fall sitting, advancing commitments made in the Throne Speech. These included *The Compassionate Intervention Act*, which creates a pathway for families, law enforcement, and the courts to initiate treatment supports for individuals unable to seek help on their own; *The Building Schools Faster Act*, which improves processes for timely school construction with municipalities; *The Saskatchewan Firearms Amendment Act*, which strengthens provincial protections for law-abiding firearms owners in relation to federally directed firearms policies; and *The Saskatchewan Internal Trade Promotion Act*, which reduces interprovincial trade barriers and supports economic growth.

Also included were *The Tailgating Act*, which enables tailgating events prior to Saskatchewan Roughriders games and other major events; *The Cyberstalking and Coercive Control Act*, which strengthens protections for victims of interpersonal violence; and *The Heritage Recognition (From Many Peoples, Strength) Act*, which establishes a framework to recognize Saskatchewan's cultural and heritage observances.

Additional measures included *The Municipalities Modernization and Red Tape Reduction Act*, which reduces administrative duplication and streamlines municipal processes; *The Response to Illicit Drugs Act*, which strengthens tools to address drug-related crime and enhances accountability; and *The Income Tax Amendment Act*, which doubles the volunteer first responders tax credit to support community responders.

Our government's priorities were guided by the Throne Speech and the 2024 election commitments, and we are pleased to have delivered on all our promises. With a continued focus on protecting Saskatchewan and supporting long-term growth for the benefit of everyone who calls our province home, we will continue to be out in communities. We look forward to engaging with residents, local organizations and businesses and to listening to how we can best support the needs of Saskatchewan people. Moving into the summer months, Saskatchewan's provincial parks are now open across the province, welcoming residents and visitors for another season of outdoor recreation. Our government is pleased to see preparations completed for campsites and trails, and we thank all staff who have worked hard to ensure parks are ready for visitors. SASKATCHEWAN MONTHLY CONSTRUCTION UPDATE - MAY 2026 EDITION

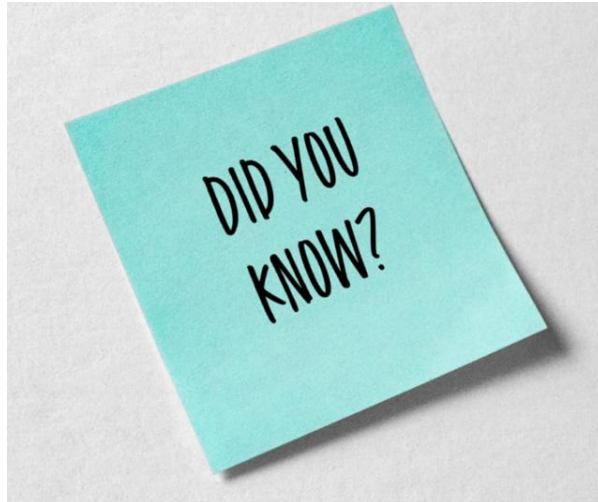

Working in partnership with Ahtahkakoop Cree Developments (ACD), Saskatchewan's second urgent care centre (UCC) in Saskatoon continues to show progress.

Recent construction activities include the completion of wall protection, millwork and flooring. Mechanical and electrical work continues along with the installation of doors, hardware, lighting fixtures and washroom accessories. Exterior work has resumed with paving and concrete work set to commence. The final coat of paint within the facility is scheduled for completion by the end of May.

"Seeing the progress on the new Saskatoon Urgent Care Centre is truly exciting," Health Minister Jeremy Cockrill said. "Urgent care centres are designed to put patients first and improve access - helping ease pressure on emergency departments while ensuring people get the right care, at the right place, at the right time. We are proud to be bringing this model of care to Saskatoon and more Saskatchewan communities in the future."



The Saskatoon UCC will be 1,600 square metres in size and will feature five unique wall murals chosen by the late Ahtahkakoop Cree Nation Chief Barry Ahenakew shortly before his passing. Four of the five murals incorporate the four sacred medicines, which include sage, cedar, tobacco and sweetgrass. The Cree translations are also included as part of the murals.

INDEPENDENT REVIEW BEGINS TO STRENGTHEN HOSPITAL SAFETY AND SECURITY



Work is began this week on the independent, third-party review of hospital safety and security.

The Ministry of Health has contracted Buckingham Security Services Ltd., to perform the review under the leadership of Clive Weighill, executive director at Buckingham. Weighill is a former Saskatoon police chief and served as Saskatchewan's chief coroner.

“Our government is committed to ensuring the safety of both patients and health care workers,” Health Minister Jeremy Cockrill said. “Steps have already been taken in several facilities across the province and are showing positive results. The review being conducted by Clive Weighill will inform further enhancements to safety in hospitals throughout our province.”

Know Before You Burn

Fire risk in Saskatchewan can change quickly — and so can the rules around burning. Knowing the difference can help you make safe, responsible decisions.

- **Fire Advisory:** Conditions are drying out and wildfire risk is increasing. Open burning is still allowed, but extra caution is required and restrictions

may be introduced if conditions worsen.

● **Fire Restriction:** Fire risk is elevated and some types of open burning are limited. Certain activities may still be allowed, but rules are in place to reduce the risk of wildfires.

● **Fire Ban:** Fire risk is extreme and most outdoor fires are prohibited. Only a few low-risk activities may be allowed until conditions improve.

While the SPSA shares this information to help keep people informed, fire advisories, restrictions and bans are usually put in place by local municipalities (RMs) and provincial parks.

Always check for the latest updates from your local municipality or park before lighting any fires.

EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION MONTH

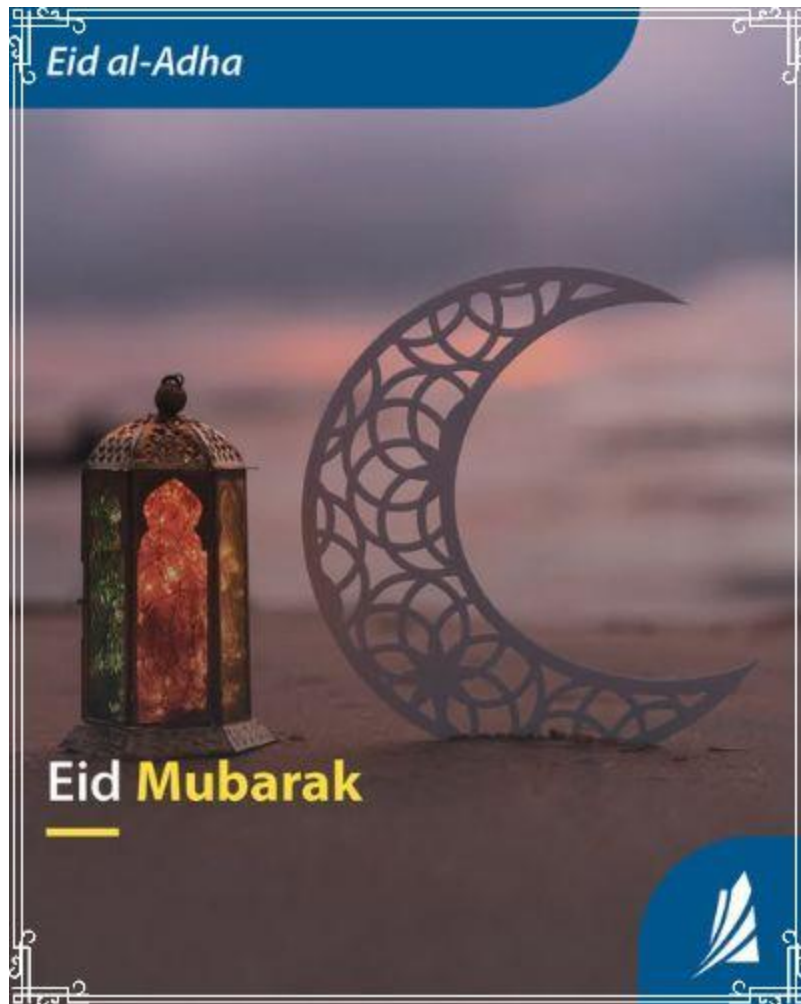


Throughout the month of May, we celebrated Early Childhood Education Month!

**APPLICATIONS OPEN FOR SECOND INTAKE OF SASKATCHEWAN'S YOUNG
ENTREPRENEUR BURSARY**



Up to 57 young entrepreneurs will receive bursaries in 2026 worth \$5,000 each.

Minister of Trade and Export Development Warren Kaeding and Saskatchewan Chamber of Commerce CEO Prabha Ramaswamy announced that applications for the Young Entrepreneur Bursary intake for 2026-27 are now being accepted. Entrepreneurs between the ages of 18 and 35 who have been in operation for less than 10 years are eligible to apply. Applications for this year's intake close July 17.

"There is no better place in Canada for young people to start a business than right here in Saskatchewan," Trade and Export Development Minister Warren Kaeding said. "The Young Entrepreneur Bursary is supporting young business owners as they grow their ventures and contribute to their local economies and communities.
