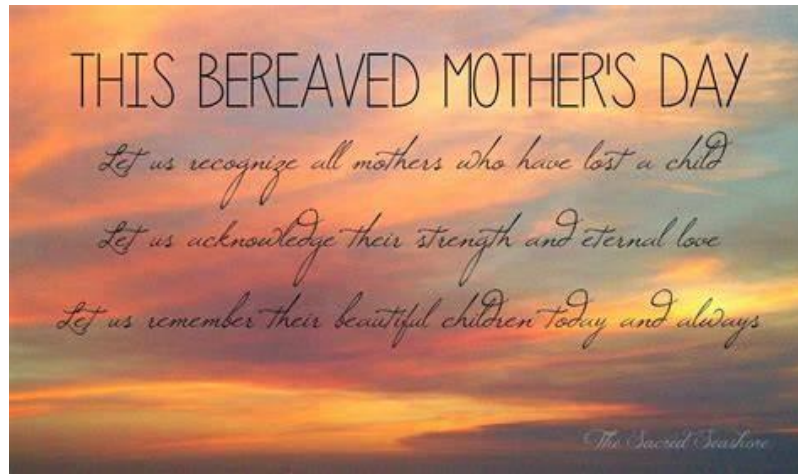

SASKATCHEWAN INTRODUCES HENRY'S LAW, STRENGTHENING CARBON MONOXIDE EJECTION STANDARDS IN THE PROVINCE

Protecting Lives

Henry's Law Strengthens Carbon Monoxide Safety



The Government of Saskatchewan is announcing changes to the carbon monoxide (CO) alarm requirements in residential buildings. The changes will further strengthen the current regulations, requiring CO alarms in all residential suites regardless of location in the building.



"The tragic death of Henry Losco highlighted the need to strengthen the existing regulations to ensure the safety of all Saskatchewan residents," Government Relations Minister Eric Schmalz said. "We wanted to act quickly, using existing regulatory authorities to strengthen regulations to protect against carbon monoxide exposure in residential buildings.

"To honour Henry and at the wishes of the family, the regulatory changes will be referred to as Henry's Law."

SASKATCHEWAN INVESTS \$3.5 MILLION IN REGINA AND SASKATOON TRADES AND SKILLS CENTRES

The Government of Saskatchewan has increased funding by \$534,000 to the Trades and Skills Centres in Saskatoon and Regina, bringing the total investment to \$3.5 million. This increase will fund three additional programs at both Trades and Skills Centres.

NEW TRAINING FACILITY EXPANDS OPPORTUNITIES IN CENTRAL SASKATCHEWAN



A multi-million-dollar investment from the Government of Saskatchewan, BHP and Carlton Trail College will support development of the new BHP Technical Training Centre in Humboldt. 

The Government of Saskatchewan is looking to hear directly from families in the province regarding placing limits on social media access for youth under the age of 16.

"We are interested in a dialogue and understand the federal government is open to a conversation about placing limits on social media," Premier Scott Moe said. "We want to go into that conversation with the knowledge that we are representing the wishes of our residents."

Government wants to hear directly from parents and residents what role government should play and how far it should go between an outright ban, some flexibility for parental consent or leave entirely to parents.

A postcard will be mailed to households across the province in the coming days that includes several questions on possible social media limits and a option for comments. The postcard includes prepaid postage for return mail by June 30th, 2026. The results will be tabulated over the summer.

"We encourage everyone who receives a postcard to participate and have their voice heard," Mental Health and Addictions Minister Lori Carr said. "We know there is growing concern over the harmful effects of social media on mental health, particularly for young people and we want to be sure we are being respectful of parents wishes in how we can support our youth to have happy, healthy childhoods."

The federal government is considering potential restrictions on social media use by individuals under the age of 16. This survey seeks input from Saskatchewan families on potential restrictions for the following major social media platforms: TikTok, Facebook, Instagram, YouTube and Snapchat.

**SASKATCHEWAN INCREASING REPORTING FREQUENCY OF EMERGENCY
ROOM SERVICE DISRUPTIONS**



The Government of Saskatchewan is directing the Saskatchewan Health Authority (SHA) to increase the frequency with which temporary emergency service disruptions are posted on the SHA website from once daily to at least twice daily, or as soon as practically possible.

On November 10, 2025, the SHA launched a new process to provide patients, families, and communities with accurate and reliable information about emergency room availability. All emergency service disruptions, regardless of their length, are now posted publicly on the SHA website, with updates occurring daily at 4:00 p.m. As of May 19, 2026, the frequency of updates to the website will double, occurring twice a day at 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m.

"Our focus remains on implementing our Patients First Health Care Plan to deliver innovative solutions to reduce the occurrence of temporary service disruptions and ensure everyone in Saskatchewan has access to the right care, at the right time, as close to home as possible," Health Minister Jeremy Cockrill said. "It is important for Saskatchewan people to have reliable and timely information on health care service availability in their community. This is why our government is directing the Saskatchewan Health Authority to

move to twice daily reporting of temporary emergency room service disruptions.”

SASKATCHEWAN'S GDP HIGHEST ON RECORD - \$85.4 BILLION IN 2025

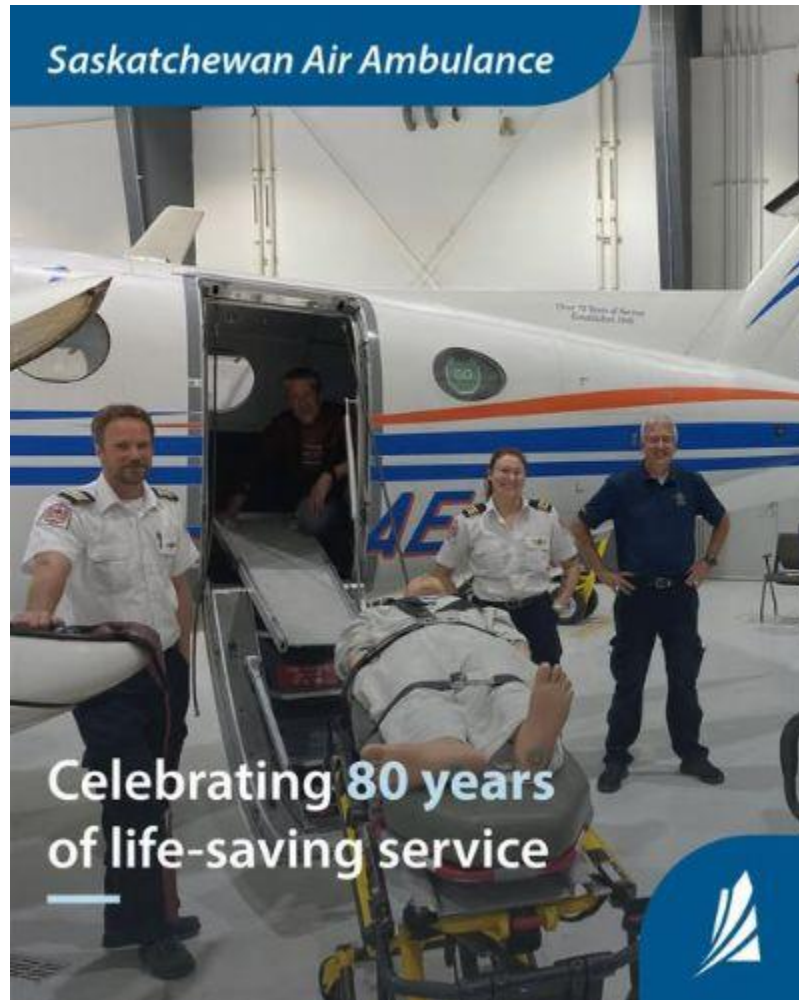


Estimates from Statistics Canada show Saskatchewan's GDP grew by 2.2 per cent, bringing the total for 2025 to \$85.4 billion. This is yet another all-time high for the province and well above the national average of 1.6 per cent.

SASKATCHEWAN AIR AMBULANCE CELEBRATES 80TH ANNIVERSARY



In February, Saskatchewan Air Ambulance (SAA) reached 80 years of service, marking eight decades of delivering emergency medical air transport and care to people across Saskatchewan.

Founded in 1946, SAA is the oldest formally organized, non-military air medical transport program in North America. Since its inaugural flight from Regina to Liberty, Saskatchewan, SAA has transported approximately 78,500 patients. Today, the service operates from its base at the Saskatoon airport, dispatching crews to communities throughout the province, completing about 1,500 patient transfers per year.

The Saskatchewan Health Authority, the Ministry of SaskBuilds and Procurement and the Ministry of Health partner to offer this lifesaving service to all residents of Saskatchewan, including those in remote and northern communities.

To celebrate this milestone, the three partner organizations will gather today for an anniversary celebration at the SAA aircraft hangar in Saskatoon, featuring remarks from elected officials.



"For eight decades, Saskatchewan Air Ambulance has played a crucial role in ensuring patients have access to timely, specialized medical care when they need it most, no matter where in the province they live," SaskBuilds and Procurement Minister Sean Wilson said. "SAA's ability to transport patients quickly and safely across great distances continues to make it an indispensable service, and I am honoured to partake in celebrating 80 years of collaboration, dedication and serving Saskatchewan citizens."
