SASKATCHEWAN DELEGATION HEADING TO OTTAWA TO DISCUSS RENEWED MUNICIPAL INFRASTRUCTURE PROGRAM



Schmalz Leading Ottawa Delegation, Highlighting Need for Municipal Infrastructure Investment Vital to a Strong Saskatchewan

This week, Government Relations Minister Eric Schmalz and Advanced Education Minister Ken Cheveldayoff along with municipal leaders from across Saskatchewan will meet with federal leaders to call for the renewal of a cost-shared infrastructure program with the federal government.

PHARMACY AND NUTRITION WHITE COAT CEREMONY





This year marks the 50th anniversary of VIDI (Vaccine and Infectious Disease Organization) at the U of S.


VIDO is a world-class facility situated in Saskatoon, providing critical support to the Canadian and global agriculture industries through disease research.



PROVINCE RECOGNIZES SENIORS' WEEK



The Government of Saskatchewan has proclaimed September 28 to October 4 as Seniors' Week to celebrate the many contributions of older adults across the province.

"Saskatchewan seniors are a vibrant, engaged group of citizens," Seniors Minister Lori Carr said. "Our government is committed to meeting the needs of older residents and ensuring they have access to high-quality programs and services."

#### Did you know?

Our government is committed to meeting the needs of older residents and ensuring they have access to high-quality programs and services. New programs and benefits for seniors are: full coverage of continuous and flash glucose monitors, expansion of the Personal Care Home Benefit to bridge the gap between seniors' monthly income and the care they deserve, the senior's supplement increase of \$500 a year for the next four years over and above the impact of indexation. This is the largest personal income tax reduction since 2008. Ambulance trips are capped at \$135 and inter-facility transfers are provided at no cost to seniors aged 65 and older. Through the Seniors' Drug Plan, prescription drugs listed on the Saskatchewan Formulary, or approved under Exception Drug Status, are limited to a maximum cost of \$25.

#### SAVED BY THE BEEP PROVINCE RECOGNIZES TEST YOUR SMOKE ALARM DAY



The Government of Saskatchewan and the Saskatchewan Public Safety Agency (SPSA) have proclaimed September 28, 2025, as Test Your Smoke Alarm Day in the province.

Test Your Smoke Alarm Day encourages residents to properly install and maintain smoke alarms in their homes. This is fundamental to ensure that occupants are warned of a fire and have the time needed to escape.

According to data from the National Fire Protection Association, nearly three out of five (59 per cent) fire deaths happen in homes with no smoke alarms or smoke alarms that failed to operate.

"It is simple - working smoke alarms save lives," SPSA Fire Marshal Wayne Rodger said. "We encourage all residents to test their smoke alarms monthly by pressing the test button to make sure the alarm is working. One simple beep could make all the difference in protecting you and your loved ones."


