Saskatchewan's 2018-19 Budget: On Track





- Returning to balanced budget by next year, 2019-20.
- **Controlling government spending**, reduced number of government vehicles, and one health region savings while improving front-line care.
- Delivering high quality services for Saskatchewan people, with new individualized funding for autism, HIV-drug coverage, and hearing-loss screening for newborns.
- Maintaining competitive taxes, including no increase to tax rates, and *no carbon tax*.
- Targeted incentives to grow our economy, like in value-added agriculture, technology start-ups, and diversifying the mineral sector.
- Maintaining investment in Saskatchewan infrastructure, like new hospitals, schools, passing lanes, Regina Bypass & North Commuter Bridge.

Premier Scott Moe, "In this year's budget, we are on track to achieve a balanced budget by next year, while investing in opportunities for our economy and in people."

Saskatchewan is on track. Faced with challenging years marked by significant resource revenue decline, a plan to restore balance was initiated last year. Budget 2018-19 follows that plan with major investments in health care, education, social services and infrastructure, and a steadily improving outlook over the next four years.



SUPPORT FOLLOWING THE HUMBOLDT BRONCOS TRAGEDY

Resources for the public

Support for the Humboldt Community


The Government of Saskatchewan is coordinating offers of assistance to ensure that psychological supports continue to be available in the longer term, for Humboldt and other communities affected.

Currently, in Humboldt, the Red Cross and Saskatchewan Health Authority have resources on the ground to help residents. HealthLine 8-1-1 can also direct residents to support and services.

- The Red Cross is offering emergency support on behalf of the Government of Saskatchewan for lodging, personal services and meals to families who are not from Saskatoon and now supporting family members who are in the hospital.
- In partnership with Emergency Social Services, the Red Cross is offering comfort in the form of blankets and teddy bears for children – and emergency food, clothing, shelter and other items, along with mental health support, to those directly impacted.
- Members of the Red Cross Safety and Well-being Team are ready and willing to offer support at the request of communities.

Counselling and support services from many school divisions in Saskatchewan have arrived in each of the Humboldt schools to assist students throughout the coming days.

CELEBRATING NATIONAL PUBLIC SAFETY TELECOMMUNICATIONS WEEK




It is so timely that we recognize Public Safety Week this week following the horrific events of April 6th. Thank you to for all you do.

"Telecommunicators are the vital link ensuring information you provide during a 911 call is relayed to the emergency personnel who are coming to your aid. RESERVATIONS OPENED APRIL 9 FOR SASKATCHEWAN PARKS



On Monday, April 9, campers began reserving sites in their favourite Saskatchewan provincial parks for the 2018 season. "With a variety of activities available and an abundance of beautiful landscapes and lakes to explore, it's no surprise our provincial parks continue to be popular travel destinations," Parks, Culture and Sport Minister Gene Makowsky said. "Whether you prefer adventure or relaxation, there's so much to see, learn and discover. We look forward to welcoming guests back to our parks for another memorable season."

To help provide the best user experience possible during the reservation launch, staggered launch dates and a queuing system will be implemented again in 2018. Over ten business days, one to three new parks will open for reservations each day at 7 a.m.

AUTOMATIC PST REFUNDS ON CERTAIN TYPES OF INSURANCE

Policy holders of crop, livestock, hail, margin/income, life and health insurance in Saskatchewan will soon receive a sales tax refund or credit from their insurance provider. Refunds and credits are automatic, meaning no action is required of policy holders.

As announced February 26, 2018, Provincial Sales Tax (PST) no longer applies to the following types of insurance:

- · Individual and group life, health, disability, accident and sickness insurance; and
- Crop, livestock, hail and margin/income insurance.


The PST exemption on these insurance products is retroactive to August 1, 2017, the date certain insurance premiums became taxable in Saskatchewan.

Insurance providers who collected and remitted the PST will calculate all refunds payable and either credit each policy holder's account or provide a refund.

Policy holders do not have to request or submit a claim to their insurance provider or to the government to receive a refund or credit. Most refunds or credits will be paid by June 30, 2018.

If you do not receive a refund or credit by that date, or have questions about the process, please contact your insurance provider.

RECENT SNOWFALL INCREASES SPRING RUNOFF OUTLOOK



April 5, the Water Security Agency (WSA) released the April spring runoff forecast.

Snowfall across most of Saskatchewan was well above normal in March, increasing the runoff potential across the province with northern and southern Saskatchewan showing two different outlooks.

Moisture conditions going into winter freeze-up were well below normal across southern Saskatchewan, with very little precipitation during summer and fall of 2017, and near to above normal across northern Saskatchewan.

Winter snow accumulation to April 1, 2018, was generally near average across Saskatchewan with the exception of an area south of the Cypress Hills and near the communities of Scott, Prince Albert and Hudson Bay, which have received above average accumulations.

STRONG JOB GROWTH IN MARCH




There were 4,200 new jobs created in Saskatchewan in March when compared to February (seasonally adjusted), a 0.7 per cent increase and highest percentage increase among the provinces. The national percentage increase month-to-month was 0.2 per cent.

There were 562,700 people employed in March, 1,500 more than in March 2017. Female employment hit a record high for the month of March at 264,400.

The unemployment rate in March for the province was 5.8 per cent (seasonally adjusted), down from 6.1 per cent a year ago. Saskatchewan had the fourth lowest unemployment rate among provinces in March. Nationally, the unemployment rate was also 5.8 per cent.
