PREMIER WELCOMES NEW CANADA URANIUM DEAL WITH INDIA



Saskatchewan's uranium mining industry yesterday celebrated a milestone achievement, as a historic new agreement with India sets the stage for shipments of Canadian uranium to that country for electricity generation.

Premier Brad Wall was in Ottawa yesterday for the signing of a supply contract between Cameco Inc., a subsidiary of Saskatoon-based Cameco Corporation, and the Department of Atomic Energy of India. The premier witnessed the signing along with Prime Minister Stephen Harper and Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi, who is in Canada on a state visit.

"I would like to thank the federal government and Prime Minister Harper and the Government of India and Prime Minister Modi for reaching the agreement and business framework that made the Cameco contract possible," Wall said. "India has a dynamic and growing nuclear energy program, and the opportunity to supply this major customer is a huge deal for our industry, the workers it employs and the Saskatchewan communities it supports."

CEO of Cameco. Mr. Gitzel indicated this deal opens the door for Saskatchewan and comes with massive upside for potential sales in the future.

With the personal tax filing deadline for the 2014 tax year approaching, Saskatchewan people are encouraged to take advantage of the various provincial tax credits to help keep their taxes low.

"If you're a recent first-time homebuyer or post-secondary graduate, tax credits are available which can reduce your taxes payable and keep more money in your pockets," Finance Minister Ken Krawetz said. "Saskatchewan people with lower incomes or with children enrolled in sports programs or cultural or recreational activities, as well as workers who are required to purchase tools as a condition of their employment can also take advantage of tax credits aimed at helping them keep more of what they earn."

SASKATCHEWAN WAIT TIMES FOR SURGERY AMONG THE BEST IN CANADA

A national report shows Saskatchewan patients are benefiting from improved access to surgery, with surgical wait times among the shortest in the country.

The Canadian Institute for Health Information (CIHI) report, Wait Times for Priority Procedures in Canada, 2015, was released April 14, 2015.

In Saskatchewan, 90 per cent of all patients had an offer of surgery within three months of booking between December 2014 and February 2015.

"Since the launch of the four-year Saskatchewan Surgical Initiative in April 2010, we have made tremendous improvement in patients' access to surgery," Health Minister Dustin Duncan said. "Close to 10,000 more surgeries were performed last year, compared to five years ago, and the number of patients waiting more than three months for surgery has dropped by 87 per cent over the past five years."

It's an honour to recognize these dedicated men and women for the challenging job they do each and every day."

Last year, Saskatchewan 911 operators took 312,031 calls.

SASKATCHEWAN MAINTAINS LOWEST UNEMPLOYMENT RATE - JOBS INCREASE

Saskatchewan's unemployment rate was 4.4 per cent in March 2015 (seasonally adjusted), maintaining the lowest rate among the provinces for the 18th straight month, well below 6.8 per cent recorded nationally according to Statistics Canada.

"We continue to have the lowest unemployment rate in Canada thanks to employers creating more new jobs for Saskatchewan people, showing confidence in our diverse economy," Immigration, Jobs, Skills and Training Minister Jeremy Harrison said. "The increase in the number of jobs over last year is proof that Saskatchewan's economy remains strong."
