\$20 Million in Additional Funding for Children's Hospital of Saskatchewan

Families will benefit from 24 additional inpatient beds to be added to the Children's Hospital of Saskatchewan following an additional \$20 million investment by the Government of Saskatchewan.

"Ours is a growing province with increased need for children's and maternal health services," Health Minister Dustin Duncan said. "Increasing the number of beds will ensure that we can meet the needs of infants, children and mothers, now and into the future. We need to get the size of the facility right to reflect our province's growing population."

SASKJOBS WEBSITE TRAFFIC REACHED AN ALL-TIME HIGH FOR MARCH

Visits to SaskJobs.ca hit an all-time high for the month of March, reaching upwards of 1.2 million, an increase of 9.1 per cent year-over-year. The growing interest in Saskatchewan's go-to job website is a reflection of the province's strong labour market and growing economy.

Mobile devices and tablets accounted for 39 per cent of all visits, marking an almost 60 per cent increase in mobile use from one year ago.

Of the 15,644 jobs that were posted to the site in March, the most in-demand occupations were those in trades, transport and equipment operation at 31.6 per cent, and sales and service occupations at 33.2 per cent.

PREMIER WELCOMES POTASH SALE AND AGREEMENT WITH BANGLADESH

On April 23, Premier Brad Wall welcomed the addition of Bangladesh as a major new customer for Saskatchewan's world-leading potash resource.

The premier was in Saskatoon to witness the signing of a potash supply contract between the

Canadian Commercial Corporation and the Bangladesh Agricultural Development Corporation.

The contract is worth US\$40 million, with a US\$20 million option, and will see Canpotex Ltd. supply potash to Bangladesh through this first government-to-government sale arrangement between the two countries and corporations.

"This is an important deal for our potash industry and is significant on a number of levels," Wall said. "It provides Canpotex with new opportunities and access to a country that really needs our potash to boost its agricultural production and achieve its food security goals.
