HABITAT FOR HUMANITY BUILD IN PRINCE ALBERT



Trish and Paige had an incredible day on Tuesday along with Tami Wall and several other colleague's spouses at the Habitat for Humanity Women Build in Prince Albert. This is the first Women Build in Prince Albert. The home, when completed, will provide another Saskatchewan family the opportunity to realize their dream of home ownership.

Women Build is a Habitat for Humanity program that promotes women's leadership and participation in the construction industry, and provides concrete, practical opportunities for women to learn and practice trade skills under the direction of skilled tradespeople.

The women learned quickly how people in construction spend their day working so hard. The Habitat for Humanity Women's Build mobilizes volunteers and community partners in building affordable housing and promoting homeownership as a means to breaking the cycle of poverty.

PROVINCE'S FINANCES REMAIN ON TRACK DESPITE FLOODING COSTS

Finance Minister Ken Krawetz today said the provincial budget surplus remains intact, even with a \$150 million allowance for flood related costs. Krawetz released the First Quarter Financial Report today.

The projected surplus is \$75 million, up \$3.5 million from budget, despite the flood allowance, largely due to a projected increase in total revenue of \$169 million.

"The final cost of the flooding which devastated many Saskatchewan communities earlier this summer is still being determined," Krawetz said. "However, we are setting aside \$150 million for flood-related expenses."

Total revenue for 2014-15 is now forecast at \$14.242 billion including an increase of \$110 million from non-renewable resources and an increase of \$81 million from Government Business Enterprises, which are primarily Crown Corporations.

GOVERNMENT SUPPORTS PROVINCE-WIDE ACCESS TO ONLINE LEARNING RESOURCES

The Ministry of Education is providing support on behalf of PreK-12 schools for the Multitype Database Licensing Program (MDLP). This program helps libraries across the province to pool funds to jointly purchase licenses to electronic information resources, giving students, teachers and library patrons access to more than 18,000 online journals, newspapers, reference books and more.

"Quality online resources are key to a successful learning experience for students," Education Minister Don Morgan said. "Through this program, we are ensuring Saskatchewan students, regardless of their location, have access to a large variety of materials that individual organizations may not be able to fund on their own."

NEW BRIDGE PROJECTS DEVELOPMENT REVIEW APPROVED



This week, August 11, the Meewasin Valley, approved the design parameters of the North Commuter Parkway Project and Traffic Bridge that will form part of the Request for Proposals that will be issued later this year.


The decision follows a development review; it's a necessary step before construction projects occur in the Meewasin Valley Authority jurisdiction area along the South Saskatchewan River.

City Engineer Mike Gutek outlined for the MVA board the contract requirements and parameters for the replacement of the Traffic Bridge and the construction of the North Commuter Parkway Bridge in Saskatoon.

"Following extensive public consultation, City Council decided very specifically on the replacement of the Traffic Bridge which includes capacity for emergency vehicles as well as pedestrian and cyclist traffic on both sides," Gutek says.

SASKATCHEWAN OFFERS SECOND FREE FISHING WEEKEND AUGUST 23 AND 24

The weekend of August 23 and 24 marks the province's second free fishing weekend of the summer. Everyone – including visitors to the province – will be free to fish on those days without having to buy a licence.

Due to extreme rainfall and flooding in some areas of the province last month, boaters were advised to stay off some lakes for their own safety and to prevent disruption of flood mitigation efforts. As a result, people may not have had the opportunity to take advantage of the Free Fishing Weekend in July. However, everyone will have the chance to enjoy another free fishing weekend in Saskatchewan.

"Free fishing weekend is a good time to try your luck fishing in one of Saskatchewan's wonderful lakes and rivers, and to introduce new anglers to one of the province's most popular outdoor activities," Environment Minister Scott Moe said. "Sport fishing attracts more than 225,000 residents and visitors to our province, and generates more than \$300 million each year."

The Children's Hospital of Saskatchewan reached an important milestone with the demolition of the Cameco Skywalk at the Royal University Hospital site this week. This marks 90% of the work required to complete demolition of the portion of the parkade at RUH where the new hospital will be built. Over the next few weeks, crews will continue to excavate and prepare the site for the start of construction. Hospital construction is scheduled to begin mid-September.

PROVINCE AND HABITAT FOR HUMANITY HELP THREE SASKATOON FAMILIES

BECOME HOMEOWNERS

Three families in Saskatoon now have a place of their own to call home, thanks to a partnership between the Government of Saskatchewan and Habitat for Humanity. The province, through Saskatchewan Housing Corporation, provided \$150,000 to help construct the homes. Additional funding and support is provided by Conexus Credit Union, Mosaic Potash Corporation and the City of Saskatoon.

Central Services Minister Jennifer Campeau attended a key presentation today on behalf of Social Services Minister and Minister responsible for Saskatchewan Housing Corporation Donna Harpauer. Each of the three homes, located at the 602 Avenue G South tri-plex, are approximately 800 square feet or 74 square meters with developed basements.

"Our Government is committed to safe, quality and affordable housing for families as part of the Saskatchewan Growth Plan," Campeau said. "Habitat for Humanity and its partners deserve recognition for coming together to build stronger neighbourhoods and, most importantly, help families own a home they would not otherwise be able to. We are pleased that three more families will be able to begin a promising future."
