SASKTEL SECURES NAMING RIGHTS FOR SASKATOON'S PREMIER VENUE



On August 22, the City of Saskatoon, Saskatchewan Place Association and SaskTel, Saskatchewan's leading communications provider, announced the expansion of the long-standing partnership to include the naming rights for Saskatoon's Premier Sports, Trade and Entertainment facility (currently Credit Union Centre). Effective October 1, 2014, SaskTel has obtained the naming rights fro the venue for 10 years for \$350,000 per year and the venue will become known as SaskTel Centre.

CITY USES ALMOST 3,000 TONNES OF ASPHALT TO REPAIR 160,000 POTHOLES

The City of Saskatoon has completed pothole patching in 90% of neighbourhoods so far this summer. To date, more than 2,800 tonnes of asphalt has been used to repair potholes. This is the equivalent of approximately 160,000 repaired potholes, based on an average 12 x 4 inch hole.

"After a slower than expected start to the season due to weather, in particular above average June rainfall, pothole patching is progressing well and our streets are looking great," says Pat Hyde, Director of Public Works. "An increase in funding this year has allowed us to utilize private contractor crews and keep more civic crews working simultaneously, addressing potholes on the high traffic priority roads as well as on residential streets."

SASKATCHEWAN RENEWS SUPPORT FOR IMMIGRANT ACCESS FUND

The Government of Saskatchewan has renewed an agreement that assists recent immigrants in earning the necessary credentials to work and live in the province.

The Immigrant Access Fund of Saskatchewan, Inc. (IAF SK) is a non-profit organization providing character-based repayable micro-loans of up to \$10,000 to recent immigrants to the province. The proposed agreement signed between the provincial government and IAF SK will provide \$204,131 in operational funding to enable 58 microloans.

The microloans are for activities related to training, upgrading, licensing, certification, registration and/or memberships required for employment in their occupation in Saskatchewan.

"Immigration is an important part in meeting our population targets as outlined in the Saskatchewan Plan for Grow," Minister responsible for Immigration Jeremy Harrison said. "As our population continues to climb, we need to ensure new immigrants can use their education and training to be active contributors to our provincial economy."
