RFPS RELEASED FOR FINAL 20 RETAIL LIQUOR PERMITS



The application process for the final 20 retail liquor store permits begins today.

The communities are: Bienfait, Broadview, Canora, Davidson, Emerald Park/White City, Foam Lake, Gravelbourg, Gull Lake, Indian Head, Kamsack, Kipling, Lanigan, Leader, Maple Creek, Pilot Butte, Raymore, Shaunavon, Stoughton, Watson and Wynyard.

Successful proponents will be selected through a Request for Proposal (RFP) process. There is one opportunity available in each of the 20 communities.

"This is the fourth and final round of RFPs to be released as we transition to an expanded private liquor retail system in the province," Minister responsible for the Saskatchewan Liquor and Gaming Authority Don McMorris said. "As with the third round, successful proponents for these locations will have the option to operate an integrated or standalone retail operation."

PETER KEWIT INFRASTRUCTURE COMPANY SELECTED TO DESIGN AND BUILD MARTENSVILLE AND WARMAN OVERPASSES

I was pleased to join the Honourable Nancy Heppner, Minister of Highways and Infrastructure at the announcement last week to build two overpasses at Martensville and Warman.

Peter Kiewit Infrastructure Co. (PKIC) has been awarded a \$60.6 million contract to build two overpasses at Martensville (Highway 12) and Warman (Highway 11). PKIC, which had the greatest concentration of Saskatchewan partners in its bid, was one of three companies vying for the contract.

"The overpasses will improve safety in Warman and Martensville, two of the fastest-growing communities in Saskatchewan," Highways and Infrastructure Minister Nancy Heppner said. "I'm extremely pleased that Saskatchewan companies will be playing a major role in the design and construction of the new overpasses."

ROADS TO SASKATCHEWAN LAKES TO BE UPGRADED

Improvements include grading, paving, spot improvements, rut filling and bridge construction. Work also includes notching, widening, structural upgrades and paving on Highway 26, leading to Loon Lake, as seen in the photo.


NOMINATIONS OPEN FOR PREMIER'S SERVICE CLUB AWARD

NOMINATIONS NOW OPEN FOR THE PREMIER'S AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN THE PUBLIC SERVICE




Nominations will be open until August 31 for the 2016 Premier's Award for Excellence in the Public Service.

PROVINCE OFFERS ADVICE ON RECREATIONAL WATER USE



Saskatchewan officials are cautioning residents to limit recreational activities in the North Saskatchewan River, as a result of the spill from a Husky Energy pipeline near Maidstone.

People are advised not to consume fish caught in the river, and to avoid water activities that may result in river water being ingested.

Activities not recommended in the North Saskatchewan River are:

- Swimming
- · tubing, wakeboarding or skiing
- other forms of recreation where people come in direct contact with the water
- allowing pets or livestock in the water
- · eating fish from the river
