# Provincial Point of View August 30, 2016 Wishing students, teachers, professors and support staff a wonderful new school year!



I hope teachers, students and support staff have had a great summer and are looking forward to the beginning of another school year.

Whether summer was jam-packed with activities or filled with complaints about being bored with nothing to do, kids often have a tough time making the back-to-school transition. I hope you will find the following information helpful:

- As with any new or potentially unsettling situation like starting school for the first time
  or entering a new grade or new school allow kids time to adjust. Remind them that
  everyone feels a little nervous about the first day of school and that it will all become an
  everyday routine in no time.
- It's important to talk to kids about what worries them and offer reassurance: Are they
  afraid they won't make new friends or get along with their teachers? Is the thought of
  schoolwork stressing them out? Are they worried about the bully from last year?

- We all have a critical role to play in building and promoting respectful and kind behaviour
  in our schools and communities Acts of bullying, harassment, intimidation and violence
  have a profound effect on an individual's feeling of safety and self-worth. I encourage
  everyone to work together to prevent bullying in our schools, communities and online.
- To help ease back-to-school butterflies, try to transition kids into a consistent schoolnight routine a few weeks before school starts. Also make sure that they:
  - get enough sleep (establish a reasonable bedtime so that they'll be well-rested and ready to learn in the morning)
  - eat a healthy breakfast (they're more alert and do better in school if they eat a

good

breakfast every day)

- use a wall calendar or personal planner to record when assignments are due, tests will be given, extracurricular practices and rehearsals will be held, etc.
- have them organize and set out what they need the night before (homework and books should be put in their backpacks by the door and clothes should be laid out in their bedrooms)

#### HAVE YOUR SAY ON HEALTH SYSTEM RESTRUCTURING

Saskatchewan residents and interested organizations are invited to provide feedback to the recently-announced advisory panel examining the restructuring of Saskatchewan's health care system.

On August 18, the Minister of Health appointed a three person advisory panel to review the current Regional Health Authority (RHA) structure and provide advice on a system with fewer RHAs in Saskatchewan.

The panel will also look at services that could be delivered more efficiently and effectively on a provincial scale, examine RHA board governance and accountability, and identify ways to enhance measurement of health system performance.

"Our panel wants to support a robust and open dialogue with key partners and stakeholders throughout this process," panel member Dr. Dennis Kendel said. "The panel wants to ensure the patient is at the centre of a redefined system, which will be structured and governed to best

support and improve patient care."

#### \$3 MILLION GRADE RAISE PLANNED FOR HIGHWAY 3

A \$3 million grade raise project on Highway 3 west of Shellbrook will help reduce the risk of the road flooding for motorists travelling in the area. Road construction is targeted to begin next week and will see a 1.2 km stretch of this provincial highway raised by nearly one metre. Building this section of road higher than the adjacent slough will also reduce maintenance costs. Work is expected to be finished in early summer 2017.

"Whether it's forest fires or flooding, our government is committed to restoring services for people as quickly as possible and taking steps to help reduce the risks from these types of events to keep our transportation system moving and safe," Highways and Infrastructure Minister David Marit said.

Despite rain delays in some areas, Saskatchewan producers now have nine per cent of the 2016 crop combined, according to Saskatchewan Agriculture's Weekly Crop Report. This is slightly ahead of the five-year (2011-2015) average of eight per cent for this time of year. Twenty-one per cent of the crop is swathed or ready to straight-cut.

Regionally, producers in the southeast are the furthest advanced with 19 per cent of the crop in the bin. Twelve per cent of the crop is combined in the southwest, six per cent in the east-central region, four per cent in the west-central region and three per cent in both the northeast and the northwest.
