


MERRY CHRISTMAS!


THE SASKATOON MENORAH LIGHTING CELEBRATION TONIGHT, DECEMBER 22ND!



GoFUND ME CAMPAIGN LAUNCHED TO HELP RIDER GREAT, GEORGE REED

A Regina restaurant owner wants to help arguably the greatest player to ever wear a Saskatchewan Roughriders jersey.

Eric Johnson runs Smokin Okies BBQ in the city's east end. He has gotten to know George Reed quite well over the past few years with the Rider legend being a frequent visitor to his restaurant.

Johnson says he has started a <u>GoFundMe</u> campaign because the 80-year-old Reed is having mobility issues over the past few years and that helping out would greatly improve his quality of life.

"There are things he will need down the road to help deal with his mobility issues." Johnson said. "He needs a custom knee brace right now to help him get around. It's tough enough for him to get around now and with things like a knee brace, more physiotherapy and things around home to make it easier. He loves to go out to games, he loves to go out in public and whatever can be done to help him do that will be great." Johnson, who says he has spoken with Reed about doing this before going ahead with the move, feels Rider Nation will come through for number 34.

"I think so," Johnson said. "George has a lot of pride, but he has given so much to this community that I think people will be able to help him with what he and his family needs"

Reed spent 13 seasons with the Roughriders. He is their all-time leader in rushing yards and touchdowns having run for 16,116 yards and 134 touchdowns. He was inducted into the Canadian Football Hall of Fame in 1979.

Since moving back to Regina from Calgary, Reed has been seen at many events in the community and at Rider games. Last month, he was recognized by both the City of Regina and the Riders by having the street outside the stadium renamed to George Reed Way.

REPORT FROM THE LEGISLATURE



The holiday season is a time to celebrate and enjoy the company of family and friends. It's a season of generosity, a time of giving and a time to give thanks.

Looking back on 2019, there have been a lot of highlights at the provincial level, including our government's tabling of a balanced budget.

Despite harmful federal policies and economic headwinds, we were able to strike the right balance with careful spending and priority investments. This fulfilled our three-year fiscal plan and set Saskatchewan on a path to balanced budgets in the years ahead.

Major infrastructure projects such as Saskatchewan Hospital North Battleford, Jim Pattison Children's Hospital and the Regina Bypass were opened this year.

SASKATCHEWAN CONTINUES TO GROW



Saskatchewan's population grew by another 4,195 people in the third quarter of 2019, to an alltime high of 1,178,657 people.

This represents the 54th consecutive quarter of population growth in Saskatchewan.

"Saskatchewan continues to enjoy the longest and strongest period of sustained population growth since the 1920s," Trade and Export Development Minister Jeremy Harrison said. "Since our government took office in 2007, Saskatchewan has now grown by nearly 170,000 people."

Last month, Premier Scott Moe released the government's new Growth Plan to ensure the 2020s are another decade of strong growth for the province.

"Our new Growth Plan includes goals of 1.4 million people living in Saskatchewan and 100,000 more jobs in our province by 2030," Harrison said. "More people, jobs and opportunities means a better quality of life for everyone who calls Saskatchewan home."

REMINDER - PROTECT YOURSELF TO ENSURE SAFETY ON ICE THIS WINTER



With the arrival of colder temperatures, the Government of Saskatchewan reminds everyone to make sure that ice is safe and thick enough before walking or driving on it. Ice thickness depends on the particular waterbody and the local conditions. It does not freeze at a uniform thickness and ice strength can vary considerably from one area to another.

To be sure, check the ice thickness before you travel on it. As a guideline, you need at least 10 cm (four inches) of ice to walk on, 20 cm (eight inches) to drive a snowmobile or ATV on, 30 cm (12 inches) to drive a car or light truck on, and more than 30 cm (12 inches) to support a heavy truck.

Be aware that any activity on ice has risks. Guidelines are provided to help individuals make a decision about whether to venture on to the ice. Thickness is just one consideration when evaluating ice safety. Clear, hard ice is the only ice recommended for travel.

Also avoid ice that:

- looks slushy;
- has thawed, then frozen again;
- is near moving water;
- is layered, caused by sudden temperature changes; or
- has structures on it, such as pressure ridges.

In comparison to lake ice, river ice is often more hazardous and inconsistent, particularly

downstream of dams when winter releases are being made. The Water Security Agency is currently releasing water from Grant Devine Lake on Moose Mountain Creek and Reid Lake on Swift Current Creek. There is also flow throughout the Qu'Appelle and Saskatchewan river systems. These flows would impact the formation the ice covers and these areas should be avoided as conditions can change significantly over short distances.
