BRIDGING TO TOMORROW



It was exciting to be in attendance last Thursday at the construction launch of the North Commuter Parkway and Traffic Bridge!

The City of Saskatoon's largest-ever bridge-building program is underway. February 11, the City of Saskatoon, Government of Saskatchewan and Government of Canada marked the official launch of the North Commuter Parkway and new Traffic Bridge construction project.

"Investing in infrastructure is vital to creating middle class jobs today and sustained economic growth for years to come," Public Safety Minister Ralph Goodale said. "The progress of this project marks an important milestone for the City of Saskatoon, one that also further demonstrates the benefit of partnering with the private sector to deliver projects such as the North Commuter Parkway and new Traffic Bridge to help build resilient and inclusive communities in which Canadians desire to live, which is something this Government is committed to."

"Our government is pleased to invest \$50 million toward the North Commuter Parkway Bridge,"
Education Minister and Saskatoon Southeast MLA Don Morgan said on behalf of Government
Relations Minister Jim Reiter. "The City of Bridges" latest addition, the North Commuter Parkway,
will serve a valuable role in reducing commute times, while also increasing capacity for
Saskatoon's future growth."

"We're grateful for the continuing strong partnerships with the federal and provincial governments in helping to ensure the people of Saskatoon benefit from infrastructure investments," Saskatoon Mayor Donald Atchison said. "Both the Parkway and the new Traffic Bridge will shorten commute times, cut fuel costs, offer more transportation options for cyclists and pedestrians, and help grow the economy—all of which improve our quality of life."

SASKATCHEWAN PHYSICIAN NUMBERS CONTINUE TO RISE

Health Minister Dustin Duncan confirmed that the number of new physicians in Saskatchewan continues to rise, with nearly 650 more doctors practising in the province since 2007. This represents a 40 per cent increase in overall physician numbers compared to 2007.

"Our government was elected on the promise of training, recruiting, and retaining more doctors," Duncan said. "This announcement February 11 confirms, while there is still more work to do, that we have taken action on this important health care file."

NEW PILOT PROGRAM ALLOWS SASKATCHEWAN RESIDENTS TO VIEW THEIR PERSONAL HEALTH CARE INFORMATION ONLINE

eHealth Saskatchewan (eHealth) is piloting a new program that allows a group of residents from across the province to view their personal health information online through a secure website.

Health Minister Dustin Duncan announced the official launch of the Citizen Health Information Portal (CHIP) Pilot, which will include up to 1,000 participants. Throughout the six month trial period, participants will be able to view their personal lab results, immunization history, pharmacy and hospital visit history from anywhere in the world.

"Our government is excited to announce a new program that empowers the people of Saskatchewan to take a more active role in their own health care," Duncan said. "CHIP is the first comprehensive electronic system of its kind in Canada that puts patients first."
