SASKATCHEWAN PEOPLE SET ANOTHER ALL-TIME EMPLOYMENT RECORD





The June unemployment rate in Saskatchewan was 4.7 per cent (seasonally adjusted), down from 4.9 per cent in May (seasonally adjusted), and once again the lowest among all provinces,

according to numbers released by Statistics Canada. June marked an all-time high for employment as well as the 21st consecutive month that Saskatchewan had the lowest unemployment rate in Canada. Nationally, unemployment was 6.8 per cent in June.

"Maintaining the lowest unemployment rate is thanks to the hard work of Saskatchewan people and our strong, diversified economy that continues to create jobs," Minister of Immigration, Jobs, Skills and Training Jeremy Harrison said. "One of the initiatives that helps maintain the lowest rate is our government's investment in training for in-demand jobs. This helps employers fill their labour needs and helps Saskatchewan people get good jobs that they can turn into rewarding careers."


PROVINCE ANNOUNCES RELIEF FOR EVACUEES AND BUSINESSES

SASKATCHEWAN HOUSING CORPORATION ANNOUNCES RELIEF FOR TENANTS UNDER EVACUATION

The Saskatchewan Housing Corporation (SHC) is following in the footsteps of the utility Crown corporations and SGI by offering temporary relief to any of its tenants under evacuation due to fires burning in northern Saskatchewan.

If you live in a community under an evacuation order and rent a SHC-owned property from a local housing authority, you will receive a credit for the month of July towards your August rent. The same credit will be applied to September rents if your community's evacuation order extends into the month of August.

"Saskatchewan Housing Corporation has the responsibility to set an example in supporting tenants during this stressful time," Social Services Minister Donna Harpauer said. "We want to make the return home just a little bit easier once the evacuation orders are lifted. This is what we have done in the past with floods and other evacuations and we believe it is the right thing to do."
