Vehicles may have been damaged by previous crashes, flooding or other incidents and repairs made to the vehicle may only be cosmetic and the vehicle may not actually be road worthy.

INTERNATIONAL TRADE CENTRE INVESTMENT ANNOUNCED BY GOVERNMENTS OF CANADA AND SASKATCHEWAN
