
Happy Father's day to all dads, grandpas and "father figures" this weekend. There is no greater gift in life than being called "Dad".




## **CONGRATULATIONS SASKATCHEWAN RUSH!**

<u>#Trivia</u> You are turning right at a red light when traffic facing you has a left turn arrow. What should you do?

a) Go ahead and turn right, since you have the right-of-way.

b) Stop and wait until the light turns green to turn.

c) Stop and yield to traffic that has the right-of-way and any pedestrians. Then, turn when it's safe.

d) Go straight once the light is green. Turning right is too stressful.

The answer is C. At any red light, you MUST stop first and only go when it's safe. If there are two driving lanes, (and assuming everyone drives lawfully), after fully stopping and yielding to vehicles and pedestrians, you can turn into the first available driving lane, even at the same time as the oncoming vehicle is turning into THEIR first driving lane.

#### Call HealthLine (811)



### SASKATCHEWAN PROCLAIMS DEAFBLIND AWARENESS WEEK




The Government of Saskatchewan has proclaimed June 10-16, as Deafblind Awareness Week.

The average price per hectare in Saskatchewan is currently \$725, the highest when compared to public offerings held to date in Alberta and British Columbia.

The majority of the province received much-needed moisture this past week, helping to alleviate concerns about dry field conditions.

The amount of rain varied across the province, with some southwestern areas receiving very little, while many fields in the southeast are saturated and flooded. The Lampman area received 256 mm of rain. Fields and roads are flooded in many areas of the southeast and it will be some time before they are dry enough to be accessed. In contrast, the southwestern region remains very dry as it has received little rainfall over the past few months. There are concerns that crop and hay yields in the region will be affected if rain does not arrive soon.

### TRADE RULING AGAINST ALBERTA BEER MARK-UP LEVELS THE PLAYING FIELD FOR SASKATCHEWAN BREWERS




The Government of Saskatchewan is pleased with a recent decision by a trade panel regarding Saskatchewan and Canadian brewers.

The Government of Saskatchewan supported Artisan Ales, a Calgary-based beer importer, as an intervener in the original panel and appeal process.

"We are very pleased with the decision which confirms that Alberta's beer market distorting policies unfairly discriminate against Saskatchewan and Canadian brewers," Trade and Export Development Minister Jeremy Harrison said. "We call on the Government of Alberta to immediately comply with this ruling, as they have promised, ensuring that brewers from our province and the rest of Canada can compete fairly with Alberta-based brewers."

The panel, under the Agreement on Internal Trade, upheld a decision made in August 2017 which stated that the Government of Alberta's Small Brewers Development Program operated contrary to its free trade obligations.

#### ROAD WORK IN SOUTHEST SASKATCHEWAN KICKS INTO HIGH GEAR




More than \$29 million worth of construction work on more than 100 kilometres (km) of southeastern Saskatchewan highways is set to take place this week.
