EMPLOYMENT UP, UNEMPLOYMENT RATE DOWN IN SASKATCHEWAN

In May 2016, Saskatchewan's unemployment rate (seasonally adjusted) was 6.0 per cent, down from 6.3 per cent in the previous month. Saskatchewan's unemployment rate is now second lowest among the provinces and lower than the national unemployment rate of 6.9 per cent.

There were 577,800 people employed in Saskatchewan in May 2016, down 4,900 from May 2015. However, there were 2,200 more people working in Saskatchewan in May than in April (seasonally adjusted), suggesting that the employment market, which has been hit hard by the downturn in the resource sector, may be stabilizing.

"Resource sector challenges have hit Saskatchewan's labour market," Immigration, Jobs, Skills and Training Minister Jeremy Harrison said. "However, we are optimistic as forecasters predict our economy will begin to recover in the coming year. In last week's budget we made the choice to control spending, invest in people, and invest in infrastructure in order to keep Saskatchewan strong as our economy begins to recover from low resource prices."

GOVERNMENT INTRODUCES LEGISLATION TO IMPROVE SASKATCHEWAN AUTO INJURY COVERAGE

Coverage amendments introduced today will improve Saskatchewan's auto injury programs to better meet the needs of people who are injured in vehicle collisions. Minister responsible for Saskatchewan Government Insurance Don McMorris introduced the amendments to *The Automobile Accident Insurance Act* today in the Legislative Assembly.

"These amendments will provide better benefits for people who are injured, address inconsistencies and close gaps in coverage, and keep coverage affordable," McMorris said. "This will help improve the quality of life for people that have been seriously injured in a collision."

PREMIER WALL - PROMOTING ENERGY EAST IN TORONTO,
NEW BRUNSWICK AND QUEBEC



Wall Will Also Meet With Quebec Premier Philippe Couillard and New Brunswick Premier Brian Gallant to Discuss Energy Issues

Premier Brad Wall is in Toronto and Saint John this week to speak in support of Energy East, a proposed \$15.7 billion pipeline that will transport more than a million barrels of western Canadian oil a day to refineries in eastern Canada and a marine terminal in New Brunswick.

"For years, energy producers in Alberta and Saskatchewan have not received world prices because Canada lacks the pipeline capacity to get oil to tidewater," Wall said. "We've left billions of dollars on the table because we have just one export customer – the United States. Energy East will give our oil producers access to new markets, and can help reduce the need for Canada to import foreign oil. That's the message I want to impart this week."

Located at 3333 Centennial Drive in Saskatoon, this project will provide 10 units of affordable rental housing and support services for families with complex needs and 30 units of affordable housing to individuals and families for a total of 40 units.

"Our government is committed to making Saskatchewan grow and thrive," Campeau said. "Affordable and comfortable housing is an important part of that vision. We are proud to work with the Government of Canada, the City of Saskatoon and Westgate Heights Attainable

Housing to provide more housing for individuals and families in this community and improve their quality of life."

"Every family deserves a clean, safe place to call home and when a family has complex needs that home becomes even more important for stability and safety," Atchison said. "Forty families and individuals will soon have the security of knowing they have a place to call home as they build their lives. The partnerships with the governments of Canada and Saskatchewan and Westgate Heights Attainable Housing are a model for a successful city."



PATIENT CHOICE MEDICAL IMAGING ACT INTRODUCED TO ALLOW PRIVATE CLINICS

Health Minister Dustin Duncan introduced *The Patient Choice Medical Imaging Act*, which will give Saskatchewan residents the option to privately pay for a CT scan. This follows the launch of private-pay MRI services in February 2016.

"We made a commitment in the election campaign to expand private-pay diagnostics to CT scans," Duncan said. "With the introduction of this legislation, patients will soon have more choice in how they receive diagnostics, while at the same time increasing public capacity and reducing wait times to CT services."

NEW LEGISLATION PROVIDES PROVINCIAL REGULATION FOR SASKCENTRAL

The government passed new legislation to transition regulation of SaskCentral from the federal government to Saskatchewan.

The Credit Union Central of Saskatchewan Act, 2016 appoints the Credit Union Deposit Guarantee Corporation (CUDGC) as the supervisor of SaskCentral, and assigns responsibility for oversight of CUDGC to the Financial and Consumer Affairs Authority's Registrar of Credit Unions. Recent changes to federal legislation require the province to assume responsibility for SaskCentral from

the federal government by January 2017.

"The government is a strong supporter of credit unions and understands their importance to Saskatchewan's farmers, small businesses and rural communities," Justice Minister and Attorney General Gordon Wyant said. "The Credit Union Deposit Guarantee Corporation and SaskCentral both have extensive experience in regulating and supporting credit unions, and we are confident this new relationship will be beneficial to Saskatchewan's credit unions and their members."


