## SASKATCHEWAN'S POPULATION CONTINUES TO GROW



Saskatchewan continues to be one of the fastest growing provinces in Canada according to new population estimates released today by Statistics Canada.

As of April 1, 2015, there were 1,134,402 people living in Saskatchewan, an increase of 1,762 in the past quarter and an increase of 14,273 in the past year. Saskatchewan had the second highest growth rate among the provinces in the past year and the third highest in the past quarter.

"Even with the challenges of a lower oil price, Saskatchewan continues to grow at a faster pace than most other provinces," Immigration, Jobs, Skills and Training Minister Jeremy Harrison said. "Our diverse economy is a tremendous advantage and will help keep Saskatchewan strong."

Saskatchewan has now had population growth every quarter for the past nine years. That's the longest period of continuous growth since the late 1970s and early 1980s.

### GOVERNMENT PROVIDING \$9 MILLION FOR SASKATCHEWAN ADVANTAGE SCHOLARSHIPS

More than 12,500 students graduating from Grade 12 this spring are now eligible for the \$500 Saskatchewan Advantage Scholarship, to help reduce the cost of their post-secondary education. In 2015-16, the provincial government is committing \$9 million toward the scholarship, an increase of \$2.3 million from last year.


"This funding will make post-secondary education more affordable for students by directly reducing the cost of their tuition," Advanced Education Minister Scott Moe said. "The Saskatchewan Advantage Scholarship is an important investment in the students who will keep our province strong in the future."

The Saskatchewan Advantage Scholarship offers Grade 12 graduates \$500 per year to a lifetime maximum of \$2,000 to be applied to their tuition costs at a Saskatchewan post-secondary

institution. Students have up to 10 years after Grade 12 graduation to use the benefit.
