

# SASKATCHEWAN KEEPS GROWING TO MORE THAN 1,160,000 PEOPLE



Saskatchewan's population continues to increase, growing by 3,026 to 1,161,365 people in the first quarter of 2017.

Over the past year, Saskatchewan's population grew by 16,047 people – a growth rate of 1.4 per

cent. That's the third-highest rate of growth among the provinces, behind only Manitoba and Ontario.

Economy Minister Jeremy Harrison said the continued growth is a sign that the economy is gaining strength.

"Saskatchewan is experiencing its longest and largest sustained period of growth since the 1920s," Harrison said. "Ten years ago, we still had under a million people in Saskatchewan. Since 2007, we have grown by nearly 164,000 people. That's a decade of growth, and a huge change from the previous decade of decline, when Saskatchewan's population actually dropped by more than 20,000 people.

"Even after three years of low resource prices, our resilient and diverse economy continues to create new jobs and attract new people to Saskatchewan."

## OUR COMMITMENT TO EXCELLENCE: THE INVALUABLE VALUE OF THE PUBLIC SERVICE



As Minister Responsible for the Public Service Commission, it was a great pleasure to have the opportunity to meet and speak directly with the public service employees last week. I was pleased to recognize the efforts of 118 employees who have completed six policy workshops offered by the Johnson-Shoyama Graduate School of Public Policy.

**HIGHWAY 7 TWINNING CONTINUES** 



Work on Twinning Highway 7 from Delisle to Vanscoy is Currently Underway

This year crews will twin 10 kilometres of Highway 7 between Delisle and Vanscoy. Work will also include the realignment of rural municipality roads, two new railway crossings, the movement of 570,000 cubic metres of dirt and the installation of 51 new culverts. "We are pleased to see twinning work progressing on Highway 7 between Saskatoon and Delisle," Highways and Infrastructure Minister David Marit said. "The communities along this corridor are growing rapidly, which has contributed to a traffic increase from 5,000 to 9,100 vehicles per day in the last ten years. Twinning the highway in this area will enhance safety and improve traffic flow."

Newly twinned lanes between Saskatoon and Vanscoy were opened to traffic last fall.

CUTTING EDGE TECHNOLOGY FOR SASKATCHEWAN HEART PATIENTS



Patients too fragile for open-heart surgery can now get an aortic valve replaced in Saskatchewan. In the procedure, a cardiologist inserts a replacement valve into the heart via an artery in about half the time of an open-heart operation and without using general anesthetics.

Officially launched today, the Transcatheter Aortic Valve Implantation (TAVI) program provides support and treatment close to home for patients whose aortic valve no longer opens properly so blood can be pumped into the arteries. Life expectancy without a valve replacement is about two years.

The procedures are conducted at Regina General Hospital, with teams in Regina and Saskatoon providing support to patients before and after the procedure. Previously, patients had to travel to B.C. or Alberta for the procedure.

"Our government is pleased to provide \$700,000 in annual funding so patients who are not candidates for open-heart surgery are able to receive an alternative procedure here in Saskatchewan," Regina Pasqua MLA Muhammad Fiaz said on behalf of Health Minister Jim Reiter. "Making this available closer to home has a profound effect on both the length and the quality of patients' lives."

## SASKATCHEWAN HEALTH AUTHORITY BOARD OF DIRECTORS APPOINTED

Board to Help Guide Transition to a Single Provincial Health Authority

An important milestone has been reached in the transition to the new Saskatchewan Health Authority. Today, Health Minister Jim Reiter announced the creation of a Board of Directors to govern the new Saskatchewan Health Authority.

The board is composed of 10 members appointed for three-year terms. R.W. (Dick) Carter of Regina has been appointed as Board Chairperson.

"It is important to our government that the Board of Directors of the new Saskatchewan Health Authority be based on competency in order to effectively guide what will be the largest organization in the province," Reiter said. "This distinguished group of five women and five men come from a diverse range of professional backgrounds, including governance, accounting, medicine, law, education, and business. Their experience in these industries will play an integral role in guiding the transition to a single provincial health authority and achieving our goal of delivering high-quality health care for the entire province."

### STRONG WHOLESALE TRADE GROWTH




Wholesale trade in April 2017 increased by 13.0 per cent (seasonally adjusted) over April 2016—the second highest percentage growth among the provinces, and higher than the national average of 10.3 per cent.

"The sustained growth of Saskatchewan's wholesale trade highlights continued confidence in the province's economy," Economy Minister Jeremy Harrison said. "Our strong manufacturing and resource sectors are all contributing to this growth, attracting investments and new opportunities that are helping to move Saskatchewan forward."

SRC CELEBRATES 70 YEARS OF SUCCESS AND INNOVATION



This year, the Saskatchewan Research Council (SRC) is marking its 70th year in business.

In April 1947, the province established SRC with a mandate of undertaking projects that would help in the advancement of the province's industrial development. SRC began from humble beginnings as a granting agency with no permanent staff and a \$20,000 budget reviewed by a board. Since then, SRC has grown to become one of Canada's leading providers of applied research, development and demonstration, and technology commercialization with more than 350 employees, \$70 million in annual revenue and 1,500 clients in 20 countries around the world.

"SRC has been helping Saskatchewan industry solve its challenging problems for seven decades now," Minister Responsible for Innovation Jeremy Harrison said. "Through continuous improvement and innovation, SRC has been able to sustain its leading-edge technical status to deliver on Saskatchewan's industrial needs."

## From many peoples strength




