## SASKATCHEWAN LAUNCHES TECHNOLOGY INCUBATOR IN SASKATOON



Premier Brad Wall today announced the launch of Saskatchewan's first technology incubator in Saskatoon.

Located at Innovation Place, Co.Labs is designed to provide early-stage technology startups with the skills, mentorship and support required to build successful technology companies in the province. As part of the 2017-18 provincial budget, the government committed \$250,000 to support the operations of Co.Labs.

"Our government's goal is to have the most innovative and effective policies, tax tools and business

environment to support the innovation and technology sector and to further diversify our economy," Wall said. "Initiatives like the Saskatchewan Commercialization Innovation Incentive ("Patent Box") which is the first of its kind in North America, will help us reach this goal. As our province's first technology incubator, Co.Labs will support growth in the technology sector by helping prepare startups for future success and create jobs and opportunity for young people in Saskatchewan."

WE IN SASKATCHEWAN take a great deal of pride in our home province. Yes, we've got those famed wheat fields of the southern prairies — but there's also the lesser-known lakes and forests of the central and northern parklands. Saskatchewan's landscape is nothing if not diverse, complete with plunging chasms and soaring cliffs, shifting sand dunes, and the sharpness of the Canadian Shield. Below, you'll discover just a few of the amazing places you had no idea were hiding right here.

One of the best places in the province to wander in the woods is at Meadow Lake Provincial Park in northwestern Saskatchewan. Here, a series of shorter paths were recently joined to form a roughly 80-mile hiking trail known as The Boreal Trail.

You'll pass through forest filled with jack pines, white and black spruce, birch, and aspen that's home to animals including moose, wolves, bears, and squirrels. The trail also wanders through muskeg, wetlands, and river valleys; it crosses meadows filled with wildflowers and traverses a beaver dam. There are eight front-country and nine backcountry campsites along the route — some on high cliffs, others on sandy beaches. Thanks to the many convenient access points along the way, you can choose to hike only part of the trail or do the whole thing.

## NEW PROJECT AIMS TO EXTRACT RARE EARTH ELEMENTS FROM URANIUM TAILINGS

Article courtesy Alex MacPherson, Saskatoon Star Phoenix: New technology under development in Saskatoon could make it profitable for Saskatchewan-based mining companies to extract "significant" quantities of rare earth elements from uranium tailings solution that would otherwise go to waste.

The parallel processes being piloted by Saskatchewan Research Council (SRC), which started work on the project three years ago, involve concentrating the tailings solution and then using "cells" containing mixers to separate out each of the rare earth elements.

"It's good for our uranium companies and it's good for the province," said Bryan Shreiner, who heads SRC's minerals division. "And in terms of value for Canada and the rest of the world, rare earths are in demand."

### ROYAL SASKATCHEWAN MUSEUM AND PARTNERS TO HOST BIOBLITZ CANADA 150: REGINA



From 7 p.m. on June 9, to 7 p.m. on June 10, the Canadian Wildlife Federation (CWF) and Royal Saskatchewan Museum (RSM) present BioBlitz Canada 150: Regina. BioBlitz Canada 150: Regina is centred on the 23-acre Habitat Conservation Area of Wascana Park. Scientists, students, naturalists and the general public will work together in an attempt to record all species in the area over a 24-hour period. The public can join wildlife experts in guided surveys of birds, plants, insects, aquatic invertebrates and fish in the park.BioBlitz Canada 150: Regina is one of the 38 Canada 150 Signature

Projects and is led by CWF. BioBlitz events will take place all across Canada; they will include five flagship events in urban areas, 20 community events and 10 science-intense blitzes. BioBlitz Canada 150: Regina is the only flagship bioblitz hosted in the prairie provinces.

"This event will provide a great opportunity for Saskatchewan people to connect with nature and interact with wildlife, gaining a deeper appreciation for nature and our natural spaces," Parks, Culture and Sport Minister Ken Cheveldayoff said. "I applaud the RSM and their partner organizations for the months of preparation they have done to represent the City of Regina, the Province of Saskatchewan and the entire prairie region in the BioBlitz Canada 150 project."



Sohi, Minister of Infrastructure and Communities and Government Relations Minister Donna Harpauer, announced funding for 75 new water and wastewater projects throughout Saskatchewan. This investment represents combined federal, provincial and local partner funding of more than \$94 million for 74 Clean Water and Wastewater Fund (CWWF) projects, and one project under the Provincial-Territorial Infrastructure Component – National and Regional Projects.

The funding will support such initiatives as building new sewage treatment lagoons, upgrading sewage pumps, and improving drinking water supply systems. This work will improve the reliability of water and wastewater services, while also allowing for future growth and development in communities across Saskatchewan.
