PREMIER HEADED TO IOWA TO PROMOTE IMPORTANCE OF CANADA-U.S.TRADE



Premier Brad Wall is travelling to lowa this week to promote the critical importance of Canada's and Saskatchewan's trade relationship with the United States.

Wall will visit Des Moines, the state capital, on Wednesday March 15 to take part in a "Canada Day at the Capitol" program organized by the Consulate General of Canada in Minneapolis.

The trip comes as a result of discussions with Prime Minister Trudeau. Wall offered Saskatchewan's assistance in engaging with the United States at the national and state level.

The Prime Minister asked the Premier to represent Canada in Iowa, along with Andrew Leslie, Parliamentary Secretary to the federal Minister of Foreign Affairs (Canada-U.S. Relations).

"Canada and the United States have forged one the most successful economic partnerships the world has ever seen," Wall said. "Millions of families on both sides of the borders benefit from trade. Now, more than ever, we need to actively promote the advantages of trade and point out the dangers of protectionism. We must be vigilant in protecting our shared prosperity."

In February 2017, 8,000 jobs were created in Saskatchewan (up 1.4 per cent, the highest growth rate in the country).

"This along with recent reports on retail sales growth, manufacturing sales growth and wholesale trade growth show the continued strength and resilience of Saskatchewan's economy."

MORE THAN 750 ADDITIONAL PHYSICIANS PRACTICING IN SASKATCHEWAN SINCE 2007




Saskatchewan residents continue to benefit from better access to physicians with the addition of more than 750 new doctors over the past 10 years. This represents a 44 per cent increase in overall physician numbers compared to 2007, and includes a 53 per cent increase in specialists and a 37 per cent increase in general practitioners.

"Our government has shown unwavering commitment to recruit and retain physicians in Saskatchewan," Health Minister Jim Reiter said. "Physicians play a vital role in Saskatchewan's health care system, both in serving patients and in providing leadership as we transform the way we deliver health care. I'm pleased with the tremendous progress we've made in increasing the number of physicians in Saskatchewan."

FIREFIGHTERS EQUIPPED WITH FENTANYL ANTIDOTE: NALOXONE KITS NOW ON TRUCKS



Fentanyl and opioid overdose continue to be described as a national health and addictions crisis which Saskatoon is not immune to; in light of this, the Saskatoon Fire Department is taking a proactive step to protect life.

"According to provincial health statistics, overdose deaths have risen dramatically for the past six years," says Assistant Chief Rob Hogan. "This is the stark reality of our job; we want first responders to have every ability to treat patients in dire need, and so our Primary Care Paramedics are now equipped with Naloxone."

Naloxone (nuh-LOCKS'-own) is a drug used to counteract the effects of a fentanyl (FEN'-tuh-nil) or other opioid drug overdose.

As noted, the number of deaths from the illicit use of fentanyl and carfentanil (CAR'-fen-tuh-nil) has risen dramatically in the province and across Canada.

"These drugs are extremely powerful and deadly," Hogan says. "Fentanyl is up to a hundred times more toxic than morphine, and carfentanil is 100 times stronger than fentanyl."

12 SASKATCHEWAN-BASED COMPANIES SELECTED TO PROVIDE CLEANING SERVICES IN GOVERNMENT BUILDINGS



Move is Anticipated to Save \$3.5 Million Annually

The Government of Saskatchewan will save \$3.5 million annually by contracting 12 Saskatchewan-based suppliers to clean government-owned buildings. Six of the 12 successful firms set to receive contracts are employee-owned companies. All companies have agreed to hire existing government cleaning employees.

More than 1,000 bids from 65 companies were received on the 95 buildings offered to suppliers through a Request for Services process that closed February 10, 2017. The Ministry of Central Services has thoroughly analyzed and scored the submissions over the last several weeks. The evaluation process is being monitored by an independent fairness advisor from Meyers Norris Penny.

"The successful submissions have demonstrated the ministry can save \$3.5 million annually, helping the province save money during the current challenging fiscal times," Central Services Minister Christine Tell said. "Equally important is that half of the successful companies are employee-owned and all companies have committed to hiring current employees.

"We understand there are employees affected by this decision. The Ministry of Central Services is committed to working with these employees and their union, within the terms of their collective bargaining agreement."

The ministry next will negotiate contracts and anticipates the firms will start cleaning governmentowned buildings by July 1, 2017.

DID YOU KNOW?

- All twelve firms have committed to hiring existing employees
- Weighting was given to firms who indicated in their submission that they would consider hiring current Government cleaning employees
- Additional weighting was given to employee bids, meaning employees could join together, or individually, and submit a bid for certain locations
