Premier Brad Wall, "This year's budget outlines our government's 3-year plan to return to balance while making our economy stronger.

We are meeting the challenge of prolonged low resource revenues by controlling and reducing government spending.

We are also shifting taxes toward consumption, like the PST, but away from income and business taxes to make them the lowest or near lowest in Canada. This ensures our investment climate remains competitive while reducing our reliance on resource revenues.

I understand many of the changes announced today are difficult. But we must ensure that our core government services like health care, education, and social services are affordable and sustainable for the long term.

Other governments have decided to delay tough choices by simply running deficits indefinitely. History has shown that leads to even tougher choices later. We will not do that.

Together, we can and will meet this challenge. We will return the budget to balance while ensuring Saskatchewan's economy maintains its strong leadership position in Canada."



Municipal Revenue Sharing

Now more than DOUBLE from 10 years ago



When we took office in 2007, Regina was receiving \$15.7 million in revenue sharing from the provincial government. Now they receive \$40.5 million dollars. Saskatoon received \$17.8 million, and they now receive \$46 million. Both have received an increase of well over 150%.

In this year's budget, the province's resource revenues ...are down \$1.2 billion. We're asking municipalities to share in only about 3% of that decreased revenue - 1% from Regina, 1% from Saskatoon, and 1% from the rest of the province.

And we know they can afford to help WITHOUT raising local taxes because they each have large reserve funds built up over the years, in part due to large revenue sharing increases from the provincial government. According to their most recent annual reports, Saskatoon has \$141 million in reserve funds and Regina has \$236 million in reserve funds.


SASKATCHEWAN SPORTS AWARDS HELD AT TCU PLACE

It was a pleasure to have the opportunity as Minister of Parks, Culture and Sport to attend and present the 2016 Saskatchewan Sport Awards last Friday in Saskatoon. The evening was a fantastic celebration of individuals who have made a positive contribution to sport in our province. We are proud of every Saskatchewan athlete, coach, official and volunteer nominated. Congratulation to all award recipients.

Sask Sport Incorporated is an important organization and trusted government partner. By promoting and supporting sport throughout Saskatchewan, Sask Sport helps create a vibrant quality of life for the people in our province.



Even with the expansion of the PST this year, every Saskatchewan taxpayer at every level of income is still paying far less in taxes than in 2007. That's because in 2008, our government introduced the largest personal tax cuts in Saskatchewan history.

This year, a family of 4 with \$75,000 of income pays \$1,886 or 31% less in tax than in 2007. Another family of 4 with \$50,000 income... pays \$2,366 or 77% less tax than under the previous government. And in this budget, we are lowering income taxes again by a half point in each bracket this year and by another half point in 2019.

This is a shift toward more stable sources of revenue for core public services while still ensuring a much lower tax burden on Saskatchewan people than before we came to office.

CAMPSITE RESERVATIONS BEGIN APRIL 4



The Ministry of Parks, Culture and Sport will be launching its provincial park campsite reservation system for the 2017 summer season on Tuesday, April 4. The launch will be staggered, with different parks opening for reservations over a 10 day period.

During the launch period, a queuing system will be implemented, as it has been in the last two years, to help manage the demand and ensure technical stability.

This year, Saskatchewan's provincial parks will be celebrating Canada's 150th anniversary. On Canada Day (Saturday, July 1) and Canada's Parks Day (Saturday, July 15), entry to all Saskatchewan provincial parks will be free. In addition to these free entry days, there will special events throughout the provincial park system, including a province-wide geocaching program and a scavenger hunt to "Picture Yourself" in a Saskatchewan provincial park.

CITY OF SASKATOON WILL GET \$46 MILLION THIS YEAR IN REVENUE SHARING!



Premier Brad Wall, "Saskatoon City Council this year voted to add 50 additional employees to the payroll and put away another \$5 million in their reserve fund.

On top of that, Saskatoon will get \$46 million this year in revenue sharing from the provincial government, which is 2.5 TIMES more than the \$18 million the previous government gave them in 2007.

We think it is fair they use some of their reserves or perhaps reconsider spending decisions, rather than a court injunction or an increase in local taxes."

MORE NEW INVESTMENT IN SASKATOON!



Premier Brad Wall, "Saskatchewan's diversified economy continues to attract new investment with 185 construction jobs and 555 permanent jobs announced in the last week alone.

This highlights the importance of maintaining the Saskatchewan Advantage with the budget: a positive investment climate that encourages job creation across our province

I was pleased to join several colleagues last week at the Brandt Expansion. Read the article that appeared in the Saskatoon Star Phoenix: Saskatchewan's largest private company has acquired the former Mitsubishi Hitachi Power Systems Canada Ltd. plant in Saskatoon's north end, and plans to transform the sprawling facility into a wind turbine factory employing approximately 500 people.

Brandt Group of Companies bought the 210,00-square-foot complex from its U.S.-based owners for an undisclosed price, and expects it will help expand its revenue to \$5 billion from the current \$1.7 billion by

2025, according to its president.

"We have customers that are installing wind turbines all across the country ... We think it is something that is the future of alternative power," Shaun Semple said of the Regina-based groups's decision to enter the renewable power business.

Semple said the plant — which is expected to be operational "within weeks" and increase slowly — will help utilities like SaskPower, which has pledged to expand its reliance on renewable power to 50 per cent, from around 25 per cent, by 2030.

NEW ER WAIT TIMES FUNDING WILL EXPAND ACCOUNTABLE CARE TEAMS



Health Minister Jim Reiter announced March 28 that a portion of new funding to improve emergency department wait times will be used to expand the innovative Accountable Care model of inpatient care. A new investment of \$12 million to improve emergency department wait times was announced in last week's budget.

"This innovative, team-based model of inpatient care that was successfully introduced here at the Pasqua Hospital will now spread to other hospital wards in Regina and Saskatoon," Reiter said. "This

approach improves safety and helps patients leave hospitals sooner and with less chance of a return visit."

Patients in the Pasqua's Accountable Care ward have been able to return home 15 per cent sooner thanks to improved communications among health care teams. The unit also reports reduced mortality, and significant improvements in patient and staff satisfaction.

SASKATCHEWAN'S POPULATION CONTINUES TO GROW

Saskatchewan's population continues to grow, up by 2,946 people in the last quarter of 2016 and up by 17,217 in 2016. There were 1,158,339 people living in Saskatchewan as of January 1, 2017, according to the latest population estimates released today by Statistics Canada.

Both the quarterly and annual population gains were the third highest among Canadian provinces.

"The growing population shows that despite the budget challenges we are addressing, Saskatchewan's economy remains strong and resilient," Premier Brad Wall said. "Last month, Saskatchewan led the country in job growth, so I expect the population to keep growing as new opportunities attract new people to our province."

Over the past decade (January 1, 2007 to January 1, 2017), Saskatchewan's population grew by more than 163,000 people – the biggest increase in any 10-year period since 1921 to 1931. That's a sharp contrast to the previous decade (January 1, 1997 to January 1, 2007) when Saskatchewan's population actually dropped by more than 23,000 people.


