MORE CODING AND ROBOTICS COMING TO SASKATCHEWAN CLASSROOMS



Saskatoon University MLA Eric Olauson on behalf of Deputy Premier and Education Minister Gordon Wyant announced today new coding and robotics opportunities for middle years and high school students in Saskatchewan, which will ensure classrooms are meeting the needs of 21st century students. In response to requests from the education and tech sector stakeholders, robotics curricula that incorporates coding will be developed in the area of provincial Practical and Applied Arts. These elective courses will be available to all Saskatchewan high schools, while middle years (Grades 7-9) teachers can also introduce students to coding and robotics.

"Our government is following through on our commitment to develop Saskatchewan students' computer coding skills that will help prepare them for emerging careers in science, mathematics, engineering and technology," Wyant said. "Today's announcement will build upon local successes we have seen across the province in coding and robotics education."

CHANGES TO FEES AND CHARGES IN 2018-19

Certain fees and charges paid by Saskatchewan residents and businesses will change in 2018-19 to better reflect the cost of related provincial services.

The changes will add about \$17.7 million to the General Revenue Fund (GRF) in 2018-19, and about \$784,000 in revenue to non-GRF agencies and funds (Water Security Agency, Commercial Revolving Fund, and Financial and Consumer Affairs Authority).

PROTECT YOUR ELM TREES: DON'T PRUNE FROM APRIL 1 TO AUGUST 31



Dutch elm disease (DED) is caused by a fungus spread by tiny elm bark beetles that breed under the bark of dead or dying elm wood. If that wood contains the DED fungus, each new generation of beetles can infect healthy elms.

You can help prevent DED:

- Keep your own elm trees healthy;
- Don't prune elm trees from April 1 to August 31;
- If you see signs of DED, report them to your municipal authority;
- Don't buy, sell, store, transport or use elm firewood; it's illegal;
- Remove and dispose of the tree promptly if DED is confirmed; and
- Support DED management in your community.

PROVIDING \$11 MILLION FOR THE SASKATCHEWAN ADVANTAGE SCHOLARSHIP



So far this year, nearly 21,500 students have received the Saskatchewan Advantage Scholarship, totalling \$11 million from the Government of Saskatchewan.

The Saskatchewan Advantage Scholarship reduces tuition for students entering post-secondary programs in Saskatchewan. It provides \$500 per year to a lifetime maximum of \$2,000 to all Grade 12 graduates since 2012.

McORMOND-COLLEGE INTERCHANGE ON TRACK FOR OCTOBER COMPLETION

A key interchange on Saskatoon's east side looks like it will hit its Halloween deadline, a city official says. A 250-tonne crane will be at the site of the McOrmond Drive and College Drive interchange starting Monday to lift 56 girders into place to support the bridge deck, reporters were told Thursday.

Bryan Zerebeski, the City of Saskatoon's project manager, said the contractor has taken steps to address a construction timeline that was deemed to be behind schedule last fall.

"There's weather problems that could happen in 2018, but we're happy with the plan they put together to get it back on schedule for 2018," Zerebeski told reporters at city hall.

PCL Construction Management Inc. is building the McOrmond-College interchange along with an interchange at Boychuk Drive and Highway 16. The Boychuk interchange is scheduled for completion in July of 2019.

MORE FINANCIAL LITERACY COMING TO SASKATCHEWAN CLASSROOMS



Deputy Premier and Education Minister Gordon Wyant announced today that writing is set to begin in April for new financial literacy courses. These courses will soon be available to help ensure Saskatchewan students are prepared for a successful future.

In response to requests from the education sector and industry stakeholders, including the Saskatchewan School Boards Association and the Saskatchewan Chamber of Commerce, new financial literacy curricula are being developed for Grade 11 and 12 students. Grades 7 - 9 teachers will also be able to introduce their students to financial literacy topics by using modules from these curricula in middle level Practical and Applied Arts courses.

"The ability to manage personal finances is an essential skill in our daily lives," Wyant said. "We want our students to be prepared for their futures, and that's why it's so important to engage students in financial literacy."

SASKATCHEWAN FORESTRY SECTOR EXCEEDS \$1 BILLION IN SALES FOR 2017



Saskatchewan's forestry industry is emerging as one of the province's strongest growth sectors, generating sales of nearly \$1.2 billion in 2017—a 21 per cent increase over the previous year, with the highest value of forestry product sales in over a decade.

Prices for all forest products were very strong in 2017, reaching their highest levels since 2005. Prices are forecast to remain high over the next several years, largely due to strong demand from major export markets.

DO NOT TAKE PHONE CALLS FROM TRADE 12



Released on March 28, 2018The Financial and Consumer Affairs Authority of Saskatchewan (FCAA) has issued a Temporary Cease Trade Order against Trade12, Global Fin Services Limited, and Exo Capital Markets Limited for running an unregistered online platform that allows people to trade binary options (www.fcaa.gov.sk.ca/binaryoptions), contracts for difference, and FOREX (www.fcaa.gov.sk.ca/investmentfraud).

Trade12 has contacted residents of Saskatchewan by phone asking people to open accounts to facilitate trading. Personal identification is required to open an account.

"People should never give personal information or send money to businesses they do not know," FCAA Deputy Director of Enforcement Ed Rodonets said. "Before you conduct any business with a company make sure they are allowed to trade securities in Saskatchewan. You can check the registration status of any person or company selling investments by using the Canadian Securities Administrators' National Registration Search database at www.aretheyregistered.ca."
