NEWS FROM THE LEGISLATURE - BUDGET DAY, MARCH 19



Monday, March 3 marked the opening day of the Spring sitting of the Saskatchewan Legislature. Our government's top priority is the backlog of grain transportation. During the first week of the Spring sitting, with unanimous support, our government passed a motion supporting emergency legislation from Ottawa to mandate service agreements between railways and grain companies.

You will see in this edition of Provincial Point of View, a news release announcing humanitarian assistance to Ukraine. Many of us in this province, including the 130,000 who trace their heritage back to Ukraine, continue to watch news reports about political upheaval, violent and brutal acts that have claimed the lives of protesters. Many others, envisioning a brighter future, have been injured.

Our government also put forward and passed a motion expressing our support of Ukraine and its people, offering condolences to those who have been hurt and to the families of those killed. We look forward to continuing our work with Ukrainian community organizations and the federal government in order to provide long-term support to the people of Ukraine. SASKATCHEWAN ANNOUNCES HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE FOR THE PEOPLE OF UKRAINE

Deputy Premier Ken Krawetz announced that Saskatchewan will provide \$60,000 for humanitarian assistance for the people of Ukraine.

"Ми разом з народом України - We stand together with the people of Ukraine," Krawetz said. "This humanitarian assistance was brought about through the coordinated efforts with the Ukrainian-Canadian community, the Ukrainian Canadian Congress and the Saskatchewan-Ukraine Relations Advisory Committee."

The decision to donate the funds to the Ukraine Assistance account, managed by charities such as Ukrainian Canadian Social Services of Canada, was made following a special meeting of the Saskatchewan-Ukraine Relations Advisory Committee (SURAC) in Saskatoon on February 27, 2014. SURAC reported its findings regarding action on Ukraine back to Deputy Premier Krawetz in a letter dated March 3, 2014. Donations are being accepted by the New Community Credit Union in Saskatoon.

"I recognize the hard work that the Ukrainian-Canadian community and the Ukrainian Canadian Congress are doing in helping Ukraine on the path to prosperity, freedom and democracy," Krawetz said. "We look forward to continuing our work with Ukrainian community organizations and the federal government in order to provide long-term support to the people of Ukraine."

PREMIER TO PROMOTE PROVINCE'S CARBON CAPTURE LEADERSHIP IN WASHINGTON

Premier Brad Wall was off to Washington, D.C., March 4 to shine a spotlight on Saskatchewan's leading-edge work to reduce greenhouse gas emissions through carbon capture and storage (CCS) technology.

During the March 4-7 mission, the Premier will speak on Saskatchewan's internationally recognized leadership in CCS as a featured panelist at a coal technology symposium of U.S. legislators and energy experts Wednesday on Capitol Hill.

Wall will outline the CCS research that has taken place in Saskatchewan over the past 30 years, and showcase SaskPower's Boundary Dam 3, the world's first commercially viable project to capture carbon dioxide from a coal-combustion power plant.

"Coal is not going away as a major energy source, either here in Saskatchewan or in the United States," Wall said. "Boundary Dam 3 is opening in mid-2014. It will be a game changer, showing the world how we can all continue to use our coal resources, while addressing the challenges of greenhouse gas emissions and helping industry leave a greener and smaller environmental impact."

The Premier will meet with a number of Democratic and Republican U.S. Senators, Congressmen and members of the U.S. administration during his time in Washington. In addition to promoting CCS technology, he will advocate for approval of the Keystone XL pipeline and highlight the negative impact of country-of-origin labelling (COOL) legislation recently passed in the United States.

"These meetings are another opportunity to point out that in addition to the obvious economic benefits of the Keystone pipeline, that Canada's public and private sector have been investing more than any other of our competitor energy nations to make energy development more sustainable," Wall said.

Wall said it is imperative that American legislators understand these issues have far-reaching

implications for today and into the future and that the most effective way to reduce their potential impact is through consultation and co-operation.

SASKATOON'S POPULATION TOPS 250,000 MARK

Based on information released by Statistics Canada in late February, the City of Saskatoon's Planning and Development Division has calculated that Saskatoon's population has topped 250,000 people.

By using Statistics Canada's 248,293 population figures for the City of Saskatoon on July 1, 2013, and applying their suggested 3 percent annual growth rate, City Planners estimate that the city's population has reached approximately 253,000 people as of March 1, 2014.

"This is an exciting milestone for Saskatoon. Based on the information from Statistics Canada, we have increased by a rate of 40.4 per thousand, which hasn't been achieved by any other census metropolitan in more than 15 years," Planning and Development Director Alan Wallace says.
