STRONG JOB GROWTH IN SASKATCHEWAN COMPARED TO THE REST OF CANADA



Saskatchewan posted strong employment growth numbers in November, especially when compared to the rest of the country.

Employment in Saskatchewan was up 7,200 or 1.3 per cent year-over-year - the second-best growth rate in the country and nearly double the national growth rate of 0.7 per cent. Saskatchewan also has the lowest unemployment rate in the country at 5.5 per cent.

"Saskatchewan's diversified economy continues to create new jobs despite the challenges in our energy sector," Economy Minister Jeremy Harrison said. "That's a big change from a few years ago when a downturn in one part of the economy would lead to job losses in every part of the economy."

PREMIER MARKS SASKATCHEWAN'S FIRST URANIUM SHIPMENT TO INDIA



The Canada-India Nuclear Cooperation Agreement, out of which the contract proceeds, came into force in September 2013, allowing Canadian companies to export nuclear products for peaceful uses to India.

"Strong support from the Governments of Saskatchewan and Canada was instrumental in gaining timely access to the Indian market for our products," Cameco Corporation President and CEO Tim Gitzel said. "The renewal of nuclear co-operation and trade between Canada and India will create jobs and opportunity in Canada and help advance the growth of clean nuclear power in a country where more than 300 million people have no access to electricity."

The Premier promoted Saskatchewan's uranium resources during his two government trade missions to India in March 2011 and November 2014. During the first mission, he met with Modi, then the chief minister of the Indian state of Gujarat.

YOUNG JOB SEEKERS REMINDED TO TAKE READINESS COURSE THIS HOLIDAY SEASON

With the approach of the holiday season, employers and young workers are reminded that 14and 15-year-olds must take the Young Worker Readiness Certificate Course (YWRCC) before they start working.

They must successfully complete the course to obtain a certificate and provide it to their employer along with a letter of parental consent. Employers must keep both documents on file.

ARE YOU GOING TO BE AWAY FROM HOME ON ELECTION DAY APRIL 4, 2016? - VOTE BY MAIL (ABSENTEE VOTER) APPLICATION IS NOW AVAILABLE

If you're going to be away from your Saskatchewan home on Election Day, April 4, 2016 you can vote by mail. Contact Elections Saskatchewan by clicking here (www.elections.sk.ca/voters/ways-to-vote/ or call Elections Saskatchewan at 1.877.958.8683.

Vote by mail

If you are away from your constituency during the election, or if it's more convenient, you can vote by mail. This is a good option for students out of province, snowbirds spending the winter down south, members of the Canadian Armed Forces, or anyone else not in Saskatchewan or your constituency on April 4, 2016. Inmates in a provincial correctional centre may also be eligible to vote as an absentee voter.

To vote by mail, you first apply for an absentee ballot. It's important to not wait too long to start this process. You need to allow enough time to:

- 1. <u>download an application from our website, available here ; download the French application</u>
 here ;
- 2. fill it in (you can print it and fill it in by hand, or you can fill it in electronically) and send it back to us along with a copy of your ID and a signed declaration;
- 3. wait for a voting kit to arrive to you by mail shortly after the writ drops in early March 2016; and
- 4. mark your ballot and mail it back to us, postmarked by 8 p.m. on April 4, 2016.
