NEW EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT WAITS TARGET ANNOUNCED

The provincial government has affirmed its commitment to significantly reduce wait times in hospital emergency departments, establishing a new target of a 60 per cent reduction in wait times by 2019.

"The new target is aggressive and will make Saskatchewan a leader in meeting national guidelines for safe, appropriate and timely care in hospitals and emergency departments," Health Minister Dustin Duncan said. "The issues that affect emergency department waits are complex and this effort will involve co-ordination across the health system. I am confident we will be able to achieve this new, ambitious target."

MOBILE APP AND WEBSITE LAUNCHED TO PREVENT VIOLENCE AND ABUSE AGAINST CHILDREN AND YOUTH

EGADZ (Saskatoon Downtown Youth Centre) unveiled its Cyber Outreach initiative "I Am Not for Sale", as a means of addressing violence and abuse against women and youth. A new website, www.lAmNot4Sale.ca, and app were developed by youth to help vulnerable individuals who are sexually exploited and trafficked through social media.

The free app provides immediate access to 24 hour resources with confidential, appropriate supports that offer safe and positive solutions and, when necessary, access to an immediate community agency response.

"For people experiencing violence and abuse, it can be daunting to reach out for help without fear of repercussions," Social Services Minister and Minister responsible for the Status of Women Donna Harpauer said. "This website and app will allow those who reach out for help to be anonymous as they access supports and services. Our government is proud to partner with EGADZ and other organizations to help prevent sexual exploitation and violence against vulnerable women and youth."

NEW GROUP HOME OPENS IN SASKATOON

Four people with intellectual disabilities will have a new place to call home thanks to today's official opening of a LutherCare Communities group home in Saskatoon.

The Government of Saskatchewan contributed \$250,000 toward the construction of the project, while LutherCare Communities contributed the cost of the land, an in-kind contribution totalling \$195,000.

"Our investment means that one person from Saskatoon and three individuals from Valley View Centre in Moose Jaw will have a new place to call home," Saskatoon Sutherland MLA Paul Merriman said on behalf of Social Services Minister Donna Harpauer. "The promise of a better life for people with intellectual and physical disabilities is the reason we partner with great organizations like LutherCare Communities, and we are excited to see this happening again at this new home."

HOMEOWNERSHIP DREAM COMES TRUE FOR FOUR SASKATOON FAMILIES

Four local Habitat for Humanity (Habitat) partner families received keys to their new homes at a special ceremony held November 27. Habitat and Prairie Spirit School Division partnered together to engage and train students from Walter W. Brown School in Langham in various construction trades. The four homes were built in Langham and moved to the Saskatoon site at 119 Avenue S South, where each home was finished.

The Government of Saskatchewan, through Saskatchewan Housing Corporation, contributed a total of \$200,000 (\$50,000 for each home) in financial assistance to support the project. Additional funding was provided by the City of Saskatoon and Mosaic Potash Corporation.

"These four homes demonstrate what can be achieved when we work together as a team," Saskatoon Greystone MLA Rob Norris said on behalf of Social Services Minister and Minister responsible for Saskatchewan Housing Corporation Donna Harpauer. "Initiatives like Habitat for Humanity support the Saskatchewan Plan for Growth and our commitment to providing safe and affordable housing to those who need it."

GOVERNMENT REMINDS RINKS TO APPLY FOR THE 2015 COMMUNITY AFFORDABILITY GRANT

Applications for the Community Rink Affordability Grant are being accepted until December 15, 2015. The Community Rink Affordability Grant provides funding to Saskatchewan's community-owned indoor skating and curling rinks.

"The Community Rink Affordability Grant has financial impact beyond the \$2,500 payment per ice surface," Parks, Culture and Sport Minister Mark Docherty said. "Many of the communities across the province use the funding to offset operational costs and are able to provide free or reduced cost programming to the community's citizens as a result. Other rinks have used the funding toward energy-efficient investments which create utility savings into the future.
