SASKATCHEWAN STAYING STRONG: FASTEST JOB GROWTH AND LOWEST UNEMPLOYMENT IN CANADA

Saskatchewan's strong economy has again produced the fastest rate of employment growth and lowest unemployment rate in Canada, according to new figures released today by Statistics

Canada.

"Our strong economy continues to give confidence to employers who, in turn, are deciding to expand their workforce," Minister responsible for Immigration, Jobs, Skills and Training Jeremy Harrison said. "Thanks to the hard work of Saskatchewan people, there are 71,700 more people employed today than there were in 2007."

The latest report from Statistics Canada shows that employment in October 2014 was up by 3.5 per cent over last October with Saskatchewan employers creating 19,700 more jobs. In total, there were 576,200 people employed in the province, the highest ever for the month.

The province's unemployment remained unchanged at a low of 3.5 per cent (seasonally adjusted), the lowest among the provinces and well below the national rate of 6.5 per cent.

"We have maintained the lowest unemployment rate in the country for the past 23 months," Harrison said.

On a month-over-month comparison, there were 2,300 more jobs (seasonally adjusted) in October over September.

WINTER SAFE DRIVING TIPS



Last Saturday was the first major snowfall of 2014 and although many of us are well versed in winter driving, it still takes us by surprise ever year!

The following are reminders about safe winter driving:

- Prepare your vehicle: check your windshield wipers to make sure they are operating correctly, make sure your coolant/anti-freeze as the right protection level, keep your fuel tank at at least half, make sure your tires are properly inflated and have the proper tread.
- Check road conditions: listen to the radio, watch the weather channel, and check the Saskatchewan Highway Hotline.
- Plan your route ahead of time.
- Leave lots of travel time.
- Keep at least four seconds between you and the vehicle in front of you.
- Have an emergency plan.
- Keep your vehicle stocked with simple emergency items: blanket or extra clothes, candles, matches, snacks, non-alcoholic beverages, flares, cell-phone charger, small shovel, flashlight, windshield scraper, tow rope, bag of sand/cat littler for traction, long jumper/booster cables, etc.

Please keep these tips in mind before you head out on the road this winter and stay safe on the roads.

HIGHWAY HOTLINE INTRODUCES SERVICE IMPROVEMENTS

A series of improvements are being made to Saskatchewan's Highway Hotline including a new travel planning route locator for frequently travelled highways, as well as an updated version of the mobile website.

"We want to make sure motorists get the information they need as easily and conveniently as possible when making their travel plans," Highways and Infrastructure Minister Nancy Heppner said. "More and more people are using handheld devices to access road information."

A travel planning locator tool has been added making travel planning easier and more efficient. Motorists will now be able to view live snapshots of the road conditions along the top 16 frequently travelled highways.

The new version of the mobile website will offer motorists a more convenient way to check highway conditions. When you go to www.saskatchewa.ca/highwayhotline, the site recognizes you are on a smart phone or tablet and will automatically take you to the mobile version. It allows motorists to select interactive maps of Saskatchewan areas and click on specific highway segments for conditions.

REGIONAL PARKS RECEIVE \$1.023 MILLION IN FUNDING FROM GOVERNMENT OF SASKATCHEWAN

Parks, Culture and Sport Minister Mark Docherty, today, confirmed that Saskatchewan Regional Parks will receive a grant for \$1.023 million for the 2014-15 fiscal year.

In 2008, the government committed \$2.4 million over four years to Saskatchewan Regional Parks. This commitment was exceeded with \$3.15 million being granted over the four-year period. The government has continued its investment in the regional park system and the total investment since 2008 is now \$6.22 million.

"Regional parks reflect community pride and contribute to the strong quality of life we enjoy in Saskatchewan," Docherty said. "Our government is proud to support the great work that regional park volunteers do on behalf of their members."

ENCHANTED FOREST



This holiday season marks the 16th anniversary of the Enchanted Forest Holiday Light Tour at the Saskatoon Forestry Farm Park and Zoo. The spectacular light display has attracted about 60,000 visitors annually, 40% of which are tourists, making it Saskatchewan's top winter tourist attraction.

The Enchanted Forest opens Saturday, November 22 and runs until Saturday, January 10 from 5:30 pm - 11:00 pm every night. Gate prices are \$10 per person or \$30 per vehicle (max. 7 people), children 5 and under are free.

To mark the opening of the Enchanted Forest, Saskatchewan Blue Cross presents the "Light Walk!" on November 21 from 5:30 pm - 9:00 pm. This is a great chance to walk through and see the light displays up close. The "Light Walk!" is \$5 per person or \$20 per family. There will be no drive-thru traffic and you will be able to warm up at the Forestry Farm House with Tim Horton's hot chocolate.

We are so fortunate to have this incredible attraction in our constituency of Saskatoon Silver Springs. I hope you are all able to make it through this fantastic light display at least once this holiday season! It is a great Saskatoon tradition and right in our backyard!
