GOVERNMENT TAKING ACTION TO COMBAT IMPAIRED DRIVING



An emotional meeting with victims of the impaired driving group

Premier Brad Wall, "With the highest per capita impaired driving fatalities in Canada, we have a problem in Saskatchewan...and it needs to change. Too many lives have been lost and people injured. So today, our government is taking further action to prevent impaired driving."

Government is taking action against impaired driving through effective legislation, more tools for law enforcement, and doing more to build awareness.

"Drinking and driving has taken far too many lives in this province and people need to get the message that it is never acceptable, period," Minister responsible for Saskatchewan Government Insurance Joe Hargrave said. "Our government is committed to reducing the number of lives lost and people injured due to impaired driving."

BE LEERY OF TRADING WEBSITES THAT OFFER EXTREMEMLY HIGH RETURNS

The Financial and Consumer Affairs Authority (FCAA) is warning people about binary option website scams and offering tips so people can protect their money. Binary options are bets on whether an asset (currency, stock etc.) will go higher or lower in price at a certain point in time. Currently there are no websites or online trading platforms registered or authorized to sell binary options in Canada.

"If people come across a trading website that offer high returns for little investment, they need to think twice about entering their credit card information or sending money offshore and call us," FCAA Securities Enforcement Deputy Director Ed Rodonets said.

AMENDMENT SUPPORTS WORKERS EXPERIENCING PSYCHOLOGICAL INJURIES

A change to *The Workers' Compensation Act, 2013* was introduced today which will expand workers' compensation coverage to workers experiencing psychological injuries. The amendment establishes a rebuttal presumption for all forms of psychological injuries, which means that it is presumed that a worker has a work-related injury and would not have to prove it occurred in the workplace.

"We are committed to protecting our workers, especially those who protect us," Labour Relations and Workplace Safety Minister Don Morgan said. "Many of the people experiencing psychological injuries such as Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder are our first responders who are exposed to traumatic situations because of their jobs."

LEGISLATION CREATES COMMON MEANING FOR "PRIVATIZE"

The government has introduced legislation that will provide a legal definition for the term "privatize".

"These changes clarify the meaning of the term when used in future and existing Saskatchewan Acts and regulations," Justice Minister and Attorney General Gordon Wyant said. "This definition explains actions that would be considered privatization and recognizes the necessary flexibility for

government to restructure Crown corporations while maintaining ownership."

This year, Red Williams, from Richardson, Saskatchewan was bestowed the French Legion of Honour, the highest honour by Frances government, a HMCS Unicorn in Saskatoon. Williams says it's a high honour to be a recipient, but "one can't help but think some of the guys that were there that are gone. Vincent Martin, the honourary consular of France in Saskatoon, says for France, the help of Canada was "extremely important" in securing victory on D-Day.

Consumers should take three steps to protect themselves in the event something goes wrong with their travel agency:

- 1. Pay with a credit card. It is easier for consumers to get a refund through their credit card provider.
- 2. Minimize or avoid cash or cheque deposits. It may be more difficult or impossible to get a refund if something goes wrong.
- Do some research, read customer reviews, check with the Better Business Bureau and the Association of Canadian Travel Agencies, and confirm that the agency is well established and has a good reputation within the community.

MINISTRY TRAVEL SPENDING DROPS \$582,000 IN 2015-16

Communications Spending Down \$1.5 Million, Excluding Increase By Elections Saskatchewan

Spending on ministry travel was down \$582,000 or 1.5 per cent in 2015-16, compared to the previous year, as part of the Saskatchewan government's fiscally responsible approach to ongoing economic challenges.

This reduction is part of the detailed financial information that was released today in Volume 2 of the 2015-16 Public Accounts. Compared to the last full year of the previous government in 2006-07, overall travel costs were down about \$4.0 million or 10 per cent in 2015-16.

"Our government continues to manage expense carefully while investing in priority areas for Saskatchewan people such as health care, education and social assistance," Finance Minister Kevin Doherty said.

GRADE 3 READING LEVELS CONTINUE TO RISE IN SASKATCHEWAN



The number of Grade 3 students reading at grade level continues to rise, thanks to the collaborative work between the education sector and the Ministry of Education. School division data from 2016 shows that 74 per cent of students are reading at grade level compared to 65 per cent in 2013.

"I am thrilled to see continued improvement in Grade 3 reading levels this year as our government continues to work collaboratively with our sector partners toward the goal of having 80 per cent of students reading at grade level or above by 2020," Deputy Premier and Education Minister Don Morgan said. "Students who are reading at or above grade level are more likely to go on to be successful in school and to graduate, and are better able to reach their full potential."
