FATHER / DAUGHTER GALA



FAILING TO READ CONTRACT PUTS CONSUMERS AT RISK




November is Financial Literacy Month and the Financial and Consumer Affairs Authority (FCAA) wants consumers to read contracts in full before signing on the bottom line.

THE 2016-17 MID-YEAR BUDGET REPORT HAS BEEN RELEASED FALLING TAX REVENUE INCREASES DEFICIT

Restraint Measures Include Public Sector Hiring Freeze To Control Labour Costs

A \$400 million drop in provincial tax revenue has pushed the forecast deficit to \$806 million, according to the 2016-17 Mid-Year Financial Report released today by Finance Minister Kevin Doherty.

"Continued low oil and potash prices are having a greater impact on revenue than expected," Doherty said. "It has now been two full years since the oil price started to drop in the fall of 2014, and we are seeing a much greater effect on corporate and personal income tax and the Provincial Sales Tax.

"To start moving the provincial budget back to balance, significant restraint measures are needed. Measures will be implemented now, with more to follow in next year's budget."

DID YOU KNOW:

While Saskatchewan's economy is showing signs of strength, lower than expected potash, uranium and continued low oil prices have hit government finances hard.

The shortfall in government revenues for 2016-17 is now at \$806 million. So we are taking significant restraint measures to start getting the budget back to balance.

Since coming to office, our government has paid off about 1/3 of Saskatchewan's operating debt.

That means we have the fiscal capacity to manage through challenging times. Interest costs are down from over \$1 billion annually in 1994-95 to \$292 million today.

Saskatchewan also has the second lowest debt to GDP ratio among provinces and a Aaa credit rating, showing our solid financial footing.

We will protect Saskatchewan's fiscal position. So as we move past this challenging time, our economy and province will be stronger than ever.



RESPECT PRIVATE LAND - ALWAYS ASK PERMISSION BEFORE YOU HUNT

Respect private land

Since most hunting in Saskatchewan takes place on private land, respecting private landowners is an important part of good hunter ethics. Hunters are always encouraged to ask permission to hunt on unposted land and must have permission to hunt on posted land.

If you see a hunting violation, call the TIP line, 24 hours day, at 1-800-667-7561 or from a SaskTel cell phone at #5555.



Since most hunting in Saskatchewan takes place on private land, respecting private landowners is an important part of good hunter ethics.

Historically, there has been a strong relationship between landowners and hunters. In order to maintain that relationship, hunters are encouraged to continue asking for landowner approval before hunting on unposted land.


