

Goods stamped "Made in Saskatchewan" are in demand among Canadian merchandise, according to Statistics Canada's figures released today for August 2014. Saskatchewan leads the provinces in year-over-year growth in exports value.

Saskatchewan posted a 31.6 per cent increase in the value of its exports last August over August 2013, a jump from \$2.37 billion to \$3.12 billion - good enough for top spot among the provinces.

"We have what the world needs, and the Saskatchewan brand is increasingly known and respected in markets around the world," Minister responsible for Trade Minister Jeremy Harrison said. "Our economy is helping to set the pace for growth in Canada and is helping sustain a virtuous cycle of continued investment, activity and benefits for Saskatchewan people."

FLU CLINICS ACROSS THE PROVINCE TO OPEN SOON

The publicly-funded influenza vaccine will be available through public health clinics across the province, and from some physicians and Nurse Practitioners beginning October 14, 2014. The free vaccine will be offered to all Saskatchewan residents six months and older.

"We want to ensure people in our province have easy access to the flu shot and stay healthy during the flu season," Health Minister Dustin Duncan said. "Getting vaccinated is a simple action that can save lives."

"We strongly encourage people to get the flu vaccine early in the season," Saskatchewan's Chief Medical Health Officer, Dr. Saqib Shahab said. "Flu can spread quickly, and can cause serious illness. The vaccine is a safe, effective way to protect yourself and those close to you."

The flu vaccine is recommended to everyone six months and older but is particularly important for people at high risk of serious complications from influenza:

- children under five;
- pregnant women;
- adults 65 and older;
- nursing home residents;
- people with a chronic health condition; and
- caregivers and contacts of people at high risk.

OCTOBER LAND SALE BRINGS IN \$21.6 MILLION IN REVENUE

With \$21.6 million in revenue raised at Saskatchewan's October sale of petroleum and natural gas rights, total for the 2014 land sales are \$179.6 million with one sale remaining.

Twenty-nine leases and two exploration licences located between Carnduff in the south and Moosomin to the north along the Manitoba border raised \$10.4 million. This area is prospective for several targets, including the Jurassic, Mississippian and Devonian.

"Industry has been developing the Bakken-Three Forks play quite extensively on either side of the Saskatchewan-Manitoba border for several years now, and the ongoing acquisition of oil and gas rights in that area bodes well for future economic activity in local communities," Economy Minister Bill Boyd said.

ANNUAL EYE EXAMS FOR DIABETIC PATIENTS NOW COVERED BY THE PROVINCE

People living with diabetes in Saskatchewan will benefit from improved access to vision care. The province now provides coverage for annual eye examinations for diabetic patients, effective October 1, 2014.

"Maintaining good eye health is an important aspect of diabetes management," Health Minister Dustin Duncan said. "This new service will remove financial barriers and ensure timely access to vision care for people living with diabetes in our province."

Clinical practice guidelines for the management of residents with diabetes recommend annual eye exams to ensure optimal monitoring and care. The newly introduced coverage will reduce out-of-pocket costs, improve access to an eye examination, and facilitate early treatment of eye issues related to diabetes.

- ... A number of paving projects across the province have now been completed, with more than 60 kilometres of newly paved roads throughout Saskatchewan.
