Congratulations to Saskatoon Willowgrove constituent Grant J. Kook who was named the 2018 ABEX Business Leader of the Year! A well deserved honour.

Grant Kook is the founder, President and CEO of Westcap Mgt. Ltd., a leading Saskatchewan venture capital and private equity fund manager. By designing and executing on niche funds that fill capital gaps in Saskatchewan's economy, Westcap, over the past 25 years has completed investment transactions in excess of a billion dollars impacting thousands of jobs, communities, small and

medium-sized companies and the provincial economy as a whole. Spanning from Cheung on Investments Group, an international investment fund to Golden Opportunities, the HeadStart on a Home infrastructure fund, First Nations funds and a series of private equity funds supported by high-net-worth investors and financial institutions, Mr. Kook has been instrumental in all parts of the capital eco-system in Saskatchewan. He is also the owner and President and CEO of the Ramada Hotels in Regina and Saskatoon.

Mr. Kook is a seasoned business leader with a strong focus on building the community. He has sat on numerous Provincial and Federal Government task forces on economic policy and is an active supporter of community-based organizations. Mr. Kook is currently the Chairman of the Board of SaskTel, the Vice-Chairman of the Saskatchewan Health Authority, Vice-Chairman of Saskatchewan Blue Cross, a Board member of 3sHealth Shared Services Saskatchewan, and a member of the Saskatchewan Teacher's Federation Pension Plan Investment Committee. In addition, he holds a Chartered Director Designation from McMaster University DeGroote School of Business.

The Government of Saskatchewan has designated October 14-20, as Education Week in Saskatchewan.


For more than 30 years, Saskatchewan has dedicated a week to celebrate student success and recognize the dedication and commitment of education professionals across the province.

MCORMOND DRIVE & COLLEGE DRIVE INTERCHANGE OPENING TOMORROW!



City of Saskatoon News Release:

The McOrmond Drive and College Drive interchange will open to traffic on Wednesday, October 17, 2018, alleviating congestion on priority roads that have become busier as the city continues to grow.

"Once open, traffic at the McOrmond Drive and College Drive intersection will be free flowing with all interchange ramps operational," says Bryan Zerebeski, the City's manager for the Saskatoon Interchange Project. "Due to a wet September, some work surrounding the interchange will now resume in the spring."

Southbound traffic on McOrmond Drive exiting onto College Drive will continue to use the existing ramp. All traffic exiting from College Drive onto McOrmond Drive northbound and southbound must use the right lane. (see attached gif)

The Boychuk Drive and Highway 16 interchange partially opened to traffic on September 30, nearly a year ahead of schedule. Construction on both interchanges started in April 2017 and both are expected to be totally complete by the end of July 2019.

Drivers are reminded that the speed limit through work zones at both interchange sites is 60 km/h. For more information about the project, including renderings and video updates, visit saskatoon.ca/interchanges.

**CELEBRATING WASTE REDUCTION WEEK IN SASKATCHEWAN** 



# You've contributed to some impressive recycling and waste reduction in our province:

- More than 400 million beverage containers recycled through SARCAN in 2017.
- More than 409,000 litres of paint collected and diverted from landfills in 2017.
- More than 2,200 tonnes of waste electronics collected and recycled in 2017.
- More than 18 million litres of used oil and almost two million oil filters recycled in 2017.
- Over 480 municipalities have blue box recycling programs, leading to more than 41,250 tonnes of printed paper and packaging materials recycled in 2017.

Environment Minister Dustin Duncan has proclaimed October 15 to 21 as Waste Reduction Week in Saskatchewan. Throughout the week, people are encouraged to find innovative ideas and solutions to become more environmentally conscious. In its 17th year, Waste Reduction Week continues to highlight the importance of waste reduction, conservation and recycling, as well as the positive impact living green has on our environment.

"Waste Reduction Week is a chance to celebrate Saskatchewan's achievements in developing successful recycling programs and waste management systems," Duncan said.

Over the past year, Saskatchewan has made progress on a number of waste stewardship and recycling initiatives. Earlier in 2018, a program for the responsible management of used grain bags was launched, the first of its kind in Canada. The waste electronics program was expanded to include more items, such as microwave ovens, GPS units and game consoles.

### MINISTRY OF CORRECTIONS AND POLICING PROVIDES FUNDING TO MADD

"Our government is proud to support a strong participation of young Canadians in the agriculture and food industry which is essential to the future and growth of our sector," said Lawrence MacAulay Minister of Agriculture and Agri-Food Canada. "Through scholarships like these, we're giving students the knowledge, skills and tools they need to succeed in an industry that's growing our economy and creating well-paying jobs."

The scholarship is funded through the Canadian Agriculture Partnership, a five-year, \$388 million investment in strategic initiatives for Saskatchewan agriculture by the federal and provincial governments.

"Agriculture is a major employer and economic driver in our province and there are many exciting career opportunities to pursue," Agriculture Minister David Marit said. "The scholarship program is all about encouraging youth interested in agriculture to take an active role in shaping the industry."

This year's theme 'Our Food Has a Story' emphasizes the connection between modern agriculture

practices and trust in the agriculture industry. A food story ties consumers and producers together through shared values of health and nutrition, affordability, food safety and sustainability.

### RECOGNIZING SASKATCHEWAN'S TOP CADETS




Saskatchewan's top Sea Cadet Corps, Army Cadet Corps and Air Cadet Squadron are being showcased in a series of events over the next several weeks.

NEW EXPLORATION INCENTIVE SEEKS TO ENCOURAGE SASKATCHEWAN MINING OPPORTUNTIES



The Government of Saskatchewan is now receiving applications for a new incentive to help encourage mineral exploration in targeted areas of the province.

The Targeted Mineral Exploration Incentive is designed to cover a portion of expenditures associated with ground-based exploration activities. It offers a rebate of 25 per cent of eligible direct drilling costs, up to an annual maximum of \$50,000 per company on a pro-rated basis. The incentive will focus on base metals, precious metals and diamonds - commodities that have significant unrealized potential in the province.

"As part of the Mineral Development Strategy announced in the 2017 Speech from the Throne, this incentive will help generate jobs in our northern and rural mining communities," Energy and Resources Minister Bronwyn Eyre said. "The drilling activity this stimulates is expected to lead to new discoveries that will grow and diversify Saskatchewan's mining sector."




