MERLIS BELSHER PLACE ANNOUNCED!

Belsher's gift is the largest donation from an alumnus and individual in the university's history!



It was indeed an exciting day as many gathered in the existing home of Huskie men's and women's hockey, Rutherford Rink October 13. I was pleased to join University officials, alumni, hockey aficionados, Huskie athletes and minor hockey representatives as plans were announced for the new twin-ice facility to be built on the University of Saskatchewan campus near the Saskatoon Field House.

Saskatoon Willowgrove constituent Merlis Belsher announced a \$12.25 million donation to the

proposed new arena. The donation is the largest received from an alumnus and individual in university's history. Merlis Belsher is an accomplished accountant, lawyer, entrepreneur and philanthropist. For as long as I have known Merlis, he has given back to this community. His generousity and passion for people, this city and province is a true reflection of his character.

"Sports are inextricably interwoven with education," he said. "Sports keep young kids off the streets, and get them involved in community." said Belsher.

Built in 1929 and affectionately called the "Dog House", Rutherford Rink has fallen well below the standard of quality required for a competitive university athletic program. Student intramural and community-based programs and teams also experience challenges with the outdated facility. Although renovated numerous times, it has been clear for many years that Rutherford is beyond repair.

Belsher was honoured to kick off the campaign with his unprecedented contribution to his alma mater while hoping others will consider contributing to the \$7.3 M still needed for the Home Ice Campaign. 

This past week has been emotional as family and friends say good bye to three distinguished citizens who have served their communities, cities and provinces with passion.



PREMIER BRAD WALL OUTLINES SASKATCHEWAN'S PLAN FOR CLIMATE CHANGE



Premier Brad Wall today released Saskatchewan's White Paper on Climate Change, outlining an alternative approach to Prime Minister Trudeau's national carbon tax.

"There are three approaches we can take to fighting climate change – adaptation, innovation and taxation," Wall said. "Of the three, a carbon tax will do the most harm to the economy while having the least positive impact on reducing emissions.

"We should be focusing our efforts on innovation and adaptation, not taxation."

Wall noted that there are more than 2,400 new coal-fired power plants planned or under construction around the world, according to a report released last December at the Paris climate change summit. Those plants alone will emit 6.5 billion tonnes of carbon dioxide (CO2) a year – nearly nine times Canada's annual Greenhouse Gas (GHG) emissions.

GOVERNMENT APPROVES SASKENERGY RATE CHANGES FOR NOVEMBER 1; SECOND BILL DECREASE FOR NATURAL GAS CUSTOMERS IN 2016



The Government of Saskatchewan October 12 approved SaskEnergy's adjustments to both its Commodity and Delivery Service rates, as recommended by the Saskatchewan Rate Review Panel. Starting November 1, 2016, residential customers will see an overall decrease of nearly two per cent per month or \$15 annually to their heating bills. This follows a decrease of \$53 annually, which came into effect January 1, 2016.

"When you add the savings from earlier this year to this latest decrease, residential customers

will see their natural gas bill shrink by \$68 annually," Minister Responsible for SaskEnergy Dustin Duncan said. "I'm pleased we're able to pass on savings to customers as we head into the winter heating season. SaskEnergy also offers price protection, which shields customers against market volatility at a time of year when they're using most of their natural gas."

SASKATCHEWAN CELEBRATES SCHOOL BUS DRIVER APPRECIATION DAY


