

QUINN STEVENSON BATTING CAGES IN WILLOWGROVE!



The Trust and funding partners TD Bank (David Schmirler) and Saskatoon Blue Jays, along with other donations are going to make the batting cages a reality. Behind the batting cage project is Troy Carbno, who was instrumental in making the Quinn Stevenson Memorial Rink a reality. The batting cages will be built adjacent to the rink. Nordic Industries will be responsible for the construction of the metal fence cage that will enclose the batting cages.

STILL GROWING STRONG: SASKATCHEWAN'S POPULATION TOPS 1,174,000



Premier Scott Moe, "The latest figures are out and they show that Saskatchewan continues to grow. In the second quarter of 2019 we added 3,435 people, bringing our total population to 1,174,462, with over 183,000 more people in 53 consecutive quarters of growth. We'll continue to make Saskatchewan the best place in Canada to live, work, and raise a family."

More people are living in Saskatchewan than ever before, as the province's population grew to 1,174,462 as of July 1, 2019, according to new figures released by Statistics Canada.

Saskatchewan's population has now grown in 53 consecutive quarters, increasing by more than

183,000 people during that time.

Immigration and Career Training Minister Jeremy Harrison said a growing province creates opportunities for Saskatchewan people and provides the resources needed to support important government services.

"As we get ready to enter the 2020s, our government is planning for another decade of strong growth in Saskatchewan," Harrison said. "This fall, we will release a new growth plan for the new decade, with new growth targets and actions we will take to achieve those targets."

Saskatchewan grew by 3,435 people in the second quarter of 2019. A net increase of 4,510 people from international migration and a natural increase (births minus deaths) of 1,644 people was partially offset by net interprovincial outmigration of 2,719 people.

A STUDENT'S GUIDE TO CREDIT CARDS



Want bonus points, free movies, or cash back?

Here's what to know when getting your first credit card.

The Financial and Consumer Affairs Authority (FCAA) is offering credit card advice to students. When used successfully, a credit card can build a good credit score which can help when it comes to buying a large life purchase, such as a car or house.

"Ensuring that you regularly read your credit card statements and making your minimum payments on time are great practices when owning a credit card," Consumer Credit Division Director Cory Peters said. "It's also really important to not share your PIN or lend someone your card. You should keep your credit card information safe and solely yours."

Keep the following tips in mind when getting a credit card:

- Always make your minimum payments on time at the very least, make the minimum payment by the due date. If possible, pay off the full balance on time to avoid interest charges altogether.
- Don't share your PIN if something happens to your account and you've given someone
 your PIN, you will be paying the price.
- Avoid cash advances there often is a fee associated with this and interest is charged immediately.
- Read your statements make sure your transactions recorded in your credit card statements are accurate and check for any unfamiliar charges. Fraudsters can sometimes gain access to your card without you noticing it.
- It's not free cash if you cannot afford to pay off what you are committing to spend on your credit card, think twice before making the purchase.

Not all credit cards are the same. Different cards offer different interest rates, fees, limits and rewards. Make sure to research which one is the right fit for you.

The Government of Saskatchewan has proclaimed October as Foster Families Month to celebrate the many contributions of foster families across the province.


Social Services Minister Paul Merriman and Saskatchewan MLAs will attend private events across the province to show their support and appreciation to Saskatchewan foster families.
