## **SASKATCHEWAN HOSTS WESTERN CONSERVATION LAW ENFORCEMENT ACADEMY FOR 2016-17**

Conservation officer recruits from western Canada will be calling Saskatchewan home for the next several months.

The Western Conservation Law Enforcement Academy (WCLEA) gets underway on September 8 at Candle Lake Golf Resort, where 22 recruits from Saskatchewan, Alberta, British Columbia and the Yukon Territory will take part in a 16 week training program aimed at delivering common training standards and curriculum to conservation officer recruits.

“Our government is proud to be hosting WCLEA for the second consecutive year,” Environment Minister Scott Moe said. “Conservation officers provide a vital service in Saskatchewan and this allows them to be trained here at home. This is a great opportunity to showcase the province’s facilities and ability to host this type of training. It also exposes trainees and out-of-province instructors to Saskatchewan’s hospitality, along with our spectacular wildlife and natural habitat.”

## **RENEWED FUNDING FOR CULTURE ON THE GO BENEFITS ARTISTS AND AUDIENCES**

The Government of Saskatchewan today announced a renewed investment of \$800,000 for the Culture on the Go program (CoGo). The funds will be divided between Creative Saskatchewan and the Saskatchewan Arts Board and distributed as grants to Saskatchewan artists for eligible projects.

“We are pleased to continue our support of Saskatchewan’s artists and performers,” Parks, Culture and Sport Minister Ken Cheveldayoff said. “Culture on the Go helps make it possible for them to further their careers and share their art, music or performances with people in-province, outside of the province or internationally.”

The marketing alliance, Saskatoon-based Canpotex, will continue.

On the whole, this merger will be positive for Canada, Saskatchewan and Alberta creating an even stronger fertilizer company to compete in an increasingly complex and challenging industry.

As for the impact on farmers, only Agrium is in the retail fertilizer space and so no retail options for farmers will be lost to this deal."

Premier Wall thanked Mr. Jochen Tilk, CEO of PotashCorp and Mr. Chuck Magro, CEO of Agrium for their work and for their cooperative efforts with government.

## **ONE HUNDRED SCHOLARSHIPS AWARDED TO SASKATCHEWAN YOUTH APPRENTICESHIP GRADUATES**

One hundred high school graduates from 66 Saskatchewan communities received Saskatchewan Youth Apprenticeship (SYA) Industry Scholarships in 2016.



The \$1,000 scholarship is unique because it can only be redeemed within two years of graduation after a recipient has demonstrated they are actively pursuing a career in the skilled trades—either by apprenticing with an employer and completing Level 1 technical training, or completing a pre-employment program.

“The skilled trades are an option for long, rewarding careers to build bright futures right here in Saskatchewan,” Economy Minister Jeremy Harrison said. “Skilled trade workers perform tangible, meaningful work, and the SYA Industry Scholarship is one way of encouraging young people to pursue that career path.”

“The excitement is building for our four new public schools that will help us serve families in Evergreen, Hampton Village, Rosewood and Stonebridge,” Saskatoon Public Schools Board Chair Ray Morrison said. “With the innovative design features, each school will provide supportive learning spaces for elementary students. We look forward to opening these schools, which will be the future heart of these communities.”

“Prairie Spirit is pleased with the progress at Traditions Elementary School in Warman and Lake Vista Public School in Martensville,” Prairie Spirit Board of Education Chair Larry Pavloff said. “We look forward to opening these two new schools for students next fall.”

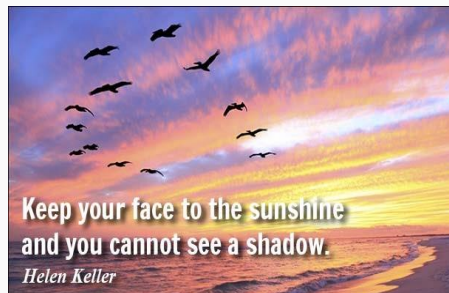
