COMMUNITY HONOURS THE STEVENSON FAMILY



In 2014 there was a notice in the Erindale Arbor Creek Community Newsletter looking for donations to purchase and equip a mobile warm up trailer for the outdoor rink at John G. Egnatoff School. It was called the "Toasty Toes campaign" and the Quinn Stevenson Memorial Spirit and Athletic trust definitely wanted to be involved by making a donation since this rink was a spot Quinn spent a lot of hours at.

In 2015, Troy Carbno, one of the rink volunteers, came up with the idea to rename the

outdoor rink after Quinn. The goal of this renaming was to give the rink an identity, and to create a community gathering place that people could enjoy and respect for years to come. At the Quinn Stevenson Memorial Golf Tournament that year, it was announced that the outdoor rink located Dr. John G. Egnatoff School would be renamed –as the Quinn Stevenson Memorial Rink.

Once the renaming was announced, a sign was designed by Shane Kartz and produced by Minuteman Press. It was decided the sign needed to be specially framed and mounted, a task that Corey Nerbas a friend of the Stevenson family took on. Jason Ilnisky and Jeff Michaluk, did all the preparation work for the installation. Harold Robinson, the principal at Dr. John G. Egnatoff helped facilitate the approval with the Saskatoon Public School board.

The rink is maintained by community volunteers, a crew of which currently includes rink coordinator Trent MacLean, and volunteers, Jason Ilnisky, Peter Sembalerus, Mike Hydomako, Gord Hirschfeld, and Troy Carbno.

The sign just went up recently. It is a beautiful tribute to Quinn. Special thanks to all the above mentioned people.

COMMISSIONER FOR OATHS AND NOTARY PUBLIC APPLICATION AND RENEWAL NOW AVAILABLE ONLINE

A new online application and renewal process to appoint Commissioners for Oaths and Notaries Public is now available in Saskatchewan.

The new process includes online payment and the ability for citizens to check the status of an application and print their own certificates. There is also an educational component to teach new applicants the duties of their pending role and to serve as a refresher for those already appointed.

"Commissioners for Oaths and Notaries Public provide important services to Saskatchewan citizens," Justice Minister and Attorney General Gordon Wyant said. "Modernizing the application and renewal system provides a more convenient process for those who wish to maintain their appointment or become a Commissioner for Oaths or Notary Public for the first time."

MINIMUM WAGE AND MINIMUM CALL-OUT PAY



Saskatchewan's minimum wage will increase to \$10.72 an hour. The change will take effect on October 1, 2016.

"Increases to the minimum wage, when combined with other supports and tax exemptions, help ease the financial burden for low-income earners," Labour Relations and Workplace Safety Minister Don Morgan said. "By annually reviewing the minimum wage, we have created a predictable system for employees and business owners."

SELF-DIRECTED FUNDING DEMONSTRATION PROJECT A SUCCESS




