SASKATCHEWAN CROWN CORPORATIONS USE TRADE  
AGREEMENTS TO IMPROVE PROCUREMENT

Effective September 1, Saskatchewan Crown corporations are taking advantage of exemptions in the Agreement on Internal Trade (AIT) to improve procurement opportunities for businesses in Saskatchewan, Alberta and British Columbia, the provinces under the New West Partnership Trade Agreement (NWPTA).

“We are committed to ensuring our Crown corporations comply with trade agreements and recognize there is room within those agreements for Crowns to source regional solutions,” SaskBuilds Minister Gordon Wyant said. “Our government is very pleased to be moving forward with implementing the Procurement Transformation action plan and continuing to identify opportunities to improve procurement practices that create a level playing field for Saskatchewan businesses.”

## **SASKATOON, MARTENSVILLE AND WARMAN CELEBRATE THE START OF CONSTRUCTION FOR 12 NEW SCHOOLS**



I was pleased to join Education Minister Don Morgan, members of the Saskatoon Public, Greater Saskatoon Catholic and Prairie Spirit school divisions, along with students, parents, community members and dignitaries Friday, September 11 to celebrate the start of construction for 12 publicly-owned elementary schools to be built on six joint-use sites in Saskatoon, Martensville and Warman.

“Our government is delighted that this historical project is officially underway and that we can look forward to meeting the needs of our students, teachers, families and communities for

generations to come,” Morgan said. “We recognize that Saskatoon, Martensville and Warman continue to experience extraordinary growth and they are in need of more schools. I’m proud to say that thanks to the support of our educational partners, we’ve taken another big step toward it.”

Saskatoon’s eight schools will be located in Hampton Village, Evergreen, Rosewood and Stonebridge, the Warman schools will be built in the Traditions neighbourhood, and Martensville schools in Lake Vista.

Young workers in the province will have a better way to learn about their workplace rights and responsibilities through the updated Young Worker Readiness Certificate Course (YWRCC).

The Government of Saskatchewan announced September 10 that a new, interactive version of the YWRCC is now available online and can be found at [www.saskatchewan.ca/ywrcc](http://www.saskatchewan.ca/ywrcc). This job readiness course, which is mandatory for fourteen and fifteen year-olds, teaches young workers about their rights and responsibilities that relate to health, safety, and employment standards in the workplace.

“Along with the opportunity to renew the material, the new course is now highly interactive and engages young workers with games, animation and videos,” Labour Relations and Workplace Safety Minister Don Morgan said. “By having a more interactive course, we are ensuring our young workers remember their rights and responsibilities which will help protect them in their future workplaces.”

## **YOUTH APPRENTICE SCHOLARSHIPS PROVIDE A HEAD START**

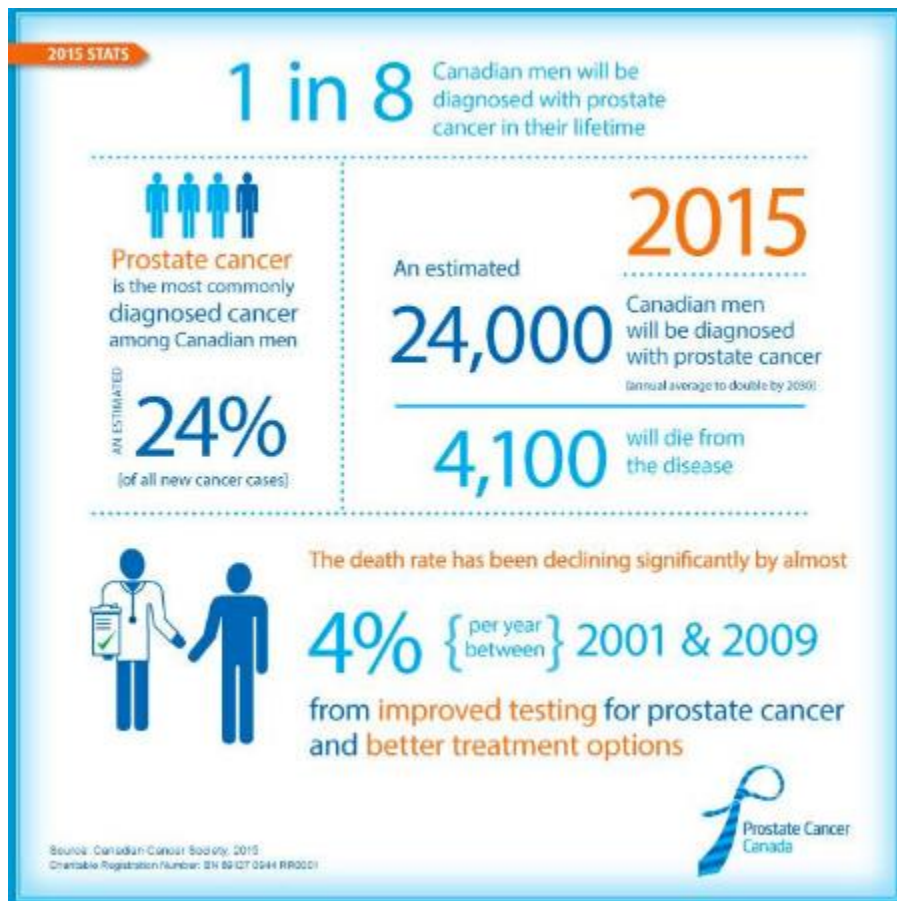

The 2015-16 season marks the 50<sup>th</sup> Season of the Western Hockey League, which was established in 1966. The regular season will begin in Moose Jaw, SK on Thursday, September 24<sup>th</sup> as the Warriors host the Regina Pats. The match-up is in honour of the two teams who competed in the League's first championship series in 1967. That season, the Moose Jaw Canucks defeated the Regina Pats to become the first championship team in League history.

"We are excited to celebrate the rich history of our League this season," commented WHL Commissioner Ron Robison. "We have been fortunate to have many talented players, excellent teams and exceptional people in the WHL since 1966, and we truly look forward to honouring these individuals and sharing the story of our League throughout our 50<sup>th</sup> Season."

The WHL will also launch a series of special campaigns during its 50th Season. Beginning September 29th, two of the League's 49 championship teams will be profiled weekly as a part of Championship Tuesdays at [www.WHL.ca](http://www.WHL.ca) and on the WHL's social media channels.
