Improving Affordable Housing

Our government is continuing to take action to address the challenge of providing affordable housing. We recently announced the development of a comprehensive housing strategy to be completed by the end of June 2011. The goal of the strategy is to make immediate improvements that will strengthen Saskatchewan's affordable housing system as well as ensure a well-functioning system into the future. It will also help us find innovative solutions so that we can support a growing population and ensure that housing is accessible to all people and families in Saskatchewan. The strategy will be developed by the Saskatchewan Housing Corporation in coordination with stakeholders in the housing industry, including rural and urban municipalities, home builders and developers, real estate organizations, chambers of commerce, and community-based organizations across the province. Once completed, the strategy will help bring clarity to all levels of government, and others involved, on the roles each of us can play in delivering housing solutions.

Since 2007, our government has taken various measures to improve affordable housing in Saskatchewan. We invested \$80 million to open over 860 additional affordable housing units across the province. Plus, there are over 1100 more affordable housing units in various stages of development. Our government has also assisted over 360 low-income households achieve homeownership and over 2900 more improve the health, safety and energy efficiency of their homes. We increased shelter rates and the Saskatchewan Rental Housing Supplement and indexed both to the cost of living. We know there is still more to do, but our government will continue to work for and with you so we can move our province forward.

There are many advantages to living in Saskatchewan today. A government that is working toward solutions to provide more affordable housing is just one of them. We are a growing, prosperous province which has finally taken its rightful place as one of Canada's economic leaders. But, the Saskatchewan advantage is about more than just numbers. It is about quality of life – a place where people still say good morning and know their neighbours by first name. It is because of people all across our great province who believe that it is no longer a question of whether Saskatchewan is next year country or this year country, because we are now both.

The City of Saskatoon Once Again Receives AAA Credit Rating From Standard & Poor's Report



Standard & Poor's (S&P) once again reaffirmed the City of Saskatoon's AAA Credit Rating for 2009. The City of Saskatoon is one of only three Canadian cities—Brampton and Mississauga being the others—rated by S&P to receive a AAA rating for 2009.

Annually, S&P, an international bond-rating agency, reviews the City of Saskatoon's financial position and then releases a report that provides a credit rating for the City. According to S&P's 2009 report: "The ratings on Saskatoon reflect Standard & Poor's assessment of the City's generally strong operating performance, strong economy, and excellent cash and investment levels that exceed its debt."

Ambulance Dispatcher Honoured in Saskatoon

EMS Dispatcher Kim Wruck received an award on February 1st from Chief of Corman Park Police, Ron Boechler for her effort on a call that helped save a young ladies life.

In July of 2008, a 911 call came in from a young lady who was concerned about her friend. She let Kim know that she didn't know where her friend was, all she knew is that she was somewhere in the rural area, but was sure that her friend had overdosed on pills and was in serious trouble. The only communication had with the friend was by text and she was no longer answering. Kim tried to call her cell phone so we could try to triangulate the signal for a possible location but there was no answer. After trying everything possible an hour and a half had passed and as a last ditch effort Kim started going through all the rural maps that MD Ambulance has for surrounding area's looking for a last name that matched the patients. Kim finally located a name that matched and found a land location. Kim called Corman Park Police and was answered by Ron Boechler. Current Chief Boechler responded to this address and found a female patient unconscious and in life threatening danger. Paramedics were able to stabilize the patient and once admitted to Hospital Doctor's stated that if another hour had passed the patient would have died.

"Thanks to Kim's efforts and deciding not to give up on this young lady she is alive today", states MD Ambulance President and CEO Dave Dutchak "We are extremely proud of Kim and our Communications Team here at MD Ambulance". Kim has received an award for "the call of the year" from MD Ambulance Communications Department and Tuesday morning at 10:00am will receive a letter of accommodation from Corman Park Police.
