SASKATCHEWAN PARTNERS WITH RICK HANSEN INSTITUTE IN FUNDING FOR DISABILITY INITIATIVE



Mr. Rick Hansen joined us at the legislature on Tuesday, March 15th for an announcement of spinal cord injury research and disability funding. The Government of Saskatchewan in partnership with The Rick Hansen Foundation, along with Social Services Minister June Draude and Tourism, Parks, Culture and Sport Minister Hutchinson participated in this special announcement. Rick continues to be such an inspiration to us all and it is always a real honour and privilege to have the opportunity to visit with him.

Our government committed more than \$4.3 million for a comprehensive five year Saskatchewan based initiative, in partnership with the national Rick Hansen Institute. Social Services Minister June Draude, said, "Saskatchewan is extremely proud to be the second province in Canada to commit to a Rick Hansen Institute Initiative joining Mr. Hansen's home province of British Columbia. We strongly encourage the other provinces and territories in Canada, and the federal government, to make similar significant commitments on behalf of Canadians with spinal cord injuries and other people with disabilities and their organizations."

SASKATOON CHILD CARE SPACES RELOCATING

The Government of Saskatchewan is providing \$395,000 in funding to assist with renovation costs associated with relocating 58 child care spaces operated by the Parents' Child Development Cooperative (PCDC) from its long-time location in Bethel United Church to two schools in the Greater Saskatoon Catholic Schools division (GSCS). The move was made necessary by the impending sale of the Bethel United Church property, requiring PCDC to move out of the building by June 30, 2011. The 58 spaces will be relocated in two new, smaller early learning centres at St. Bernard and St. Phillip schools in Saskatoon. Support from staff, parents, elected officials and the community was tremendous, demonstrating the importance of keeping these spaces available for Saskatoon families. The new partnership with GSCS means that high-quality care and programs that nurture young children's confidence and creativity, with the added value of being part of the schools' communities.

All new schools in the division will be built with space for licensed day cares, including the new St. Mary Community School in Willowgrove.

cut for or sewer repairs and permanent patching isn't possible

As a homeowner:

- Remove snow from around your home's foundation and window wells
- Most lots drain along the outside edges. Remove snow from these areas
- Keep the snow in your yard because shoveling it on the streets or lanes could block drainage
- Clear snow and ice from around the bottom of our downspouts and extend downspouts at least two metres so water drains away from your foundation
- Where possible and safe, help clear snow, ice and debris from the catch basins in your area
- Check roof and eaves troughs for excessive snow
- Consider using sandbags to block water from entering low lying areas beside your foundation

To report potholes and settled pavement cuts call Public Works at 975-2476.

To report streets or areas with excessive ponding call Public Works Branch 975-2491.

City of Saskatoon crews continue to work seven days a week to clear snow and ice to aid in the drainage of the spring snowmelt. Keep up the great work!
