ANOTHER SIGN OF A GROWING PROVINCE: SASKATCHEWAN NEEDS A NEW AREA CODE!

SaskTel Minister Bill Boyd today announced that the Canadian Numbering Administrator (CAN) which assigns phone number blocks and area codes in the country has advised that Saskatchewan is running out of 306 phone number blocks and will need to add a new area code. This is a result of our growing population, an explosion of cellphone numbers and more competitive carriers operating in Saskatchewan. The CAN has indicated Saskatchewan's 306 area code is expected to exhaust its supply of telephone numbers by May 2013.

My colleague, Minister Boyd, explained this is one more sign of the tremendous growth our province is now enjoying. As prosperity brings more people and more companies to Saskatchewan, the province is committed to changing and keeping pace with our new realities.
