



From a Provincial Point of View July 15, 2011

SASKATCHEWAN TEACHERS' FEDERATION AND THE GOVERNMENT-TRUSTEE BARGAINING COMMITTEE UPDATE

Last week, the special mediator presented his report on the teachers' contract dispute to Labour Relations Minister Don Morgan. Both the Saskatchewan Teachers' Federation (STF) and the Government-Trustee Bargaining Committee (GTBC) have agreed that the recommendations within the report will form the basis of a tentative agreement. The recommendations include an average salary increase of 8.84 per cent over three years, which also includes a general increase of 5.5 per cent plus recommended market adjustments based on the average salary of other Western Canadian teachers.

NEW COMMITTEE PROVIDES ADDED REVIEW OF MEDICAL COVERAGE REQUESTS

The Saskatchewan government is putting patients first, by helping to ensure decisions on out-of-province and out-of-country medical coverage are consistent, fairly applied and transparent.

For those patients who request it, this independent committee provides a timely review of Ministry of Health decisions to ensure that government policy was followed.

Coverage for out-of-country treatment is only considered in exceptional circumstances and must have prior approval from the Ministry of Health. The Ministry provided \$4.3 million in funding for out-of-country treatment in 2009-10.

Under a reciprocal billing agreement, prior approval is not required for the vast majority of hospital and physician services received in other provinces. However, some services do require prior approval such as alcohol and drug, mental health, problem gambling, rehabilitation and home care services.

Three members will review each request for reconsideration of coverage; a chair with legal or administrative expertise, a physician or other health professional and a public representative. Several different members are appointed in each role to ensure availability and scheduling of timely reviews.

SASKATCHEWAN URBAN HOUSING STARTS REMAIN ELEVATED IN JUNE

Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation (CMHC) released preliminary results of its monthly survey of residential construction this week. Housing starts in the Saskatoon Census Metropolitan Area (CMA) totaled 370 units in June, up from 242 units in June 2010.

They reported that Saskatchewan is leading the country in housing construction; it means families in our province have more choice in looking for homes. Our housing starts are increasing faster than anywhere else in Canada, up 33% over last June.

We've seen builders are responding to demand in the rental market. Multiple unit starts are up 87% from a year ago. We have also seen a strong start in housing in the first half of the year, despite the poor weather we've experienced.
