TODAY IN SASKATCHEWAN:

- Surgical wait times have been reduced in the past few years. (18 month waits are down by 75%, 12 month waits are down by 55%).
- Over one third of K 12 schools in Saskatchewan have been upgraded or improved.
- Government debt has been reduced by \$3 billion or 44 percent since 2007.
- Small business tax has been lowered from 4.5 percent to 2 percent, saving small businesses an estimated \$80 million per year.

PREMIER WALL UNVEILS PLAQUE FOR UNIVERSITY OF SASKATCHEWAN HEALTH SCIENCE PROJECT

Premier Brad Wall and University of Saskatchewan (U of S) President Peter MacKinnon officially unveiled an engraved plaque today at the U of S to mark progress on the new Health Sciences D-wing expansion and to recognize the provincial government's contribution to the project.

The Government of Saskatchewan's commitment of more than \$300 million is the largest ever contribution to a capital project in U of S history and part of the overall commitment to post-secondary education over the past four years, including:

- A record \$2.8 billion invested in the post-secondary system;
- Increasing funding to Saskatchewan universities by 40%, including \$247 million in operating funding; surpassing the government's commitment of \$125 million;
- 3000% increase in funding for student housing to build 650 new beds for students; and,
- Introducing the Graduate Retention Program which, to date, issued approximately 49,000 certificates to recent post-secondary graduates in Saskatchewan, who are now able to get their tuition costs back if they remain in the province after they graduate.

The project involves the construction of two additions and extensive renovations to the existing Health Sciences Building. Various components will open as they are completed, with the final components expected to be complete in 2015-16. Today's unveiling was held in the still-under-construction D-wing entranceway.

Students, faculty, researchers and staff from a number of health sciences colleges will occupy the Health Sciences project where they will teach, learn and conduct research together in an integrated setting. The project will also provide expanded learning resources for health-care instructors, clinical supervisors and practitioners across the province.

RCMP POLICING IN SASKATCHEWAN SECURED FOR ANOTHER 20 YEARS

The Provincial Police Service Agreement secures RCMP policing service in Saskatchewan for the next 20 years.

The agreement continues the current cost-sharing model with the province of Saskatchewan paying 70 percent of the costs and the federal government covering the remainder. The terms of agreement also modernize the relationship between the parties. It provides a strong management partnership in terms of financial reporting and priority setting. In addition, under the terms of the agreement the aging RCMP infrastructure in the province will be renewed.

The agreement comes into effect April 1, 2012 and runs until March 31, 2032.

SENIORS RIDE FOR JUST \$10 IN SEPTEMBER

For the month of September, seniors 60 years and older will be able to ride anywhere along the Saskatchewan Transportation Company's (STC) network for only \$10 one-way.

STC reaches 290 communities. The extensive coverage STC provides gives Saskatchewan seniors province-wide access to this offer. STC ran a similar promotion in May 2011.

Since September 2009, more than 45,000 riders have taken part in STC's senior seat sale which has helped increase the company's ridership levels over recent years. As of July 31, STC's 2011 total ridership results show an increase of 12.2 per cent over 2010, an increase of 18,076 passengers.

SASKATCHEWAN AND HITACHI SIGN NUCLEAR R&D AGREEMENTS

My colleague, Innovation Minister Rob Norris joined with Mr. Hiroto Uozumi, President of Hitachi-GE Nuclear Energy, Ltd. and Mr. Taiji Yoshida General Manger of Hitachi, Ltd. to announce \$10 million in funding for two Memorandums of Understanding (MOUs) that will facilitate and support research collaborations in nuclear medicine, materials science, nuclear safety and small reactor design.

Innovation Saskatchewan will provide \$5 million over the next five years to support R&D activities pursuant to the MOUs in collaboration with Saskatchewan-based research institutions including the University of Saskatchewan, the University of Regina, the Saskatchewan Research Council and the Canadian Light Source Synchrotron. The Hitachi Group, including its alliance with General Electric will match Saskatchewan's contribution.

The new research partnership will leverage Hitachi's successful development and commercialization of proton beam therapy technologies and Saskatchewan's world class research facilities such as the Canadian Light Source Synchrotron to investigate the development of new nuclear medicines and nuclear imaging technologies.

Nuclear safety will be another major research priority as Hitachi and Innovation Saskatchewan consider research proposals pursuant to the MOUs.

Another area of interest to both Saskatchewan, Hitachi-GE, GEH and GNF-A is research into the reclamation of unused uranium fuel rods.

Under the MOUs, Innovation Saskatchewan will also work with Hitachi-GE, GEH and GNF-A on research into the design and feasibility of small reactor technologies although any decision on whether to pursue nuclear power in Saskatchewan is still many years away.

Today's \$10 million investment in nuclear R&D builds on announcements by the Governments of Canada and Saskatchewan this year to invest \$30 million for the establishment of a new centre for research in nuclear medicine and materials science, \$17 million for the establishment of a Centre for Innovation in Cyclotron Science, \$12 million to support innovative research in the production of life saving medical isotopes and \$10.1 million for the development of Saskatchewan's first PET/CT facility for diagnosis and treatment of cancer and heart disease at the University of Saskatchewan.

RETAIL SALES UP FOR THE SIXTH STRAIGHT MONTH

Saskatchewan retailers continue to set the bar nationally with the highest increases in the country, according to a report released by Statistics Canada today. Retail sales were up by 9.5 per cent between June 2010 and June 2011, the highest increase among the provinces on a seasonally adjusted basis, more than double the national increase of 4.6 per cent.

On a monthly basis, retail sales jumped 2.4 per cent between May 2011 and June 2011, well above the 0.7 per cent recorded for Canada. This was the sixth consecutive month that sales were up on a month to month basis.

Saskatchewan welcomed the Portraits of Honour National Tour mural in August. The painted mural is 10 feet tall by 50 feet wide and features 157 Canadian troops, including ten from Saskatchewan, who lost their lives in the Afghanistan war.

The national, 171-day mural tour has spent most of August in Saskatchewan visiting various communities. The Portraits of Honour National Tour is presented by Kin Canada. The Government of Saskatchewan provided \$9,000 to help present the mural throughout Saskatchewan.

The Portraits of Honour mural travelled to Saskatoon, Regina, Spiritwood, Prince Albert, Yorkton and Raymore and will continue on to Moose Jaw, Swift Current and Lloydminster. The mural will continue its cross-Canada journey where it will visit the hometowns of our fallen heroes.
