SASKATCHEWAN HAS THE ONLY BALANCED BUDGET IN CANADA THIS YEAR

With the release of Newfoundland and Labrador's 2012-13 deficit budget, Saskatchewan has become the



only province in Canada this year to announce a balanced budget. Manitoba, Prince Edward Island, British Columbia, Alberta, Ontario, Quebec, New Brunswick, Nova Scotia and the Canadian government had all previously announced deficit budgets for the current fiscal year.

"Most Canadians are living in provinces where the government is spending beyond its means, creating economic uncertainty and putting at risk a secure future for its citizens. Our government, meanwhile, continues to control spending while investing in sustainable programs and services important to Saskatchewan people," said

Saskatchewan Party MLA Nancy Heppner. "We continue to see the results of our decision to live within our means – over the last week, we learned that retail sales and wholesale trade are at new record highs and our unemployment rate is the second lowest in the country. Wait times for surgery continue to go down – over the past year, the number of people waiting more than 12 months has declined by 80 per cent."

The 2012-13 Saskatchewan budget is balanced on both a general revenue and summary financial basis while limiting overall government spending increases to under 5 per cent. Our budget provides sustainable spending that will support growth such as \$581.5 million for highways, \$237.4 million in Municipal Revenue Sharing, and the new Saskatchewan First-Time Homebuyers' tax credit of up to \$1,100 against Saskatchewan income tax payable. We also have provided funding to support important services such as \$4 million to expand the colorectal cancer screening program province-wide, \$113 million to increase benefits and the number of clients served under the Saskatchewan Assured Income for Disability program, and further increases to the Seniors Income Plan.

"The theme of the 2012-13 Saskatchewan budget is Keeping the Saskatchewan Advantage. That advantage was created by the hard work of Saskatchewan people over the last few years," said Heppner. "Our government will continue to take action that keeps that advantage and ensures our province remains the best place in Canada to live, work and raise a family."

FUNDING FOR SURGICAL CARE FLOWS TO HEALTH REGIONS

\$60.5 Million Invested in Enhanced Surgical Care.

Saskatchewan patients will receive surgery sooner and benefit from innovations that improve surgical care, thanks to a \$60.5 million investment in the Saskatchewan Surgical Initiative.

Regional health authorities (RHAs) are receiving funding that will allow them to collectively complete an additional 4,380 surgeries in 2012-13. About 70 per cent of the additional surgeries will be provided in Regina and Saskatoon. Regina Qu'Appelle Health Region will provide about 1,600 more surgeries than last year and Saskatoon Health Region about 1,560 more. The other health regions combined will do an additional 1,200 procedures. Saskatchewan will provide approximately 86,000 surgeries in 2012-13.

"The Saskatchewan Surgical Initiative has made impressive progress in a relatively short time, and we will continue to support our health system partners as they work to achieve these bold goals," Health Minister Don McMorris said. "This major investment will give patients better access to the high quality, efficient surgical care they deserve."

SASKATCHEWAN COMMEMORATES DAY OF MOURNING

April 28 is the National Day of Mourning, a day to commemorate individuals who lost their lives due to work related injuries or illnesses and to remember those who have been injured on the job. This year, 37 Saskatchewan workers lost their lives as a result of work related injuries and illnesses, and more than 39,000 workers reported workplace injuries.

"Today in the legislature we honour the sons, daughters, mothers, fathers, brothers, sisters and spouses who lost their lives as a result of their employment," Labour Relations and Workplace Safety Minister Don Morgan said. "I ask that everyone renew their commitment to health and safety, so together we can prevent these tragedies."

SASKATCHEWAN LEGISLATIVE INTERNS

VICTIMS OF CRIME AWARENESS WEEK

The Government of Saskatchewan has declared the week of April 22-28, 2012, as Victims of Crime Awareness Week in Saskatchewan, to accompany National Victims of Crime Awareness Week. This year's theme is "Moving Forward".

To coincide with this week, the government announced enhancements to Victim/Witness Services by adding new programs in Meadow Lake and North Battleford. This adds to the existing programs currently located in La Ronge, Prince Albert, Saskatoon and Regina, which deliver services throughout the province.

"We're pleased to mark this important week in Saskatchewan, especially when our Victims Services

Program is having such a significant year," Justice Minister and Attorney General Don Morgan said. "The enhancement of Victim/Witness Services, coupled with the province-wide expansion of police-based victim services announced in March, ensures all victims of crime will have access to necessary supports in our province."

2012-13 CONSTRUCTION SEASON GETS ROLLING

Workers and equipment will be moving dirt and laying pavement as the 2012 highway construction season gets underway in Saskatchewan.

More than 1,200 kilometres (km) of major improvements and planned maintenance work is targeted to be complete in 2012, made possible by a budget of \$581.5 million, the second largest Highways and Infrastructure budget in the province's history.

"We've put more than \$2.2 billion into our highway system over the past four years," Highways and Infrastructure Minister Jim Reiter said. "We're going to build on that by continuing to invest another \$2.2 billion over the next four years. We are committed to improving the highways for Saskatchewan people." Major improvements, including new capital work which is primarily completed by contractors, span more than 533 km, while planned maintenance work, performed primarily by ministry crews, totals 675 km worth of work.

"This significant investment in our highways will help to tackle the challenges that have come from years of neglect, and at the same time ensure new infrastructure is in place to accommodate our growing agriculture and resource sectors," Saskatchewan Heavy Construction Association President Shantel Lipp said. "We look forward to working with the Ministry of Highways and Infrastructure to continue to make our roads safer."

GOVERNMENT EXPANDS FOCUS ON EFFICIENCY TO SUPPORT A SUSTAINABLE EDUCATION SYSTEM

The Government of Saskatchewan is committed to a quality education system. In order to ensure the future sustainability of education programming, school divisions are being asked to look for savings through efficiencies that do not affect front-line services.

The Ministry of Education and its education partners are undertaking an efficiency initiative to better align resources to support teachers and students in the classroom. To this end, the ministry is conducting a third-party review to help understand where efficiencies can be realized, as well as how school divisions can achieve increased efficiencies in their operations.

"Improving student outcomes is the focus of the education system and we need to take a critical look at existing expenditures and determine whether they ultimately benefit students in Saskatchewan," Education Minister Donna Harpauer said. "We need to ensure we have the proper supports in place in order for students to achieve."

FEBRUARY RETAIL SALES HIT RECORD NUMBERS

Saskatchewan's retail sales took a jump in February with a 6.2 per cent increase in February 2012 over February 2011 totalling \$1.38 billion, the highest ever for the month. Saskatchewan had the third highest percentage increase in Canada over this period.

"Families have a high degree of confidence in their personal finances and that is resulting in an increase in retail sales," Enterprise Minister Jeremy Harrison said.
