CENTENNIAL COLLEGIATE STUDENT HEADED TO OTTAWA FOR NATIONAL BIOTECHNOLOGY COMPETITION

Congratulations to Saruul Uuganbayar, a student from Centennial Collegiate, who is one of the eight young Canadian scientists competing at a national biotechnology competition in Ottawa beginning April 15.

Saruul has had a lifelong dream of being able to find a cure for cancer. In order to achieve this dream she has been working alongside her mentor, Troy Harkness, at the University of Saskatchewan for the past year. Through her hard work, she has invented a type of molecular therapy for mutated cells. The invention led to the top spot at the provincial "Sanofi BioGENius Challenge Canada" allowing her to compete at the national level.

Saruul's research has narrowed on cell proteins and their effect of certain molecules on cell growth, which could help develop a cancer drug.

After graduating from Centennial Collegiate, Saruul plans on studying biotechnology before applying to medical school.

NEW PENSION OPTION UNVEILED FOR SASKATCHEWAN WORKERS

On April 8, the Government of Saskatchewan introduced legislation to create an important new option to help provincial residents save for retirement.

The Pooled Registered Pension Plans Act will ensure all Saskatchewan workers are eligible to enroll in low-cost, tax-assisted pension plans, providing an alternative for those workers who currently do not have access to group pension plans. Amendments are also being introduced today to The Saskatchewan Pension Plan Act which will permit the trustees of the Saskatchewan Pension Plan (SPP) to apply to be a licensed Pooled Registered Pension Plan (PRPP) provider.

"Our government is pleased to provide Saskatchewan residents with additional opportunities to save for retirement," Justice Minister and Attorney General Gordon Wyant said. "These legislative changes will provide new and affordable pension options to employees of participating employers and the self-employed."

WATER SECURITY AGENCY RELEASES APRIL FORECAST



On April 8, as Minister responsible for Saskatchewan Water Security Agency (WSA) I released the April forecast and update on the spring runoff. The month of March saw greater than normal amounts of precipitation in certain areas.

As a result, an above normal runoff is expected for a majority of the province, while the areas that have the potential for very high runoff and flooding have increased. These areas include Moose Jaw to Indian Head then south to Weyburn, and from Saskatoon to North Battleford extending north to Waskesiu Lake.

"With the additional snowfall in March, areas in the Souris River and Qu'Appelle River basins have been the most affected. To help prepare for the runoff, the Water Security Agency has been increasing the outflow of water from Rafferty and Alameda reservoirs as well as holding several meetings with municipalities to address their concerns and inform them of programs available." <u>Water Security Agency Releases April Forecast</u>

"I want to commend the Canadian Red Cross for raising the profile of this important issue, and thank them for the work they do in inspiring a new generation of citizens to take a stand against bullying."

MORE HOUSING FOR SASKATCHEWAN FAMILIES

Through increased funding this year from the Government of Saskatchewan, approximately 89 Habitat for Humanity partner families will secure a better quality of life by realizing their dream of owning a safe, stable home.

The province is providing an additional \$2 million this year to help build 40 new Habitat for Humanity homes throughout Saskatchewan. With this funding, the government has committed a total of \$6.5 million to Habitat for Humanity since March of 2009. This year's funding is double the amount provided last year and leads the nation in percentage of increase. Over the past four years, government funding has helped Habitat for Humanity start 73 new homes in eight different Saskatchewan communities – a substantial increase compared to the 41 units built over the 12 year period between 1996 and 2008.

MORE FUNDING FOR PHYSICIAN TRAINING SEATS

Saskatchewan is increasing its investment in training physicians, as part of its broader effort to improve residents' access to physician services.

The province is investing \$17.8 million in post-graduate physician training seats at the University of Saskatchewan's College of Medicine in 2013-14 – an increase of \$2 million over last year.

"We know how important it is to improve access to physician services in communities across Saskatchewan," Health Minister Dustin Duncan said. "This funding will help maximize training opportunities for physician graduates here at home. We believe it will increase the chances that they will stay in the province after completing their training."

SaskWater tabled its 2012 Annual Report – Celebrating 10 Years – in the Saskatchewan Legislature April 10. SaskWater traces its history back to 1966 but has operated exclusively as a commercial Crown corporation since 2002, creating value that supports growth through reinvestment in its infrastructure. Over the past ten years, SaskWater has grown significantly, more than doubling its asset base, annual revenues and the number of residents served.

SaskWater now provides professional water and wastewater services to 63 communities and more than 62,000 people in Saskatchewan.

As Minister Responsible for SaskWater, I was pleased to comment on the tabling of the 2012 Annual Report, "Throughout its 46 year history, the corporation has supported economic growth and the people of Saskatchewan. SaskWater's commitment to providing safe and reliable water services to residents, municipalities and industries has resulted in another successful year. I am very pleased to note, in a 2012 customer satisfaction survey that 92 per cent of its customers would recommend SaskWater."
