EMPLOYMENT REACHES ANOTHER RECORD HIGH

There were more people working in Saskatchewan in the month of July than ever before, according to the latest Labour Force Survey released by Statistics Canada today.

A total of 542,600 people were employed in July, an increase of 10,000 jobs compared to last July, setting a new all-time high for the month. This is on trend with the province's year over year employment numbers, which have reached record monthly highs for eight consecutive months.

"These numbers are positive news for the province and an indicator of steady economic growth," Advanced Education Minister Don Morgan said on behalf of Economy Minister Bill Boyd. "We continue to see signs of why our province is the ideal place to live, work and invest, including our record-setting population growth, business confidence and an abundance of well-paying jobs for our workers." SASKATCHEWAN EXPORT SALES CONTINUE CLIMB

Saskatchewan export sales continue to rise according to a new report from Statistics Canada. Saskatchewan posted a 3.6 per cent increase in June compared to numbers of June 2011. January to June export totals show that Saskatchewan sold \$16 billion worth of exports - a 16.2 per cent increase over 2011, placing the province second in increases nationally, and more than doubling the national average in the first half of the year.

"We are seeing the resurgence of some of our export industries such as forestry products, which have experienced challenges in the last few years," Economy Minister Bill Boyd said. "The overall exports picture shows that Saskatchewan products continue to be competitive, of high quality and in high demand."

- Saskatchewan will have a balanced budget this year a pre-transfer surplus in the General Revenue Fund of \$95 million dollars.
- Budget 2012-13 provides a \$2.5 million increase to reduce costs for those with diabetes by adding two forms of long-acting insulin to the Drug Plan and expanding the Children's Insulin Pump Program from age 17 up to 25 years old.
- Budget 2012-13 provides \$5.5 million increase for the Shock Trauma Air Rescue Society (STARS) Helicopter Ambulance.
- There is \$38.6 million in Budget 2012-13 to begin construction of six new school projects in a new shared ownership model.
