QUINN STEVENSON WILL BE REMEMBERED ALWAYS



It is with profound sadness that I reflect on a life that ended tragically last week. Quinn Stevenson, son of Bonny & Craig Stevenson and brother to Shea was on his way to his early morning job when his life tragically ended. As a parent, there are no words to express the pain and sorrow I feel for Quinn's family.

Quinn Stevenson was only 17 years old. In those 17 years, he was a role model to many. I was always amazed by Quinn's enthusiasm, work ethic, talent and his keen interest in everything he did. His leadership qualities were admired. What an incredible young man. Many of you will remember seeing Quinn at Picnic in the Park. He was always so willing to lend a hand with set up and clean up. He was so interested in learning about political processes and was wise beyond his years. His parents instilled in him a desire to volunteer and I am so thankful for Quinn's assistance in many Saskatoon Silver Springs events, making his community a better place. I, along with so many, will remember Quinn's handsome smile, his kindness, his respect for his family and friends, his great sportsmanship displayed in many sports and his willingness to help out. Quinn will always be remembered. I was blessed to know him.

My family, Trish, Carter and Paige, express our heartfelt sympathy to Bonny, Craig, Shea, Quinn's grandparents, family and friends. Quinn leaves a lasting legacy to all that knew him.

Quinn's obituary below speaks more about this amazing young man.

Our lives have been changed forever: Quinn was taken from us suddenly, and his family and friends are left looking for answers. Craig, Bonny, Shea, and dog Kai will have to find a way to go on without Quinn, but keep him in our hearts forever. Saddened beyond words are Grandparents Leo and Agnes Frerichs, Bruce and Nadia Stevenson, Aunts, Uncles, and Cousins, Karen and Kevin Dow sons Josh and Colton, Brad and Leann Frerichs sons Colby, Carter and Brody.

Quinn was a son who was always making us proud or trying to convince us why we should be proud of him. Since the accident, we have received so many notes regarding Quinn. Quinn was a leader, true friend, happy, joker, sportsman, driven, stand-up guy, the list goes on. These notes that speak to his character will be cherished in our hearts forever. Quinn had many great experiences and people he got to know as a younger boy growing up, but his final years in high school were his most memorable. On June 25th, Quinn graduated from Centennial Collegiate, a school he was incredibly proud of. He wore the Charger colours with a lot of pride. In his senior year, he was elected as Senior Watch with the SRC. He participated in many sports at school, which included football, curling, and badminton. In his senior year, Quinn had the opportunity to participate in the History Study Tour Program. He saw a lot of Eastern Europe, he fortified many deep friendships and had great stories to share with us when he got home.

Quinn was also a hockey player with the Saskatoon Redwings and ASHL Bruins, and Baseball player with the Saskatoon Blue Jays (Slow Trains for Life) who just won the Midget AA City Championship with Quinn at the mound. Quinn could also be found on many of the golf courses; like other sports, he had a great passion for golf. During the summer months Quinn was employed by Saskatoon Golf and Country Club, a job he loved going to. During the winter months, he could also be found at the hockey rink wearing the stripes, he was a highly regarded Referee. Quinn also curled a lot; his high school team in Grade 11 captured a city championship for Centennial. Since Grade 8, Quinn's wanted to become a broadcaster (TSN Sportscaster) and he was about to make his dream come true this fall. Along with broadcasting he wanted to take his Referee Career to a much higher level. There is no doubt that he would have accomplished all of these, because if Quinn wanted it, he went out and got it.

Quinn had a huge group of friends, who are all finding ways to deal with this terrible loss. Our basement, garage, and backyard were often filled with laughter, the loudest always being Quinn. His friends were held close to his heart and he would have done anything for them; he was a true friend. We are going to celebrate his joyful life, not mourn his passing.

The funeral service will take place Friday, August 9, in the Centennial Collegiate Gym, a place that Quinn really loved. The family is asking everyone to wear their favourite team jersey and if you shared a team with Quinn, wear that jersey. If you don't have a jersey to wear, they are asking that you wear green as a Rider fan.

CIRCLE DRIVE SOUTH PROJECT TO OFFICIALLY OPEN TO TRAFFIC



I was excited to join officials from the federal, provincial, and municipal governments who led a Bridge Parade across the new Circle Drive South Bridge to ceremonially open Saskatoon's largest infrastructure project on July 31. The roadway officially opened that evening, and includes the bridge and 10 kilometres of new roadways as part of the Circle Drive South Project.

Participating in the ceremony were Canada's Minister of International Trade and Minister for the Asia-Pacific Gateway Ed Fast, Minister of State (Foreign Affairs and Consular) Lynne Yelich, Saskatchewan's Minister of Highways and Infrastructure Don McMorris and Saskatoon Mayor Donald Atchison.

"The Circle Drive South Bridge project is symbolic of this province's enthusiastic embrace of economic growth," McMorris said. "The provincial government's \$98 million investment will ensure that moving forward Saskatoon's shippers and motorists will have the advantage of one of the safest and most efficient roadways our province has to offer." SASKATCHEWAN'S HUNTING, ANGLING, AND TRAPPING LICENSING SYSTEM IS FULLY OPERATIONAL

Saskatchewan's new online automated Hunting, Trapping and Angling Licence (HAL) system is now fully operational. As of August 6, all game bird, big game and big game draw licences are available for purchase.

As Minister of Environment, I commented, "Over the last several years, the ministry has consulted with many hunters, anglers, trappers and issuers, and has heard that the current system needs to be updated. The fact that hunters and anglers have purchased over 170,000 licences, demonstrates that HAL is meeting the needs of the public." There are three options to purchase licences through this system:

- online through your personal computer any time;
- through private issuers, Ministry of Environment and select provincial park offices; or

"Walter Scott was our first premier and father of confederation," Wall said. "But I do not believe he has received the recognition he so richly deserves for his vision for Saskatchewan and for his great personal sacrifice and effort to build the foundation for this great province."



MINISTER APPOINTS DR. DENNIS KENDEL TO BEGIN CONSULTATIONS ON TEACHER CERTIFICATION AND MISCONDUCT

Education Minister Russ Marchuk has appointed Dr. Dennis Kendel to conduct consultations and provide recommendations to address concerns around teacher certification and disciplinary authority in cases of alleged professional misconduct and incompetence.

Marchuk said he has concerns with the current process that need to be addressed and Dr. Kendel's expertise as a regulator will be valuable to this process.

"Our goal is to have a process that ensures the safety of our students, protects the integrity of the teaching profession and helps to maintain public trust in the disciplinary process," Marchuk said. "This will require consultation with the Saskatchewan Teachers' Federation and sector leaders. Dr. Kendel has the expertise we need to conduct this type of research and analysis. I look forward to receiving his recommendations."
