PHOTO RADAR HAS ARRIVED IN SASKATCHEWAN WORK ZONES

It's one photo you don't want to be in, and the Government of Saskatchewan doesn't want to see you in.

On July 15, photo radar was placed and become operational operational in random highway work zones throughout the province, taking photos of vehicle license plates of drivers observed exceeding the speed limit of 60 km/hr.

"Our only goal here is to motivate drivers to obey the law, which will ultimately make the work zone safer and potentially save the life of a worker or motorist," Prince Albert-Carlton MLA and Chair of the Provincial Traffic Safety Committee Darryl Hickie said on behalf of Minister responsible for Highways and Infrastructure Don McMorris. "If we don't collect one dime of revenue from photo enforcement, that's a good thing - it means people are doing what they're supposed to."

SURGICAL WAIT TIMES CONTINUE TO FALL

The latest provincial wait time numbers show continued progress toward Saskatchewan's goal of offering all surgical patients a procedure within three months.

"There are now about 9,100 fewer patients waiting more than three months for surgery, than when we began the Saskatchewan Surgical Initiative in April 2010," Health Minister Dustin Duncan said. "People in this province are spending less time waiting for surgery and more time getting on with their lives."

MANUFACTURING SALES CONTINUE TO LEAD THE NATION

Saskatchewan's economy had manufacturing sales breaking records in May, landing the province in top spot for year-over-year growth for a second straight month. In a Statistics Canada report released today, Saskatchewan's shipments totalled \$1.29 billion, an increase of 16.7 per cent (seasonally adjusted) over May 2012.

"Our province's manufacturers are leaders in the global marketplace because they have built a reputation for producing quality goods that continue to be in high demand around the world," Minister for the Economy Bill Boyd said. "This is the second straight month that our province's manufacturing sales have broken records, which is a direct reflection of the strength and ingenuity of these companies."

HERITAGE RIVER DESIGNATION DRAFT LEGACY DOCUMENT

On July 11, the draft Legacy Document was announced to designate the South Saskatchewan and Saskatchewan Rivers a Canadian Heritage River.

A Canadian Heritage River is a national designation that services as a catalyst for governments, communities, and local people to take action to protect their river and ensure it remains an important part of their community and their lives. It will not impact on First Nations or Metis rights nor affect current land ownership.

The draft Legacy Document had been prepared through consultations with First Nations, Metis, parks, recreation, heritage and tourism agencies and is a culmination of research and the first phase of public consultation including a "River Gathering" on May 1 at Wanuskewin Heritage park. The Document is the second phase of public consultation where the public and organizations are asked to comment on the recommendations in the draft Legacy Document. The document will be submitted to the Canadian Heritage River Board in June of 2014. Feel free to provide input any time prior to November 1, 2013.

SOLUTION TO FLOODING OF HIGHWAY 2 ANNOUNCED JULY 17

On July 17, as Minister Responsible for the Water Security Agency, I, along with the Reeve of the Rural Municipality (RM) of Buckland Don Fyrk, announced the RM is constructing a channel that will drain water flooding Highway 2 into the Little Red River. The Water Security Agency completed a survey of the area last Friday and proposed this solution for the RM's consideration. Now that we are proceeding with the work, we expect it will be about 10 days for the water to drain off the highway.
