
Check out what has been going on in Saskatoon Silver Springs and Saskatchewan!

incorporating detailed population forecasting to ensure the facility will meet the needs of a growing city and province.



FAMILIES LIVING IN SASKATCHEWAN BENEFIT FROM LOWER TAXES

Provincial tax savings since 2007

Provincial Income Tax Reductions Since 2007 for Family of Four at \$50,000



Income tax reductions by the Government of Saskatchewan since 2007 have resulted in significant savings for families and individuals.

For example, a family of four with \$50,000 in annual income will pay just \$207 in provincial income tax in 2013, compared to \$2,302 in 2007, representing tax savings of \$2,095 annually.

"These significant cuts to provincial income tax are making a huge difference in terms of disposable income and quality of life for Saskatchewan people," Finance Minister Ken Krawetz said. "Saskatchewan is now extremely competitive compared to other provinces in Canada in terms of taxation, and as part of our Plan for Growth we intend to keep it that way." Government's investment in the Shock Trauma Air Rescue Society (STARS) helicopter ambulance service continues to benefit patients requiring emergency services, especially those in rural Saskatchewan.

The Government has invested \$10.5 million in 2013-14 in STARS, which marked its one-year anniversary of Saskatchewan operations this week.

"We are committed to providing timely access to emergency medical services for all residents of Saskatchewan," Health Minister Dustin Duncan said. "Recently, I personally witnessed a crew at the Regina base swing into immediate action to get airborne and respond to an urgent call. I was very impressed by their professionalism and the speed in which they responded to this emergency."
